



Agency for Healthcare Research and Quality (AHRQ) Small Grant Program for Conference Support (CFDA No. 93.226)

Purpose: To support conferences that help further the mission of AHRQ to improve the quality, safety,

Purpose: To provide funding for up to two bilateral symposia or workshops in the area of digital humanities. Collaboration between U.S. and German partners is a key requirement for this grant category. The goal is to promote stronger bilateral cooperation and increased competencies in the

digital humanities communities in the two countries by initiating or intensifying contact between distinguished scholars, junior researchers, scientists, librarians, information professionals, and others working on humanities projects.

Healthy Aging Through Behavioral Economic Analyses of Situations (CFDA No. 93.866)

Purpose: To translate basic findings from behavioral economics into behavior change interventions targeting health behaviors associated with chronic health conditions of mid-life and older age. Also to propose small pilot clinical trials or demonstration projects, ideally based on collaborations between individuals with expertise in behavioral economics and psychologists, psychiatrists, clinicians, or others with expertise in aging or implementing behavioral interventions.

Eligibility: State, county, city, or township governments; nonprofits; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; for-profit organizations other than small businesses; and small businesses.

Funding: \$3.75 million.

Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) Prevention Projects for Community-Based Organizations (CFDA No. 93.939)

Purpose: To develop and implement HIV Prevention Programs that provide HIV prevention services for members of racial/ethnic minority communities (e.g., African Americans, Hispanics/Latinos) in which there may be a high risk for HIV infection and for members of groups in which there may be a high risk for acquiring or transmitting HIV infection, regardless of race/ethnicity.

Eligibility: Nonprofit organizations, other than institutions of higher education, including hospitals, community-based organizations, and faith-based organizations.

Funding: \$43 million.

Jacob K. Javits Fellowship Program (CFDA No. 84.170)

Purpose: To award fellowships to eligible students of superior ability to undertake graduate study in specific fields in the arts, humanities, and social sciences leading to a doctoral degree or to a master's degree in those fields in which the master's degree is the terminal highest degree awarded to the selected field of study at accredited institutions of higher education.

Eligibility: Individuals who, at the time of application: are eligible to receive a federal grant, loan or work assistance; intend to pursue a doctoral or Master of Fine Arts degree in an eligible field of study selected by the Board at an accredited U.S. institution of higher education; and are a U.S. citizen or national, a permanent resident of the U.S., or in the U.S. for other than a temporary purpose.

Funding: \$1.18 million.

Museums for America (CFDA No. 45.301)

Purpose: To support projects and ongoing activities that build museums' capacity to serve their community and strengthen a museum's ability to serve the public more effectively by supporting high-priority activities that advance the institution's mission and strategic goals. Grants are designed to be flexible and funds can be used for a wide variety of projects, including: ongoing museum work, research and other behind-the-scenes activities, planning, new programs, purchase of equipment or services, and activities that will support the efforts of museums to upgrade and integrate new technologies.

Eligibility: All types of museums are eligible.

Funding: \$17 million.

Purpose: National Endowment for Humanities

NDNP is creating a national, digital resource of historically significant newspapers published between 1836 and 1922 from all the states and U.S. territories. This searchable database will be permanently maintained at the Library of Congress and be freely accessible via the Internet.

Purpose: To support the preparation of editions and translations of pre-existing texts and documents that are currently inaccessible or available in inadequate editions. Projects must be undertaken by a team of at least one editor or translator and one other staff member. Grants typically support editions and translations of significant literary, philosophical, and historical materials, but other types of work, such as musical notation, are also eligible.

Eligibility: State, county, city, or township governments; nonprofits; public, state, and private institutions of higher education; and individuals.

“Soil Fumigant Pilot Project” — FY 2009 Strategic Agricultural Initiative/Food Quality Protection Act Grant Program (CFDA No. 66.716)

Purpose: To improve results for children with disabilities by promoting the development, demonstration, and use of technology; to support educational media services activities designed to be of educational value in the classroom setting to children with disabilities; and to provide support for captioning and video description of educational materials that are appropriate for use in the classroom setting.


