Illinois Regulation, also titled The Flinn Report in memory of founding JCAR member Rep. Monroe Flinn, is designed to inform and involve the public in changes taking place in agency administration.

New Rules

■ CDL INSTRUCTORS

The SECRETARY OF STATE adopted an amendment to Commercial Driver Training Schools (92 IAC 1060; 42 Ill Reg 20315), effective 3/8/19, removing the requirement that an applicant for the position of instructor at a commercial driver training school pass a vision screening and road test. Because driving school instructors are already required to hold a valid driver's license (for which a road exam is required for initial licensure and a vision screening would normally be required at renewal) and must also have a clean driving record, SOS determined that this requirement was unnecessary. Commercial driving schools will be affected.

■ Designates rules of special interest to small businesses, small municipalities, and not-for-profit corporations. Agencies are required to consider comments from these groups and minimize the regulatory burden on them.
