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The Flinn Report is a weekly summary of regulatory actions of State agencies published in the *Illinois Register* and action taken by the Illinois General Assembly's Joint Committee on Administrative Rules (JCAR). The Flinn Report honors founding JCAR member Representative Monroe Flinn, and is designed to inform and involve the public in changes taking place in agency administration.

Proposed Rulemakings

PAID LEAVE POLICIES

DEPARTMENT OF **LABOR** The proposed a new Part titled Paid Leave for All Workers Act (56 IAC 200; 47 III Reg 15559) implementing Public Act 102-1143, which established the Paid Leave for All Workers Act [820 ILCS 192]. The Act and the new Part will require all public and private employers in Illinois (except school districts and park districts), effective 1/1/24, to grant their employees a minimum of 1 hour of paid leave at their regular rate of pay for every 40 hours worked, up to a minimum of 40 hours paid leave per 12-month period. The employer may grant leave time as it is earned, or allow employees to use any or all of their leave time from the beginning of the 12-month period (frontloading). **Employers** existing paid leave policies in place prior to 1/1/24 do not have to change them if they meet or exceed the minimum requirements of the Act. Employees who did not previously

earn paid leave shall begin to earn paid leave under the Act on 1/1/24 or the date they begin employment, whichever is later. If leave time is not frontloaded, employees must be allowed to start using their accrued leave time after having worked 90 days past the later of these dates. All

work time, including overtime, must be counted toward accrual of paid leave and an employee may use their paid leave time for any reason. Unused accrued paid leave time from one 12-month period must be carried over to the following 12-month period. The rulemaking outlines how paid leave time must be calculated

and documented different in employment situations; how employees will be notified of paid leave time they have earned and when it can be claimed; how the Act applies to unionized employees, domestic workers, and transferred employees; and how unused paid leave will be compensated upon termination of employment. Complaints may be filed against employers who violate the Act and each violation is subject to a \$2,500 fine. Small businesses, small municipalities and organizations are affected.

Proposed Rulemakings

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EMISSIONS INSPECTIONS

The **DEPARTMENT** OF **TRANSPORTATION** proposed amendments to Diesel **Emission** Inspection Program (92 IAC 460; 47 III Reg 15634) that update its rules for Official Emissions Testing Stations (last amended in 2002) and add provisions for portable diesel emissions testing. Providers of portable emissions testing must apply for and obtain an Official Portable Diesel Emissions Permit from DOT and must maintain a recordkeeping office in Illinois, with records open for inspection by DOT at any time. The maximum allowable charge to a customer for an annual emissions inspection is \$50 (currently \$30) for the initial inspection and \$30 (currently \$25) for a reinspection. DOT will approve charge/rate schedules that are less than or equal to these amounts but will not approve higher charges. The application for a portable emissions testing permit must include the physical address of the applicant's Illinois recordkeeping office; the year, make, model and license plate number of each vehicle that will transport testing equipment; a list of the equipment that will be used to perform inspections; verification that the equipment meets Society of Automotive **Engineers** (SAE) standards; and a \$50 application fee to submitted electronically. Applicants for either testing station permits or portable testing permits must file a \$10,000 bond with DOT before a permit can be issued. Portable emissions testing providers must, upon request, notify DOT at least 48 hours in advance of locations where inspections are scheduled, and must file an updated list of their vehicles at least annually. Individuals

applying for certification as diesel emissions testers must submit a current digital photo and a copy of a government-issued photo identification card with their application. Certified Diesel Emissions Tester (CDET) applicants must also pass an open-book test with a score of at least 88% (currently, 70%) and pay a \$25 fee for a retest if they fail. CDET certifications are valid for one year (currently, no time period is specified) and renewable if the tester maintains compliance with this Part. DOT may require a tester to retake the openbook test, physically perform a diesel emissions test, or demonstrate proficiency in operating emissions testing equipment as part of annual recertification. The rulemaking also removes obsolete testing standards, updates procedures for recording test directs correspondence results. regarding the emissions testing DOT's program to Bureau of Investigation and Compliance (formerly, Division of Traffic Safety) and updates contact information. Businesses that operate vehicles subject to emissions testing or that provide emissions testing affected.

