This edition includes program descriptions and outlay information, as well as sections to assist legislators and staff in linking the federal program data to the state budget. A State Trust Fund section identifies the trust fund(s) used for depositing the federal grants, and a table indicates which state programs are supported and what areas and populations of Illinois are served by the federal grants.

It is the hope of the Legislative Research Unit that this handbook will be a useful resource for legislators in enhancing their understanding of federal assistance.

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INTRODUCTION

The Legislative Research Unit, a bipartisan support agency of the General Assembly, has the responsibility of serving as the “. . . information center for the General Assembly in the field of federal-state relations, . . . and compiling and maintaining current information on available and pending federal aid programs.” [25 ILCS 130/4-2.1] In meeting this responsibility, the Legislative Research Unit records and tracks applications for, and awards of, federal grants to state agencies. In addition, the Legislative Research Unit conducts an annual survey designed to identify federal funds received by Illinois state agencies.

This Federal Funds to State Agencies report is designed to provide legislators and legislative staff with a comprehensive guide to federal funds that are received by state agencies. It augments the information provided in the Legislative Research Unit’s weekly reports of federal fund transactions by listing federal aid awards on a state or federal fiscal year basis and including descriptive program information. The weekly report goes only to the agencies that have submitted applications in that particular week. It is hoped that this information will help legislators and legislative staff develop a clearer understanding of the federal programs used by Illinois state agencies, and of the levels at which those programs are being funded.

The Legislative Research Unit is also required to report annually to the General Assembly on the adequacy of state agency participation in programs financed by federal aid and the nature of federal aid programs in which state agencies or local governments did not participate, and to make recommendations. [25 ILCS 130/4-2(i)(c)]

Adequacy of Participation in Federal Aid Programs

Each state agency, in its budgetary process with the General Assembly, reports evaluation and funding data as required. Through this process, the General Assembly receives information on the adequacy of programs financed by federal aid in the State. The Legislative Research Unit, as requested or assigned by members of the General Assembly, produces special reports relative to federal funds.

Identification of New Federal Funds (Types and Nature of Programs Not Applied For)

The Legislative Research Unit works closely with the Illinois Federal Clearinghouse in the Governor’s Office to identify and make information available on federal aid programs that may provide resources for state agencies and local governments. Extensive Clearinghouse information, including referrals to Legislative Research Unit’s publications, such as Grant Alerts, is available on the Internet at www.ilga.gov. Grant Alerts is also published monthly and mailed to potential grant users throughout the state.

Recommendations

The Legislative Research Unit will make recommendations as deemed appropriate.

Overview


Illinois state agencies receive federal funds from about 355 programs per year. State revenue from federal appropriations dipped in FY's 2005 and 2006, then increased in FY's 2007 and 2008, as shown in Table 1 and Figure 1. The local total of federal grants declined, but the Illinois percentage share of the U.S. total remained fairly constant. Supplemental funds that might be added at the end of a fiscal year are not included.

In FY 2008, actual awards received by state agencies are estimated to be \$12.4 billion, an \$87 million decrease from the \$12.5 billion received in FY 2007. Program details are summarized in Appendix B.

Some of the major increases in federal funds from FY 2007 to FY 2008 include the Medical Assistance (Medicaid, Title XIX) administered by the Department of Healthcare and Family Services; the Department of Transportation’s Highway Planning and Construction program; the State Board of Education’s Title I Grants to Local Educational Agencies; and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency’s Interoperable Communication Equipment program.

Programs with substantial reductions include State Children’s Insurance Program administered by the Department of Healthcare and Family Services; the Housing Development Authority’s Lower Income Housing Assistance Program □ Section 8 Moderate Rehabilitation; and the Emergency Management Agency’s Disaster Grants □ Public Assistance (Presidentially Declared Disasters).

Using This Handbook

The federal programs in this handbook were included if the funds were received directly from the federal government or a non-state agency (such as a consortium of states that receive federal monies for a particular project or a national study group that pays the state agency for research or services). Programs in which a state agency received funds from another state agency (subgrants) have been excluded to avoid “double counting” or falsely inflating the dollar totals. However, Appendix C on subgrants has been added to indicate the flow of federal funds from some state agencies to others.

