SBE Filing Activity for Political Committee(s):

The SBE averages about 3,600 active committees on file at any one time. However, we currently have over 3,900 active committees on file because of the Consolidated Election of April 7, 2009.

Type of Filing Committees:

- State Committee
- Local Committee
- State & Local Committee
- Non-Profit Organizations

Committees must file the following:

- D-1 Statement of Organization
- D-2 Pre-election Report or a Statement of Non-Participation
- D-2 Semi-annual Report
- Final Report once a committee chooses to terminate its activity
- A-1 for contributions in excess of \$500 received in the 30 day period prior to an election except General Primary and that starts on January 1st and runs through the day prior to the General Primary Election
- Raffle Application(s) must be submitted and approved before a political committee may conduct a raffle as a way of raising money for your committee.
- Raffle Report(s) must be submitted for each approved raffle.

How do committees file?

A committee must file a D-1, Statement of Organization, once it exceeds \$3,000 within a 12 month period and qualifies as a political committee. The D-1 must be filed within 10 business days unless it is in the 30 day period prior to an election and then it must be filed with 5 business days. All subsequent reports filed by committees must be filed electronically if the committee has either more than \$10,000 in receipts, expenditures or its balance exceeds \$10,000. Currently more than 70% of the committees on file file electronically. Many committees are opting to file electronically even though they are not required to. The electronic reports are available immediately once they hit the SBE servers. Only the D-1 and raffle application/report cannot be filed electronically at this time.

Committees that are not required to file electronically submit the reports to the SBE the old fashion way on paper. The SBE started scanning all paper reports and correspondence as of Jan 2[,] 2009. Therefore, all reports are available on-line as soon as they are filed.

Non-Profit must file their reports on paper and they are not available on line. It would take additional resources to accomplish this. We would have to modify CDS (internal management system of the SBE) for this to occur.

Desk Reviews:

All reports that are filed by political committees are reviewed by staff. Contact may occur between the SBE staff and the committees on file if additional information is needed to bring the committee into compliance with the Act. The staff utilizes previous reports filed by the political committee and they also cross check contributions between political committees to assure that all contributions are being reported.

On-Line Availability: www.elections.il.gov/campaigndisclosure

The SBE website is a one stop shop for all campaign disclosure information. Since we are now imaging all paper documents and with electronic reports the public has total access to all reports filed by political committees. The information is instantly available, making the disclosure system very transparent. We have printouts of the information contained on the website made available for your review.

State Procurement/Pay to Play-PA 95-0971:

The SBE is responsible for the registration of Business Entities that have a state contract(s) that in the aggregate exceeds \$50,000 annually. The Business Entities must provide a copy of the certificate of registration to the procurement officer that is handling this procedure. Also, if a business entity is bidding on a state contract(s) that exceed \$50,000 they must register as well and provide a copy of the certificate registration to the procurement officer that is handling the procedure. The SBE has implemented a paper filing option until the electronic registration is available. The statute required that the Business Entities register electronically, but the Board did not have the time or the resources to have this in place by January 1, 2009. The Legislature stepped in and passed SB 761 and the Governor signed this legislation on Wednesday, March 11th, that codified the SBE's Emergency Rules and has given the Board until August 1st to implement the electronic registration. Since the first of the year over 3,800 business entities have registered with the Board.

The SBE website also has all information needed for the Business Entity Registration. It includes the relevant statute and registration form for a Business Entity to register with the SBE. Also, included on the website is a link to CMS Procurement Bulletin as well as a link to the Governor's Executive Order Executive Order #3. We have printouts of the information contained on the website made available for your review.

Additional Thoughts:

The Board is receptive to any new initiative the Legislature proposes. If the changes proposed impacts the current filing requirements of the Campaign Disclosure Act, the Board would need additional time and money to update the aging electronic filing software (IDIS). Also, any other initiatives proposed would need to be funded as we cannot implement without proper funding.

Assessment of Civil Penalties:

- D-1 is assessed at \$25 per day for each day late
- Pre-election Report is assessed at:

1st Violation \$5000 and under \$100 per day to max of \$5000

1st Violation over \$5000, \$200 per day to max of \$5000

2nd Violation \$5000 and under \$200 per day to max of \$5000

2nd Violation over \$5000, \$400 per day to max of \$5000

3rd Violation \$5000 and under \$300 per day to max of \$5000

3rd Violation over \$5000, \$600 per day to max of \$5000

- Semi-annual Report is assessed at:
 - 1st Violation \$5000 and under \$25 per day to max of \$5000
 - 1st Violation over \$5000, \$50 per day to max of \$5000
 - 2nd Violation \$5000 and under \$50 per day to max of \$5000
 - 2nd Violation over \$5000, \$100 per day to max of \$5000
 - 3rd Violation \$5000 and under \$75 per day to max of \$5000
 - 3rd Violation over \$5000, \$200 per day to max of \$5000
- A-1 Report are assessed at the amount of the donation not timely reported, but the Board
 has the authority to reduce the amount of no less than 10% nor more than 100% of the
 total of the amounts not timely reported.