AIR POLLUTION

The POLLUTION CONTROL BOARD proposed amendments to Definitions and General Provisions (35 IAC 211; 47 Ill Reg 15589) that implement a recent change in federal Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) regulations. The rulemaking revises the definitions of volatile organic material (VOM) and volatile organic compound (VOC) to exclude a compound that **USEPA** has determined makes only a negligible impact on ozone formation.

STATE TRAVEL

DEPARTMENT OF The CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES proposed amendments to the Part titled The Travel Regulation Council (80 IAC 3000; 47 III Reg 15547) implementing amendments to the State Finance Act. rulemaking adopts established for per diem, meal and lodging reimbursement for federal government employees as the rates applicable to State employees on travel status. The rulemaking also allows a member of the Council (which oversees all State travel boards) to participate in a meeting remotely if the member has been prevented from physically attending, has notified and obtained approval from the Council, and a quorum is physically present at the meeting site.

DOR also proposed an amendment Charitable Games Act (86 IAC 435; 47 III Reg 15629) that updates contact information for DOR's Office of Bingo and Charitable Games.

SOS RULE WITHDRAWAL

The SECRETARY OF STATE has withdrawn proposed amendments to Cancellation, Revocation or Suspension of Licenses or Permits (92 IAC 1040; 47 III Reg 14311) that appeared in the 10/13/23 *Illinois Register*. SOS is withdrawing this rulemaking in order to complete additional changes and updates to the offense code.

Emergency Rule

COMMUNITY CARE PROGRAM

The DEPARTMENT ON AGING adopted emergency amendments to Community Care Program (89 IAC 240; 47 III Reg 15675) effective 10/18/23 for a maximum of 150 days. Companion (not identical) proposed amendments appear in this week's Illinois Register at 47 Ill Reg 15309. The emergency and proposed amendments implement enhanced options for Emergency Home Response Services (EHRS) that include fall detection and global positioning systems monitoring, and also implement extension of a federal waiver allowing a legally responsible individual (LRI), such as a spouse, representative payee, or power of attorney, to serve as a home care aide when a qualified CCP aide is not available or unable to provide services in the customer's plan of care. Both rulemakings update outdated requirements for EHRS and remove a prohibition of LRIs from being homecare aides. The proposed rulemaking, in addition, adds provisions for DonA to terminate provider contracts and for providers to appeal terminations or other adverse decisions; requires 2 additional hours of inservice Alzheimer's/dementia training for employees of EHRS and automated medication dispensing service providers and for home care service and adult day service employees; removes or updates outdated citations and definitions; allows DonA to grant variances from the rules in this Part on a case-by-case basis; and implements inclusive/gender neutral language. Providers of Community Care Program services and their customers are affected by these rulemakings.

Peremptory Rule

STATE EMPLOYEES

The DEPARTMENT OF CENTRAL MANAGEMENT SERVICES adopted peremptory amendments to Pay Plan (80 IAC 310; 47 III Reg 15712) effective 10/18/23, implementing a 4-year contract with the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees (AFSCME) for the period 7/1/23 through 6/30/27. The contract includes a \$1,200 stipend for AFSCME members effective 7/1/23 and general pay raises of 4% effective 7/1/23 and 2.5% effective 1/1/24. Other provisions increase longevity pay effective 1/1/24 for certain employees with 10 or 15 years of continuous service and increase pay grades for various positions. About 35,000 State employees represented by AFSCME bargaining units are affected.

IEPA GRANTS

The ILLINOIS ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY adopted a new Part titled General Grantmaking (EPA) (44 IAC 7070; 47 III Reg 6226) effective 10/19/23, implementing Section 50 of the Grant Accountability and Transparency Act (GATA), which

requires State agencies that make State awards to non-federal entities to adopt the federal uniform grant rules at 2 CFR 200. Small businesses, municipalities and non-profit entities receiving grants from IEPA may be affected.
