Constitutional Amendments Second Reading

- H.J.R.C.A. 37 -- Farnham - Sente --- Proposes to amend the Finance Article of the Illinois Constitution. Limits aggregate appropriations and transfers from the State's general funds in a fiscal year to the aggregate appropriations and transfers in the previous fiscal year, as adjusted by the 5-year average annual change in per capita personal income. Allows the Governor to declare a fiscal emergency and the General Assembly, by a three-fifths vote, to exceed the limitation. Requires excess revenues to be deposited into budget stabilization funds, and allows certain excess funds to be refunded. Effective upon being declared adopted. **Short Debate (Read in Full a Second Time)**

Constitutional Amendments Second Reading

H.J.R.C.A. 50 -- Madigan - Franks --- Proposes to amend the Executive Article of the Illinois Constitution. Eliminates the office of Lieutenant Governor, beginning with the term of office otherwise commencing in 2015. Effective upon being declared adopted. (Executive RBA) **(Read in Full a Second Time)**

Constitutional Amendments Third Reading

A-H.J.R.C.A. 19 -- Lang - Ramey - Reboletti - McAuliffe - Coulson --- Proposes to amend the Bill of Rights Article of the Illinois Constitution relating to crime victim rights. Proposes that victims' rights apply in juvenile delinquency proceedings and post-judgment proceedings. Proposes that a crime victim has the right to: (1) have the defendant, any person acting on the defendant's behalf, and the attorney of record prevented from obtaining confidential information or records that could be used to locate or harass the victim or victim's family, that disclose confidential communications made in the course of medical or counseling treatment, or that are otherwise privileged or confidential by law; (2) be heard in person or in any other manner the victim chooses, upon request, at any proceeding involving a post-arrest release decision, plea, sentencing, post-conviction or post-adjudication release decision, or any proceeding in which a right of the victim is at issue; (3) receive, upon request, the pre-sentence report when available to the defendant, except for those portions made confidential by law; (4) be present, upon request, at all post-judgment proceedings; and (5) have the safety of the victim, the victim's family, and the general public considered before any parole or other post-judgment release decision is made. Proposes to define "crime victim". Effective upon being declared adopted. **(CA 1) Short Debate (Read in Full a Third Time - As Amended)**

H.J.R.C.A. 57 -- Madigan - Franks - Dunkin - Gordon, Careen - Lang --- Proposes to amend the Judiciary Article of the Illinois Constitution. Provides that a person must have been a licensed attorney-at-law for a minimum of ten years to be eligible to serve as a Circuit Judge, a minimum of twelve years to be eligible to serve as an Appellate Judge, and a minimum of fifteen years to be eligible to serve as a Supreme Court Judge, except that a person serving as a Judge on December 31, 2010 is not disqualified from completing the current term of office or seeking an additional term. Effective upon being declared adopted. **Short Debate (Read in Full a Third Time)**
