Illinois Regulation is designed to inform and involve the public in changes taking place in agency administration.

# New Regulations

# **Proposed Regulations**

#### STATE EMPLOYEES

The DEPARTMENT OF CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES adopted peremptory amendments to "Pay Plan" (80 III Adm Code 310; 37 III Reg 17164) effective 10/19/13, implementing memoranda of understanding (MOUs) with Teamster Locals 700 (Cook County), 330 (Fox Valley) and 25 (Downstate). All 3 MOUs stipulate that bargaining unit employees who were on worker's compensation-related leaves of absence on 7/1/13 and did not receive a one-time stipend paid to bargaining unit members employed as of that date will receive the stipend upon their return to work.

#### **CHILD CARE**

The DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SER-VICES proposed amendments to "Child Care" (89 III Adm Code 50; 37 III Reg 17140) that implement recommendations from the Child Care Advisory Council and the federal DHHS' Administration for Children and Families' Office of Child Care. DHS is requiring all individuals with access to children in child care to undergo the required background checks and is defining base wages and salary. The rulemaking clarifies services that will be provided for eligible teenage parents and revises the criteria that parents are responsible for reporting to DHS. The rulemaking also revises the list of eligible individuals to whom it will provide child care services, resources permitting, and requiring child care staff to use the Department computerized case information systems to report an applicant's participation in a DHS-approved program. The rulemaking clarifies teen parent eligibility requirements and accreditation requirements for social service agencies providing English as a Second Language and

other adult education courses/programs. DHS is removing the stipulation prohibiting child care services for web based classes that an individual may take at any time and is granting an additional day of care for study time only if approved in advance. Child care will be terminated immediately if DHS determines that the child is no longer enrolled with the approved provider. The rulemaking updates lists of income eligibility criteria, including non-exempt (included) and exempt income. DHS will continue to provide payments to maintain child care services in instances when services would be terminated, changing the time period in which the applicants must report the loss of employment/ income from 10 to 30 days after the date of loss or break. Child care services can be extended for up to three 30-day periods in any 12 month period. The rulemaking also updates circumstances under which an applicant is exempt from paying a share of child care costs. Child care providers will be affected.

NEW REGULATIONS: Rules adopted by agencies this week.

PROPOSED REGULATIONS: Rules proposed by agencies this week, commencing a 45-day First Notice period. Public comments must be accepted by the agency for the period of time indicated.

\*: Symbol designating rules of special interest to small businesses, small municipalities, and not-for-profit corporations. Agencies are required to consider comments from these groups and minimize the regulatory burden on them.

#### **TELECOMMUNICATIONS**

The ILLINOIS COMMERCE COMMIS-SION has proposed amendments to 3 Parts affecting telecommunications carriers: "Annual Reports" (83 III Adm Code 210; 37 III Reg 17127); "Reports of Accidents by Telecommunications Carriers and by Fixed Public Utilities Other Than Pipelines Transporting Liquids" (83 III Adm Code 220; 37 III Reg 17130); and "Uniform System of Accounts for Telecommunications Carriers" (83 III Adm Code 710; 37 III Reg 17134). Amendments to Parts 210 and 710 implement provisions of Public Act 98-45, requiring electing providers and those providers offering solely competitive telecommunications services to file annual reports with ICC only to the extent required by ICC and allowing the provider to use the most recent version of Generally Accepted Accounting Practices or other systems it uses for financial reporting purposes. Further amendments to Part 710

update incorporations by reference to 47 CFR 32 (federal uniform system of accounts for telecommunications providers) although that regulation remains unchanged since adopted in 2005. Amendments to Part 220 remove redundant requirements for telecommunications carriers subject to public utilities requlation under Section 13-101 of the Public Utilities Act [220 ILCS 5/13-101]. Due to recent changes in the telecommunications market, the Part now applies only to a minority of telecommunications services and continued application is no longer in the public interest and the costs outweigh the benefits. Providers will continue to be required to report accidents involving loss of life or limb occurring to or on a carrier's plant, equipment or other property and ICC retains authority to investigate any accident resulting in loss of life or injury to persons or property occurring on telecommunications property.
