## RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions were offered and placed in the Committee on Rules.

### HOUSE RESOLUTION 265

Offered by Representative Acevedo:

WHEREAS, The ancient Greeks developed the concept of democracy, in which the supreme power to govern was vested in the people; and

WHEREAS, On March 25, 1821, the Feast Day of the Annunciation, the Greek nation reclaimed its ancient heritage as the "Cradle of Democracy" by throwing off the yoke of oppression which had enslaved its people since the fall of Constantinople in 1453; conquered by the Ottoman Turks in the 15th century, Greece waged a successful War of Independence (1821-1829) and reinstated a democratic form of government; and

WHEREAS, Greece celebrates two important events in its history on March 25, the beginning of the revolution that freed the Greek people from the Ottoman Empire, and the Greek Orthodox Feast of the Annunciation of the Blessed Virgin Mary; and

WHEREAS, It was for that reason that on March 25, 1821, Bishop Germanos of Patras chose that day to deliver a message of a new life to the people of Greece and hoisted the Greek flag in defiance of the Turks at the Monastery of Ayia Lavra near Kalavrita; and

WHEREAS, The Founding Fathers of the United States drew heavily on the political experience and philosophy of ancient Greece in forming our representative democracy; and

WHEREAS, Greek Commander in Chief Petros Mavromichalis, a founder of the modern Greek state, said to the citizens of the United States in 1821 that "it is in your land that liberty has fixed her abode and in imitating you, we shall imitate our ancestors and be thought worthy of them if we succeed in resembling you"; and

WHEREAS, Greece played a major role in the World War II struggle to protect freedom and democracy through such bravery as was shown in the historic Battle of Crete, which provided the Axis land war with its first major setback, setting off a chain of events that significantly affected the outcome of World War II; and

WHEREAS, The price for Greece in holding our common values in their region was high as hundreds of thousands of civilians were killed in Greece during World War II; and

WHEREAS, Throughout the 20th century, Greece was 1 of only 3 countries in the world beyond the former British Empire that allied with the United States in every major international conflict; and

WHEREAS, Greece is a strategic partner and ally of the United States in bringing political stability and economic development to the volatile Balkan region, having invested over \$10,000,000,000 in the region; and

WHEREAS, Greece was extraordinarily responsive to requests by the United States during the war in Iraq, as Greece immediately granted unlimited access to its airspace and the base in Souda Bay, and many ships of the United States that delivered troops, cargo, and supplies to Iraq were refueled in Greece; and

WHEREAS, In August 2004, the Olympic games came home to Athens, Greece, the land of their ancient birthplace 2,500 years ago, and the city of their modern revival in 1896; and

WHEREAS, Greece received world-wide praise for its extraordinary handling of over 14,000 athletes from 202 countries and over 2,000,000 spectators and journalists during the 2004 Olympics, which it did so efficiently, securely, and with its famous Greek hospitality; and

WHEREAS, The unprecedented security effort in Greece for the first Olympics to be held after the attacks on the United States on September 11, 2001, included a record-setting expenditure of over \$1,390,000,000 and an assignment of over 70,000 security personnel, as well as the utilization of an 8-country Olympic Security Advisory Group that included the United States; and

WHEREAS, Greece, located in a region where Christianity meets Islam and Judaism, maintains excellent relations with both Muslim nations and Israel; and

WHEREAS, the Government of Greece has had extraordinary success in recent years in furthering cross-cultural understanding and reducing tensions between themselves and Turkey; and

WHEREAS, Greece and the United States are at the forefront of the effort for freedom, democracy, peace, stability, and human rights; and

WHEREAS, Those ideals, as well as others, have forged a close bond between these 2 nations and their peoples; and

WHEREAS, March 25, 2007, marks the 186th anniversary of the beginning of the revolution that freed the Greek people from the nearby Ottoman Empire; and

WHEREAS, It is proper and desirable to celebrate this anniversary with the Greek people and to reaffirm the democratic principles from which these two great nations were born; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we designate March 25, 2007 as Greek Independence Day and encourage the people of the State of Illinois to observe the day with appropriate ceremonies and activities; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be presented to the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of Chicago, the Consul General of Greece in Chicago, and ENOSIS, The Federation of Hellenic-American Organizations in Illinois.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 39

Offered by Representative Bellock:

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is a slow, progressive disorder of the brain that results in loss of memory and other cognitive functions and, eventually, results in death; and

WHEREAS, Because Alzheimer's is accompanied by memory loss, poor judgment, changes in personality and behavior, and a tendency to wander, individuals with this disease are at increased risk for accidental injury, getting lost, abuse, neglect, and exploitation; and

