H.J.R. 7 -- Stephens - Holbrook - Beiser --- Resolves that the Illinois Department of Transportation study the issue of crossover barriers of all kinds for the Martin Luther King Bridge and William McKinley Bridge and make a report no later than six months after the adoption of the resolution. H.J.R. 21 -- Turner - Dunkin --- Requests that the Governor quickly and without further delay review the recommendations of the Prisoner Review Board as to petitions for Executive Clemency in each case, and grant or deny each petition consistently with his review of each recommendation. (Prison Reform Recommends BE ADOPTED)

H.J.R. 31 -- Beiser - Holbrook - Smith - Verschoore - Reitz --- Provides that the State is committed to using economic recovery plan moneys to purchase materials, goods, and services that are produced within the United States. (Labor Recommends BE ADOPTED)

H.J.R. 37 -- Lyons --- Honors the Hemophilia Foundation of Illinois for its 60 years of dedicated, outstanding service to the Illinois bleeding disorder community and once again recognizes and commemorates the month of March as Hemophilia Awareness Month in the State of Illinois.