The program descriptions in Federal Funds to State Agencies are preceded by a table of contents that lists the federal programs used by state agencies from FY 2006 through FY 2008. This table will help finding the location of the federal program descriptions as well as indicate which groups of federal programs are used by each state agency. Tables showing federal aid award totals by state agency are appended. Programs within each agency are listed by the numbers assigned to them by the U.S. Office of Management and Budget (OMB) in their *Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance*. Descriptions of each program include the proper name, program description (objectives and services provided or supported), formula description, matching requirements, account identification number (federal), and a table illustrating the outlays to Illinois for FY 2006, FY 2007, and FY 2008.

This Federal Funds to State Agencies handbook contains two sections of state information to assist legislators and staff in linking the federal program data to the state budget. A State Trust Fund section identifies the trust fund(s) used for depositing the federal grants, and a table identifies which state programs are supported and what areas and populations of Illinois are served by the federal grants. Descriptions of the federal programs include their proper names, common names (where appropriate), and five-digit identifying numbers (referred to as OMB catalog numbers) as listed in the U.S. Office of Management and Budget’s *Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance*. Each OMB catalog number serves to identify a federal program and the administering federal agency. In a few instances where federal programs are not listed in the *Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance*, LRU has assigned a unique identifying number. The program descriptions are arranged in ascending order by OMB catalog number. For example, the list on the next page shows the basic numbering scheme and the corresponding federal agencies.

Information Sources

The basic sources for the fiscal data included in the Federal Funds to State Agencies report are the Legislative Research Unit's annual federal aid surveys which have examined the use of federal funds by Illinois state agencies from FY 1973 until the present. The LRU has combined its survey information with information compiled through its weekly federal aid tracking system to obtain actual and estimated totals for most federal programs. The fiscal information is supplied directly by the state agencies, and it is assumed the figures are supplied in good faith and are substantially correct. In a few cases where federal programs provide funds under several subcategories, the fiscal information was obtained from Federal Funds Information for States, a project sponsored by the National Conference of State Legislatures and the National Governors Association. The primary source for the program descriptive information is the U.S. Office of Management and Budget's *Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance*.

SUPREME COURT

93.586 STATE COURT IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

Program Description: The program provides formula grants to assist state courts in carrying out their role in the continuum of care provided for families and children at risk. It offers support for the implementation of alternatives and improvements, as well as the expansion of successful court systems. It enables state courts to design assessments that identify barriers to effective decision-making, highlight practices that are not fully successful, examine areas in need of correction or added attention, and then implement reforms that address the state court’s specific needs.

Formula Description: Each state court with an approved application is allotted \$85,000 for each of the fiscal years 2007-2011. In addition to this base amount, the remainder of the amount appropriated for all state courts will be divided among those courts with approved applications, according to each state’s proportionate share of children under the age of 21. Twenty-five percent of the total cost must come from non-federal funds.

16.543 MISSING CHILDREN'S ASSISTANCE

Program Description: The program provides project grants to public agencies or private non-profit organizations for research, demonstration projects, or service programs designed to (1) educate parents, children, and community agencies and organizations in ways to prevent the abductions and sexual exploitation of children; (2) provide information to assist in the location and return of missing children; (3) aid communities in the collection of materials which would be useful to parents in assisting others in the identification of missing children; (4) develop effective treatment for the psychological consequences to both parents and children of (a) the abduction of a child, both during the period of disappearance and after the child is recovered; and (b) the sexual exploitation of a missing child; (5) collect detailed data from selected states or localities on the actual investigative practices used by law enforcement agencies in missing children's cases; (6) address the particular needs of missing children by minimizing the negative impact of judicial and law enforcement procedures on children who are victims of abuse or sexual exploitation and by promoting the active participation of children and their families in cases involving abuse or sexual exploitation of children; (7) address the needs of missing children and their families following the recovery of such children; (8) reduce the likelihood that individuals under 18 years of age will be abducted; and (9) establish or operate statewide clearinghouses to assist in recovering or locating missing children.

