ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION FLEXIBLE WORK REQUIREMENT PLAN

JANUARY 2021

Section 1

Policy Statement: The Illinois Department of Transportation will, when possible, accommodate employees' requests for flex-time schedules provided the requests are reasonable and in the best interest of both employee and department.

Employees may work a flexible schedule (a fixed shift other than the official schedule approved for the office) if it is consistent with the requirements of the office.

Section 3

The Illinois Department of Transportation utilizes permanent part-time employees, four-day and nine-day work week schedules. In addition, flexible work schedules are available to accommodate personal needs with the earliest starting time beginning 6:30 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and the latest starting 10:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m.

Section 4

The Illinois Department of Transportation will continue using flex-time schedules and part-time employment as reasonably requested. Additional four- and nine-day work week schedules may be approved on an individual basis if the need exists and does not disrupt normal department functions.
