DRIVER'S LICENSES

The SECRETARY OF STATE adopted amendments Issuance of Licenses (92 IAC 1030; 41 III Reg 10906), effective 1/3/18, instituting a new mental disability restriction (J91) that can be added to driver's licenses or identification cards at the applicant's request to indicate (in the event of a traffic stop or other contact with law enforcement, first responders, etc.) that the holder has a mental disability. Since 1st Notice, SOS removed the proposed definition of "mental disability" for purposes of obtaining the restriction, since the Part already contains a broader definition of "mental disorder".

VETERANS' HOMES

The ILLINOIS DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH adopted an amendment to Illinois Veterans' Homes Code (77 IAC 340; 41 Ill Reg 3787), effective 1/5/18, removing a requirement that license application and renewal forms include the social security numbers of all persons with a direct or indirect financial interest in the facility.

The POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD adopted amendments to Primary Drinking Water Standards (35 IAC 611; 41 III Reg INSURANCE

The DEPARTMENT OF **INSURANCE** proposed amendments to The Minimum Mortality Standard for Valuation of Annuity and Pure Endowment Contracts (50 IAC 935; 42 III Reg 1061), Accelerated Life Benefit/ Illness/Qualified Terminal Conditions (50 IAC 1407; 42 III Reg 1066), Valuation of Life Insurance Policies Including the Use of Select Mortality Factors (50 IAC 1409; 42 III Reg 1070), Modified Guaranteed Annuity (MGA) Contracts (50 IAC 1410; 42 III Reg 1079), Universal Life Insurance (50 IAC 1411; 42 III Reg 1086), Recognition of the 2001 CSO Mortality Table for Use in **Determining Minimum Reserve** Liabilities and Nonforfeiture Benefits (50 IAC 1412; 42 III Reg 1093), Recognition of 2001 CSO Preferred Class Structure

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NEW RULES: Rules adopted by agencies this week. EMERGENCY RULES: Adopted for a temporary period not to exceed 150 days.

PROPOSED RULES: Rules proposed by agencies this week, commencing a 45-day First Notice period during which public comments must be accepted. **PEREMPTORY RULES:** Rules adopted without prior public notice or JCAR review as authorized by 5 ILCS 100/5-50.

■ Designates rules of special interest to small businesses, small municipalities, and not-for-profit corporations. Agencies are required to consider comments from these groups and minimize the regulatory burden on them.

The DEPARTMENT OF MILITARY AFFAIRS repealed the Part titled Freedom of Information Procedures (2 IAC 1376; 42 III Reg 1108) and adopted a new Part titled Access to Records of the Department of Military Affairs (2 IAC 1376; 42 III Reg 1110), both effective 1/4/18. The new

Part implements updated Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) provisions, including the procedures and timeline for responding to requests for information, the types of records that must be disclosed and that are exempt from disclosure, the procedure for appealing a denied request, and fees for obtaining copies of documents.

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Mortality Tables for Use in Determining Minimum Reserve Liabilities (50 IAC 1413; 42 III Reg and Preneed Life 1101). Insurance Minimum Standards Determining Reserve Liabilities and Nonforfeiture Values (50 IAC 1414; 42 III Reg 1104), all of which implement statute establishing the National Association of Insurance Commissioners (NAIC) Valuation Manual as the source for actuarial valuation standards for insurance contracts issued on or after 1/1/ 17. These rulemakings amend the applicable Parts to apply only to contracts not covered by the NAIC manual effective 1/1/17.

The ILLINOIS ENVIRONMENTAL **PROTECTION AGENCY** proposed repeal of the Parts titled NOx Trading Program Procedures (35 IAC 273; 42 III Reg 1041) and Clean Air Set-Aside (35 IAC 274; 42 III Reg 1051), in response to Executive 2016-13 Order (Illinois Competitiveness Council). These rulemakings repeal obsolete IEPA programs that have sunset (NOx Trading Program) or have been replaced (Clean Air Set-Aside).