Formula Description: The program has no statutory formula or matching requirement.

16.590 GRANTS TO ENCOURAGE ARREST POLICIES AND ENFORCEMENT OF PROTECTION ORDERS

Program Description: The program provides grants to improve the enforcement of protection orders in domestic violence cases and cases of sexual assault against seniors and persons with disabilities. It also provides funding to implement mandatory arrest programs and policies for protection order violations as part of a coordinated community response to domestic violence. The program funds grants to develop policies, educational programs, and training programs for police departments to help them improve the tracking of cases. It also provides police departments with technical assistance and computer equipment.

Formula Description: This program has no statutory formula or fixed matching requirement, although grant recipients are encouraged to make cash or in-kind contributions whenever possible.

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR

15.614 COASTAL WETLANDS PLANNING, PROTECTION, AND RESTORATION ACT

Program Description: The program provides competitive matching grants to coastal states for coastal wetlands conservation projects. The Coastal Wetlands Planning, Protection, and Restoration Act established the National Coastal Wetlands Conservation Grant Program to acquire, restore, and enhance wetlands in coastal states. Funds are available to coastal states for acquisition of interests in coastal lands or waters, and for restoration, enhancement or management of coastal wetlands ecosystems on a competitive basis.

Formula Description: The federal share of project costs is up to 50%; except that the federal share may be increased to 75% if a state has established a trust fund for the purpose of acquiring coastal wetlands, other natural areas, or open spaces.

45.310 GRANTS TO STATES

Program Description: The program consolidates federal library services programs designed to stimulate excellence and promote access to learning and information in all types of libraries. It also assists in providing linkages among libraries, and promotes targeted library services to people of diverse geographic, cultural, and socioeconomic backgrounds. Grants are available to state library administrative agencies, which may spend the money themselves or use it to make grants to other agencies. Subgrants may be made for the following purposes: (1) to establish or enhance electronic linkages among libraries; (2) to link libraries electronically with educational, school, or information services; (3) to assist libraries in accessing information through electronic networks; (4) to encourage different types of libraries to establish consortia and share resources; (5) to pay costs for libraries to acquire or share computer systems and telecommunications technologies; and (6) to target library and information services to persons having difficulty using a library and to underserved urban and rural communities, including children from birth through age 17 from families with incomes below the poverty line.

Formula Description: Grants to states are based on the most recent total population calculations from the Bureau of the Census, but with a \$340,000 minimum for the 50 states, District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico; and a \$40,000 minimum for the other outlying areas. The federal share is 66%.

Program Description: The program is designed to enhance the quality of library services nationwide and to provide coordination between libraries and museums. Activities may include: (1) education and training of persons in library and information science through graduate fellowships, particularly in new technology and other critical areas; (2) research and demonstration projects related to the improvement of libraries, education in library and information science, enhancement of library services through effective and efficient use of new technologies, and dissemination of information derived from such projects; and (3) preservation or digitization of library materials and resources, giving priority to projects emphasizing coordination, avoidance of duplication, and access by researchers beyond the institution or library entity undertaking the project.

Formula Description: Awards over \$250,000 must be matched one-to-one; recipients of smaller awards are encouraged to match up to 1/3 of project costs. This match is waived for research grants.

DEPARTMENT ON AGING

17.235 SENIOR COMMUNITY SERVICE EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

Program Description: The program is designed to provide, foster, and promote part-time work opportunities (usually 20 hours per week) in community service activities for low-income persons who are 55 years old and older. The program assists and promotes the transition of program enrollees into unsubsidized employment. The individuals who are employed may be placed in work assignments at local service agencies (e.g., schools, hospitals, day care centers, park systems, etc.), or may be given work assignments in connection with community service projects. A portion of project funds may be used to provide participants with training, counseling, and other support services.

Formula Description: The allocation formula (Section 506 of the Act) is based on the number of persons aged 55 and over residing in each state and the per capita income in each state. Project sponsors must contribute at least 10% of the costs of the project. The sponsor's share may be contributed in cash or in-kind. The program has a maintenance of effort requirement.

