RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 864

Offered by Representative Jefferson:

WHEREAS, American senior citizens are confused about the new Medicare drug plan; because this confusion is so prevalent, Congress should provide more time for seniors to determine the best options for their individual needs; and

WHEREAS, According to a poll released by the Kaiser Family Foundation, two-thirds of seniors do not know they have to choose a private prescription drug plan; one-third of seniors think they can receive their drugs through Medicare; the poll showed that 76% of seniors have never been on-line, making researching their options even more intimidating; and

WHEREAS, Most alarming, 63% of seniors don't know they will face financial penalties if they do not sign up by next May; and

WHEREAS, The Medicare Informed Choice Act of 2005 will protect seniors as they work their way through the benefit; the bill does three important things: delays the late enrollment penalties for an additional six months, providing an entire year before financial penalties will be assessed; gives every Medicare beneficiary the opportunity to make a one-time change in plan enrollment at any point in 2006, providing for correction of any mistake made in choosing a plan; and it protects employees from being dropped by their former employer's plan during the first year of implementation so that beneficiaries have time to correct enrollment mistakes; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge Congress to pass the Medicare Informed Choice Act of 2005 as introduced in the Senate; and be it further

RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be delivered to each member of the Illinois Congressional delegation.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 866

Offered by Representative Tryon:

WHEREAS, Attacks by vicious and dangerous dogs are a threat to the public health of the State of Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Attacks against vulnerable residents and companion animals are being reported to law enforcement officials and animal control officers; and

WHEREAS, at least 7 separate bills to amend the Animal Control Act and protect Illinoisans against the threat of dog attacks are currently under consideration by the General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, It is imperative that the General Assembly take comprehensive action to ensure the safety of the residents of this State; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that the House Committee on Local Government hold subject matter hearings during the 2006 Spring session of this General Assembly concerning dangerous and vicious dogs, and matters related to the Animal Control Act; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Committee on Local Government is urged to convene hearings to examine the issue, gather expert testimony from qualified representatives familiar with animal control issues and from the Department of Public Health, and propose solutions that will better safeguard and protect the residents of Illinois against vicious and dangerous dog attacks; and be it further

RESOLVED, That an Animal Control Task Force be appointed to examine the Animal Control Act and make comprehensive written recommendations for change; the Task Force shall have 9 members, including: a representative of the Bureau of Animal Welfare within the Department of Agriculture, as designated by the Director of the Department; the Director of Public Health, or his or her designee; 2 representatives appointed by the Illinois State Veterinary Medical Association, one of whom must be a county animal control administrator; a representative appointed by the Illinois Farm Bureau; a representative appointed by the American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (ASPCA); a representative appointed by the Illinois States' Attorneys Association; and 2 representatives appointed by the County Animal Controls of Illinois, one of whom must represent the greater Chicago metropolitan area and one of whom must represent downstate Illinois; staffs of both the House Legislative Leaders assigned to the House Local Government Committee shall provide staff support to the Task Force as necessary; the Task Force shall hold at least 3 hearings, which shall each be held in geographically separate regions of the State, and shall present a written report to the House of Representatives no later than January 1, 2007; the Task Force members shall receive no compensation, and the Task Force shall conclude all business by February 1, 2007.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 91

Offered by Representative Richard Bradley:

WHEREAS, The reaction time of motorists using cellular phones slows dramatically, increasing the risk of automobile accidents and tying up traffic generally; and

WHEREAS, Cell phone distraction causes 2,600 deaths and 330,000 injuries in the United States every year; and

WHEREAS, The numbers of fatalities and injuries may be higher because data on cell phone use by motorists is limited; and

WHEREAS, Increasing cell phone use can be expected to cause the annual death estimate to rise; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that State, county, and municipal law enforcement personnel are requested to include in their police reports of automobile accidents information pertaining to if an accident involved the use of a cellular phone; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of State Police shall request from State, county, and municipal law enforcement agencies statistics on the use of cellular phones leading to automobile accidents over a one-year period beginning July 1, 2006, and report the findings to the General Assembly no later than December 1, 2007; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Department of State Police and appropriate county and municipal law enforcement agencies.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 92

Offered by Representative Moffitt:

WHEREAS, The Illinois Fire Service is experiencing problems with self dispatching of equipment and personnel for both State and national responses to emergency scenes without formal approval by a coordinating authority; and

WHEREAS, The Illinois Fire Service Caucus members have requested an end to self dispatching because of its potential to degrade continuity of operations and the critical infrastructure protection of both the sending and receiving jurisdictions; and

WHEREAS, Stopping self dispatching will reduce confusion and risk at an emergency scene by reducing

the need to commit additional resources to the management of those people and equipment that self dispatched to the scene; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that we encourage the prohibition of self dispatching by State and national response services; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Illinois Fire Service Caucus.

HOUSE BILLS ON SECOND READING

Having been read by title a second time on January 26, 2006 and held, the following bill was taken up and held on the order of Second Reading: HOUSE BILL 4525.

HOUSE BILL 4532. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on Judiciary II - Criminal Law, adopted and reproduced:

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Bill 4532 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The Criminal Code of 1961 is amended by adding Section 26-6 as follows:

(720 ILCS 5/26-6 new)

Sec. 26-6. Disorderly conduct at a funeral or memorial service.

(a) The General Assembly finds and declares that due to the unique nature of funeral and memorial services and the heightened opportunity for extreme emotional distress on such occasions, the purpose of this Section is to protect the privacy and ability to mourn of grieving families directly before, during, and after a funeral or memorial service.

(b) For purposes of this Section, "funeral site" means a church, synagogue, mosque, funeral home, gravesite, or other place at which a funeral or memorial service is being conducted or is scheduled to be conducted within the next 30 minutes or has been conducted within the last 30 minutes.

(c) A person commits the offense of disorderly conduct at a funeral or memorial service when he or she:

(1) engages, with knowledge of the existence of a funeral site, in any loud singing, playing of music, chanting, whistling, yelling, or noisemaking with, or without, noise amplification including, but not limited to, bullhorns, auto horns, and microphones within 200 feet of any ingress or egress of that funeral site, where the volume of such singing, music, chanting, whistling, yelling, or noisemaking is likely to be audible at and disturbing to the funeral site;

(2) displays, with knowledge of the existence of a funeral site and within 200 feet of any ingress or egress of that funeral site, any visual images that convey fighting words or actual or veiled threats against any other person;

(3) with knowledge of the existence of a funeral site, knowingly obstructs, hinders, impedes, or blocks another person's entry to or exit from that funeral site or a facility containing that funeral site, except that the owner or occupant of property may take lawful actions to exclude others from that property; or

(4) with knowledge of the existence of a funeral site, knowingly engages in a march or picket at the funeral site at any public location located within 200 feet of any ingress or egress of that funeral site.

(d) Disorderly conduct at a funeral or memorial service is a Class C misdemeanor. A second or subsequent violation of disorderly conduct at a funeral or memorial service is a Class 4 felony.

(e) If any clause, sentence, section, provision, or part of this Section or the application thereof to any person or circumstance is adjudged to be unconstitutional, the remainder of this Section or its application to persons or circumstances other than those to which it is held invalid, is not affected thereby.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law."

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 82, Yeas; 31, Nays; 0, Answering Present.

(ROLL CALL 5)

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.
