- H.J.R. A-5 -- Davis, William --- Creates the School Success Task Force to examine issues and make recommendations related to current State Board of Education policies regarding suspensions, expulsions, and truancies. **(CA 1) (Elementary & Secondary Education Recommends BE ADOPTED)**
- H.J.R. A-6 -- Nekritz --- Creates the School Transportation Task Force to study the possibility of enacting legislation making changes to current transportation programs offered by the Illinois State Board of Education. **(CA 1) (Elementary & Secondary Education Recommends BE ADOPTED)**