A state plan covering two, three, or four years, with annual revisions as necessary, must be submitted for approval to the Commission on Aging. The goal is to educate both consumers and providers about residents' rights and good care practices and to help prevent resident abuse and costly fraud against the Medicare and Medicaid programs.

Formula Description: No match is required. Allocations are based on the state population of persons 60 years of age and over relative to other states. This program has a maintenance of effort requirement.

14.228 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANTS—STATE’S PROGRAM

Program Description: The block grant program (also called the “small cities” program) permits states to develop and administer their own programs and set funding priorities for communities within their borders. The goal is to develop viable urban communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic opportunities—principally for those with low or moderate incomes. Permitted activities include, among others, acquisition of real property, relocation and demolition of residential and nonresidential structures, construction of public infrastructure, and measures to promote home ownership. In addition to federal grants, states may receive program income generated from CDBG funded activities. These include gross repayments of housing and business loans made with CDBG funds, gross sales proceeds from properties acquired or improved with CDBG funds, and gross proceeds resulting from the use of CDBG-assisted properties. States are authorized to require that recipients of state-distributed CDBG funds return to the state any program income generated as a result of the funding, except when such program income is used to continue the activity that generated it (e.g., reinsurance of loans). States may then redistribute the program income in the form of grants. Federal regulations require states to account for all program income resulting from state administered non-entitlement area grants and maintain records (with only minor exceptions) of all program income indefinitely. Because program income may grow when a state issues new income-generating grants or redistributes program income from earlier grants, this requirement places a considerable burden on states.

Formula Description: Non-entitlement cities receive 30% of CDBG funds. The statistical factors for each state reflect only the non-entitled areas of the state. The allocation is based on one of two formulas, whichever is greater. Formula one factors are population, extent of poverty, and extent of overcrowding, weighted 25%, 50%, and 25% respectively. The second formula factors are population, poverty, and age of housing (number of year-round housing units built before 1939 or earlier), weighted 20%, 30%, and 50% respectively. If the state elects to administer the program, the funds flow to the state, which redistributes them to localities. A state may retain up to \$100,000 plus 2% of its grant for administration, and must match each federal dollar in excess of \$100,000 used for administration. These block grant funds may be used for other federal grant-in-aid programs if they meet the CDBG criteria.

In addition, TEA21 authorized the Interstate Maintenance Program, the Highway Bridge Program, the Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program, the Recreational Trails Program, High Priority Projects, and a state minimum guarantee allocation.

(1) NATIONAL HIGHWAY SYSTEM (NHS)

Program Description: The program is designed to serve major population centers, facilitate interstate and interregional travel, and improve public transportation facilities. Funds are available for new construction; resurfacing, restoring, rehabilitating, and reconstructing roads; highway safety improvement, research, and planning; traffic management; carpools; and bicycle and pedestrian pathways.

Formula Description: Funds for the NHS and STP are apportioned to the states using the same distribution formula, which is based on the state's "historical share." This is determined by the state's percentage share of all highway funds for the FFY 1987-1991 period less interstate construction and substitution, federal lands, emergency relief, demonstration project funds, and the portion of minimum allocation funds attributable to the interstate construction and substitute programs. The state matching rate is 10% for interstate projects and 20% for non-interstate projects.

(2) SURFACE TRANSPORTATION PROGRAM (STP)

Program Description: The STP is designed to give state and local governments the flexibility to meet their needs. Projects eligible for assistance include construction and maintenance of bridges; transit capital expenditures; planning; safety improvements; and wetlands, wildlife, and ecosystem mitigation. Ten percent of a state's STP funds must be spent for transportation enhancement activities, and 10% for safety programs.

After the above set-asides, a state must obligate 62.5% of its apportionment to areas within the state based on their relative share of state population (areas with over 200,000 population must be given direct pass-through funds), and 37.5% may be obligated anywhere within the state.

(3) *INTERSTATE MAINTENANCE*
