RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 878

Offered by Representative Daniels:

WHEREAS, Research shows that individuals with developmental disorders are 7 times more likely than other people to come into contact with police and that their responses to encounters with the law may not always be socially appropriate; and

WHEREAS, When first responders are called to situations involving individuals with disabilities at personal residences, schools, residential facilities, and even shopping malls, it is imperative that first responders are prepared to quickly recognize the situation and address the risk management issues for everyone; and

WHEREAS, Healthcare professionals in emergency rooms often recognize an individual's disability but may not have the training to best treat someone with a disability; and

WHEREAS, By providing first responder professionals with a better understanding of hidden disabilities, such as autism spectrum disorders, Alzheimer's disease, Tourette's syndrome, epilepsy, mental impairment, deafness, and mental illness, a better relationship between those servicing our communities and all of the citizens they serve no matter what their needs can be created; and

WHEREAS, There must be more training and communication between direct service providers and public safety officers at all levels of government to ensure the safety of individuals who may or may not be able to effectively communicate their needs in a manner that society traditionally demands; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we urge that a pilot program be established to promote alliances between community service providers, facilities, health care professionals, and local public safety officers and to provide proper training to law enforcement, healthcare professionals, and other first responders on how to properly intervene in situations dealing with an individual with a developmental disability or mental illness; and be it further

RESOLVED, That we encourage the Department of Public Health, the Department Human Services, and the Illinois State Police along with the Autism Society of Illinois to act as resource agencies and facilitate the pilot program by offering existing personnel and resources to train law enforcement, health care professionals, and first responders on how to best deal with this special population; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this resolution be presented to the Department of Public Health, the Department Human Services, the Illinois State Police, and the Autism Society of Illinois.

HOUSE RESOLUTION 881

Offered by Representative Pritchard:

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that there is created a Task Force on Municipal Pre-Annexation Agreements for the purpose of studying the enforcement of municipal zoning ordinances in unincorporated areas that are not contiguous to a municipality but that are the subject of pre-annexation agreements between the municipality and developers; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Task Force on Municipal Pre-Annexation Agreements shall consist of the following members:

- (1) 4 members of the House of Representatives: 2 members appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be a co-chairperson, and 2 members appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be a co-chairperson;
- (2) 2 members appointed from an association that represents municipalities;
- (3) 2 members appointed from an association that represents counties;
- (4) one member appointed by an association that represents Illinois home builders; and
- (5) one member appointed by an association that represents the Illinois legal community.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 93

Offered by Representative Phelps:

WHEREAS, The wine industry is vital to the health of both Illinois agriculture and tourism; and
WHEREAS, Several wineries in Jackson and Union Counties have banded together as the Shawnee Hills Wine Trail; and

WHEREAS, Portions of the Shawnee Hills Wine Trail traverse Illinois 127 between Aldridge Road and Orchard Hills Road south of Carbondale as well as various county highways in both Jackson and Union Counties; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the aforementioned roads be officially named the Shawnee Hills Wine Trail; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Illinois Department of Transportation, Jackson County, and Union County be directed to erect, at suitable locations consistent with State and federal regulations, appropriate signs along highways under their respective jurisdictions giving notice of the trail; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be presented to the Shawnee Wine Trail organization, the Director of Agriculture, the Director of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, the counties of Jackson and Union, and the Secretary of Transportation.

HOUSE BILLS ON SECOND READING

Having been reproduced, the following bills were taken up, read by title a second time and advanced to the order of Third Reading: HOUSE BILLS 1371, 4121 and 4242.

HOUSE BILL 4339. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time.

Committee Amendment No. 1 lost in the Committee on Higher Education.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on Higher Education, adopted and reproduced:

AMENDMENT NO. 2. Amend House Bill 4339 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The Public Community College Act is amended by adding Section 2-23 as follows:

(110 ILCS 805/2-23 new)

Sec. 2-23. Student transfer to university; coordinator and recruiter.

(a) The State Board shall establish a 3-year pilot program under which each community college in Community College District No. 508 and Community College District No. 527 must employ one person as a coordinator and one person as a recruiter to assist inner-city students in transferring to public universities in this State. The State Board shall provide a grant to each of these districts to fund the positions, which amount must be equally divided among the community colleges in these districts.

(b) The coordinator shall do all of the following:

(1) Work with the district's academic advisement staff to develop a program plan that will transition students to universities.

(2) Interface with university admissions departments to assist students during the transition.

(3) Assist students with course selection, majors, housing, child care, and financial aid.

(4) Track student progress and the effectiveness of campus events.

(5) Implement a transition strategy and work with students on the strategy.

(6) Interface with the president, deans, academic advisors, faculty, staff, and program directors.

(7) Oversee the activities of the recruiter.

(8) Assist students in filling out applications and finding a university match.

(9) Establish financial aid initiatives and assist students in finding and applying for funding sources.

(10) Coordinate housing arrangements.

(c) The recruiter shall do all of the following:

(1) Identify transfer candidates by working with deans and faculty.

(2) Develop recruiting strategies, including a proactive campus recruiting strategy that will attract dedicated students.

(3) Design, implement, and execute on-campus recruiting activities, including campus fairs, information sessions, workshops, and seminars.

(4) Create on-campus marketing and communication strategies to increase awareness and to educate students about the opportunities that exist with universities.

(5) Develop and maintain a partnership with deans, program directors, professors, and academic advisors.

(6) Establish partnerships with universities, as well as other institutions of higher education and trade schools.

(7) Report program effectiveness to the coordinator.

(d) After the pilot program has been in effect for 3 years, the State Board shall study the overall success of the pilot program and report its findings to the General Assembly. The program shall be deemed successful if 50% or more of all student participants have received their bachelor's degree. After the report is filed, the General Assembly may continue the program, increase funding for the program, or expand the program to all public community colleges in this State.