WHEREAS, With one in 10 people over age 65 and almost one in every two people over 85 having Alzheimer's disease or a related dementia, over the past 10 years the number of Illinoisans with Alzheimer's and related dementias has risen dramatically to the point that today over 210,000 people are affected; and

WHEREAS, As the baby boom generation enters the age of greatest risk for Alzheimer's, by 2025 their number in Illinois is expected to increase to over 239,000; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease takes an enormous toll on loving family members, with an estimated one in four acting as a caregiver for each individual with the disease; and

WHEREAS, Caregivers for individuals with Alzheimer's watch closely the deleterious effects of the disease and often suffer more stress, depression, and health problems than caregivers of people with other illnesses; and

WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is considered to be early onset if an individual is younger than 65 when symptoms first appear, and early onset Alzheimer's can strike someone as early as their 30s, 40s, and 50s, with new data showing there may be half a million Americans under age 65 who have dementia or cognitive impairment at a level of severity consistent with dementia; and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois has convened the Legislative Task Force on Alzheimer's Disease pursuant to House Joint Resolution 14 (93rd General Assembly); and

WHEREAS, The State of Illinois must not be complacent and must renew its commitment to develop a more aggressive State plan to ensure that the framework of programs and services to help Illinoisans with Alzheimer's and other related dementia are functioning and capable of meeting the challenge of this serious public health problem among Illinoisans; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Alzheimer's Disease and Other Related Dementia State Plan Council is created, to consist of the following:

8 members of the Illinois General Assembly appointed as follows: 2 members of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate, one of whom shall serve as co-chairman; 2 members of the Senate appointed by the Minority Leader of the Senate; 2 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom shall serve as co-chairman; and 2 members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Minority Leader of the House of Representatives; the Director of the Illinois Department on Aging (or his or her designee); the Director of the Illinois Department of Public Health (or his or her designee); the Director of the Illinois Department of Healthcare and Family Services (or his or her designee); and 8 members of the public appointed by the Governor, to include a representative of the Alzheimer's Association, a caregiver for a person with Alzheimer's Disease, and a person with early-stage Alzheimer's disease; Advisory Council members shall serve without compensation but shall be reimbursed for their reasonable and necessary expenses from funds appropriated for that purpose; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Alzheimer's Disease and Other Related Dementia State Plan Council is directed to assess the current and future impact of Alzheimer's disease on Illinoisans, to examine the existing services and resources addressing the needs of persons with Alzheimer's and their families and caregivers, and to prepare, and develop a strategy to implement, an Alzheimer's Disease and Other Related Dementia State Plan in response to this public health crisis; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Alzheimer's Disease and Other Related Dementia State Plan Council shall include in its Alzheimer's Disease and Other Related Dementia State Plan an examination of the following:

- (1) trends in the State's Alzheimer's population and their needs, including the changing population with dementia, including but not limited to:
  - (A) the State's role in long-term care, family caregiver support, and assistance to persons with early-stage and early onset Alzheimer's; and
  - (B) the State's policy regarding persons with Alzheimer's and developmental disabilities;
- (2) existing services, resources, and capacity, including but not limited to:
  - (A) the type, cost, and availability of dementia services;
  - (B) the capacity of public safety and law enforcement to respond to persons with Alzheimer's;
  - (C) the availability of home and community-based resources for persons with Alzheimer's and respite care to assist families;
  - (D) an inventory of long-term care special dementia care units;
  - (E) the adequacy and appropriateness of geriatric-psychiatric units for persons with behavior disorders associated with Alzheimer's and related dementias;
  - (F) assisted living residential options for persons with dementia; and
  - (G) State support of Alzheimer's research through Illinois universities and other resources; and
- (3) needed State policies and responses, including, but not limited to, recommendations for provision of clear and coordinated services and support to persons and families living with Alzheimer's and related disorders, and ways to address any identified gaps in service; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Alzheimer's Disease and Other Related Dementia State Plan Council shall provide an Alzheimer's Disease and Other Related Dementia State Plan to the Governor and the General Assembly no later than January 1, 2009; and be it further

RESOLVED, That suitable copies of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, the Director of Aging, the Director of Public Health, and the Director of Healthcare and Family Services.

#### HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION 40

Offered by Representative Monique Davis:

WHEREAS, According to a recent study by the Center for Labor Market Studies at Northeastern University in Boston, Massachusetts, in 2005 in Illinois there were 227,010 youth ages 16 to 24 years old and 59,457 youth ages 16 to 19 years old who left high school before earning a high school diploma; and

WHEREAS, This study outlines that in Illinois, of the 227,010 youth who left school without a high school diploma, 92,424 are White, 70,842 are Hispanic, 58,390 are Black, and 5,354 are listed as other; and

WHEREAS, The vast majority of Chicago area and downstate Illinois youth who left school without a

high school diploma come from lower income areas; and

WHEREAS, The vast majority of these youth who left school without a high school diploma see themselves as students who want to return to school and earn a high school diploma, and many of these students return to educational programs that are severely under-funded and that are not able to provide the comprehensive educational program and various support services that these students need to successfully re-enroll and earn a high school diploma; and

WHEREAS, A comprehensive system is needed for all students, those in school and those who want to return to school, but the school experience that will help out-of-school students succeed when they re-enroll must be different; people learn in different ways, one size does not fit all, and smaller schools offer a more personal, flexible, and accountable curriculum that successfully re-enrolls, teaches, and graduates these out-of-school students; and

WHEREAS, Illinois employers are experiencing a shortage of skilled workers, and these re-enrolled students could provide the needed addition to the workforce needs of the Illinois economy and Illinois businesses; and

WHEREAS, Eighty percent of prison inmates are students who left school without a high school diploma and, as such, can pose a problem, in terms of crime and public safety, to the general public in their communities and neighborhoods; and

WHEREAS, Out-of-school students without a high school diploma earn \$828,000 less over their lifetimes than people who have a high school diploma and some college education and \$410,000 less than high school graduates; and

WHEREAS, The annual cost to Illinois is over \$2.4 billion for these students who left school without a high school diploma; and

WHEREAS, The benefit to Illinois taxpayers is \$312,000 over the lifetime of a re-enrolled student who returns to school and earns a high school diploma in terms of that person paying more taxes on his or her increased earnings as well as the reduced social costs in terms of his or her utilizing welfare services, mental health services, and other dependency services and being less likely to enter prison or incur other costs related to crime; and

WHEREAS, There is significant research and program experience to draw on and use to develop successful programs to re-enroll, teach, and graduate students who left school before earning a high school diploma; and

WHEREAS, The Governor and the General Assembly created the Task Force on Re-Enrolling Students Who Dropped Out of School, which had a 2-year cycle to examine and develop an interim and final report to address this issue of students who had left school without a high school diploma; this Task Force will end on January 10, 2008; and

WHEREAS, The work of this Task Force should continue in terms of addressing the need to develop a comprehensive system for students who left school before earning a high school diploma and want to re-enroll to earn a high school diploma; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE NINETY-FIFTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that that there is created the Council on Re-enrolling Students Who Dropped Out of School in order to carry on the work of the Task Force on Re-Enrolling Students Who Dropped Out of School by continuing to examine and develop ways to address the growing issue of students who left school before earning a high school diploma; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the purpose of the Council is to examine policies, programs, and other issues related to developing a variety of successful approaches using best program practices to re-enroll, teach, and graduate students who left school before earning a high school diploma and, in doing so, improve community safety and the Illinois economy; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Council shall be composed of the following members: 8 legislators (2 of whom shall be appointed by the President of the Senate, 2 of whom shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House, 2 of whom shall be appointed by the House Minority Leader, and 2 of whom shall be appointed by the Senate Minority Leader); one representative from the Governor's Office appointed by the Governor; one representative of the State Board of Education appointed by the State Superintendent of Education; one representative of the Board of Higher Education appointed by its chairperson; one representative of the Department of Human Services appointed by the Secretary of Human Services; one representative of the Department of Children and Family Services appointed by the Director of Children and Family Services; one representative of the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity appointed by the Director of Commerce and Economic Opportunity; one representative of the Illinois Community College Board

appointed by the President of the Illinois Community College Board; 17 representatives from the public (8 of whom shall come from schools or programs working with students who had left school before earning a high school diploma) appointed by the Governor, with one of these public representatives serving as chairperson of the Council; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the duties of the Council shall include continuing a series of public hearings throughout the State to discuss the impact of students who have left school without a high school diploma on various regions of the State, continuing a review of data regarding students who have left school without a high school diploma that allows for a comparison of Illinois data both nationally and with other states in the region and across the country, continuing a review of various financing and funding mechanisms used by other states, counties, cities, foundations, and other financial funding sources, and producing and filing an annual report with recommendations to the Governor, the General Assembly, and the State Board of Education on ways and means to address the challenge of re-enrolling students who have left school without a high school diploma; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the State Board of Education shall be responsible for facilitating the Council; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a suitable copy of this resolution be delivered to the Governor, the State Superintendent of Education, the Chairperson of the Board of Higher Education, the Secretary of Human Services, the Director of Children and Family Services, the Director of Commerce and Economic Opportunity, and the President of the Illinois Community College Board.