(e) The State Board may adopt any rules necessary to carry out its responsibilities under this Section.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2006."

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 2 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

HOUSE BILL 4383. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on Judiciary I - Civil Law, adopted and reproduced:

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Bill 4383 on page 3, below line 20, by inserting the following:

"The provisions of subparagraph (i) of paragraph 2.5 of subsection (c) shall be applied, unless the court

makes a finding that to apply those provisions would be inappropriate after considering all of the factors listed in paragraph 2 of subsection (a) of Section 505."

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

HOUSE BILL 4397. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on State Government Administration, adopted and reproduced:

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Bill 4397 by replacing everything after the enacting clause with the following:

"Section 5. The Illinois Housing Development Act is amended by adding Section 7.29 as follows:
(20 ILCS 3805/7.29 new)

Sec. 7.29. National Guard and Reservist homebuyer assistance.

(a) Subject to appropriation, the Authority shall establish and administer a guardsman and reservist homebuyer assistance program. Under the program, an eligible applicant may apply to the Authority for financial assistance for a portion of the down payment on the purchase of a house. The financial assistance: (i) shall not exceed 10% of the first \$100,000 of the purchase price of the house, (ii) shall not exceed 5% of any amount of the purchase price in excess of \$100,000, (iii) shall not exceed a total of \$15,000, and (iv) shall be in the form of a grant to the approved eligible applicant. An eligible applicant may apply for financial assistance up to 3 years following the completion of active duty.

(b) As used in this Section, "eligible applicant" means a member of the Illinois National Guard or the reserves of the Armed Forces of the United States called to active duty after September 11, 2001 who is a legal resident of the State of Illinois and who was a legal resident of this State when called to active duty.

(c) The Authority shall adopt necessary rules for the implementation of this Section, including rules for the solicitation, collection, and approval of applications and for the distribution of program grants.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect July 1, 2006."

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

Having been reproduced, the following bills were taken up, read by title a second time and advanced to the order of Third Reading: HOUSE BILLS 4561, 4606 and 4714.

HOUSE BILL 4752. Having been reproduced, was taken up and read by title a second time.

The following amendment was offered in the Committee on Executive, adopted and reproduced:

AMENDMENT NO. 1. Amend House Bill 4752 on page 1, lines 7 and 8, by deleting "Village of Lincolnshire"; and on page 1, line 11, by deleting "or the Village of Lincolnshire".

There being no further amendments, the foregoing Amendment No. 1 was ordered engrossed; and the bill, as amended, was advanced to the order of Third Reading.

Having been reproduced, the following bills were taken up, read by title a second time and advanced to the order of Third Reading: HOUSE BILLS 4719 and 4789.

HOUSE BILL ON THIRD READING

The following bill and any amendments adopted thereto were reproduced. This bill has been examined, any amendments thereto engrossed and any errors corrected. Any amendments still pending upon the passage or defeat of a bill on Third Reading are automatically tabled pursuant to Rule 40(a).

On motion of Representative Mendoza, HOUSE BILL 4607 was taken up and read by title a third time.

And the question being, "Shall this bill pass?" it was decided in the affirmative by the following vote: 103, Yeas; 7, Nays; 6, Answering Present.
(ROLL CALL 3)

This bill, having received the votes of a constitutional majority of the Members elected, was declared passed.

Ordered that the Clerk inform the Senate and ask their concurrence.

RESOLUTION

The following resolution was offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 95

Offered by Representative Currie:

WHEREAS, Due to the complexity of the Property Tax Code, there is a wide disparity in the methods by

which county and township assessment officials have assessed wooded land in the State; and

WHEREAS, This is a pressing problem requiring the urgent attention of the General Assembly, the Governor, and other State and local officials; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FOURTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Wooded Land Assessment Task Force is created concerning the assessment of wooded land and property under forestry management programs; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the task force shall consist of 12 voting members as follows:

(1) 4 members of the General Assembly appointed, one each, by the President of the Senate, the Minority Leader of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives;

(2) one member appointed by the Governor;

(3) the Director of Revenue or his or her designee, who shall serve as chair of the task force;

(4) the Director of Natural Resources or his or her designee;

(5) the Director of Agriculture or his or her designee;

(6) one member appointed by the University of Illinois;

(7) one member appointed by Southern Illinois University;

(6) one member, appointed by the Governor, who serves or has served as a county or township assessment official; and

(7) one member, appointed by the Governor, who has knowledge of farming and agricultural practices; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Department of Revenue shall provide staff and administrative support services to the task force; and be it further

RESOLVED, That task force members shall serve without compensation, but may be reimbursed for their reasonable travel expenses from funds available for that purpose; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the task force shall gather information and make recommendations to the Governor and to the General Assembly regarding procedures and policies for: (1) the assessment of wooded land; and (ii) the assessment of property under a certified forestry management program under Section 10-50 of the Property Tax Code; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the task force must submit a report to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 31, 2006 concerning its findings and recommendations; and be it further

RESOLVED, That if, during the 2005 taxable year, any parcel of wooded land was valued based upon its productivity index equalized assessed value as cropland, then we urge the Department of Revenue to accept any similar valuation of that wooded land for the 2006 and 2007 taxable years; and be it further

RESOLVED, That, for the purpose of this Resolution, "wooded land" means any parcel of unimproved real property that: (i) does not qualify as cropland, permanent pasture, other farmland, or wasteland under Section 10-125 of the Property Tax Code; and (ii) is not managed under a forestry management plan and considered to be other farmland under Section 10-150 of the Property Tax Code; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be delivered to the Governor, the Director of Revenue, the Director of Natural Resources, the Director of Agriculture, the President of the University of Illinois, and the President of Southern Illinois University.
