SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

10 ILCS 5/1-12.5 new 10 ILCS 5/4-50 10 ILCS 5/5-50 10 ILCS 5/6-100

Amends the Election Code. Provides that each election authority operating in a county organized by township shall operate one grace period voter registration site within each township under the jurisdiction of the election authority. Provides that each election authority operating in a county organized by precinct shall operate one grace period voter registration site within each precinct under the jurisdiction of the election authority. Provides that the Board of Election Commissioners for the City of Chicago shall operate one grace period voter registration site within each former township located within the City of Chicago, as those townships existed immediately prior to the date those townships were eliminated within the City of Chicago.

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1 AN ACT concerning elections.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing 5 Sections 4-50, 5-50, and 6-100 and by adding Section 1-12.5 as 6 follows:

7	(10 ILCS 5/1-12.5 new)
8	Sec. 1-12.5. Grace period registration.
9	(a) Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
10	contrary, the number of grace period voter registration sites
11	that each election authority shall establish is governed only
12	by this Section. For the purpose of establishing grace period
13	voter registration sites, election authorities shall be
14	classified as follows:
15	(1) election authorities operating in counties
16	organized by township, including, but not limited to,
17	election authorities operating in Cook County, but
18	excluding the Board of Election Commissioners for the City
19	of Chicago;
20	(2) election authorities operating in counties
21	organized by precinct; and
22	(3) the Board of Election Commissioners for the City of
23	Chicago.

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1	(b) Each election authority classified under paragraph (1)
2	of subsection (a) of this Section shall operate one grace
3	period voter registration site within each township under the
4	jurisdiction of the election authority. Each election
5	authority classified under paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of
6	this Section shall operate one grace period voter registration
7	site within each precinct under the jurisdiction of the
8	election authority. The Board of Election Commissioners for the
9	City of Chicago shall operate one grace period voter
10	registration site within each former township located within
11	the City of Chicago, as those townships existed immediately
12	prior to the date those townships were eliminated within the
13	City of Chicago. In the case of a township, precinct, or former
14	township that contains the office of the election authority,
15	the office of the election authority shall serve as the grace
16	period voter registration site for that township, precinct, or
17	former township.

19 Sec. 4-50. Grace period. Notwithstanding any other 20 provision of this Code to the contrary, each election authority 21 shall establish procedures for the registration of voters and 22 for change of address during the period from the close of 23 registration for an election until and including the day of the 24 election. During this grace period, an unregistered qualified 25 elector may register to vote, and a registered voter may submit - 3 - LRB100 00067 HLH 10071 b

a change of address form, in person in the office of the 1 2 election authority, at a permanent polling place established under Section 19A-10, at any other early voting site beginning 3 15 days prior to the election, at a polling place on election 4 5 day, or at a voter registration location specifically designated for this purpose by the election authority as 6 7 provided in Section 1-12.5. The election authority shall register that individual, or change a registered voter's 8 9 address, in the same manner as otherwise provided by this 10 Article for registration and change of address.

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11 If a voter who registers or changes address during this 12 grace period wishes to vote at the election or primary 13 occurring during the grace period, he or she must do so by 14 grace period voting. The election authority shall offer 15 in-person grace period voting at the authority's office, any 16 permanent polling place established under Section 19A-10, and 17 at any other early voting site beginning 15 days prior to the election, at a polling place on election day, where grace 18 period registration is required by this Section; and may offer 19 20 in-person grace period voting at additional hours and locations 21 specifically designated for the purpose of grace period voting 22 by the election authority. The election authority may allow 23 grace period voting by mail only if the election authority has no ballots prepared at the authority's office. Grace period 24 25 voting shall be in a manner substantially similar to voting under Article 19A. 26

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Within one day after a voter casts a grace period ballot, 1 2 or within one day after the ballot is received by the election authority if the election authority allows grace period voting 3 by mail, the election authority shall transmit by electronic 4 5 means pursuant to a process established by the State Board of Elections the voter's name, street address, e-mail address, and 6 7 precinct, ward, township, and district numbers, as the case may 8 be, to the State Board of Elections, which shall maintain those 9 names and that information in an electronic format on its 10 website, arranged by county and accessible to State and local 11 political committees. The name of each person issued a grace 12 period ballot shall also be placed on the appropriate precinct 13 list of persons to whom vote by mail and early ballots have 14 been issued, for use as provided in Sections 17-9 and 18-5.

15 A person who casts a grace period ballot shall not be 16 permitted to revoke that ballot and vote another ballot with 17 respect to that primary or election. Ballots cast by persons who register or change address during the grace period at a 18 19 location other than their designated polling place on election 20 day must be transmitted to and counted at the election authority's central ballot counting location and shall not be 21 22 transmitted to and counted at precinct polling places. The 23 grace period ballots determined to be valid shall be added to the vote totals for the precincts for which they were cast in 24 25 the order in which the ballots were opened.

In counties with a population of less than 100,000 that do

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not have electronic poll books, the election authority may opt 1 2 out of registration in the polling place if the election authority establishes grace period registration and voting at 3 other sites on election day at the following sites: (i) the 4 5 election authority's main office and (ii) a polling place in each municipality where 20% or more of the county's residents 6 7 reside if the election authority's main office is not located in that municipality. The election authority may establish 8 9 other grace period registration and voting sites on election day provided that the election authority has met the notice 10 11 requirements of Section 19A-25 for permanent and temporary 12 early voting sites.

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16 5-50. Grace period. Notwithstanding any other Sec. provision of this Code to the contrary, each election authority 17 shall establish procedures for the registration of voters and 18 for change of address during the period from the close of 19 registration for an election until and including the day of the 20 21 election. During this grace period, an unregistered qualified 22 elector may register to vote, and a registered voter may submit a change of address form, in person in the office of the 23 24 election authority, at a permanent polling place established 25 under Section 19A 10, at any other early voting site beginning

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1 15 days prior to the election, at a polling place on election 2 day, or at a voter registration location specifically 3 designated for this purpose by the election authority <u>as</u> 4 <u>provided in Section 1-12.5</u>. The election authority shall 5 register that individual, or change a registered voter's 6 address, in the same manner as otherwise provided by this 7 Article for registration and change of address.

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8 If a voter who registers or changes address during this 9 grace period wishes to vote at the election or primary 10 occurring during the grace period, he or she must do so by 11 grace period voting. The election authority shall offer 12 in-person grace period voting at his or her office, any 13 permanent polling place established under Section 19A-10, and 14 at any other early voting site beginning 15 days prior to the 15 election, at a polling place on election day, where grace 16 period registration is required by this Section; and may offer 17 in-person grace period voting at additional hours and locations specifically designated for the purpose of grace period voting 18 by the election authority. The election authority may allow 19 20 grace period voting by mail only if the election authority has no ballots prepared at the authority's office. Grace period 21 22 voting shall be in a manner substantially similar to voting 23 under Article 19A.

The name of each person issued a grace 9 period ballot shall also be placed on the appropriate precinct 10 list of persons to whom vote by mail and early ballots have 11 been issued, for use as provided in Sections 17-9 and 18-5.

12 A person who casts a grace period ballot shall not be permitted to revoke that ballot and vote another ballot with 13 14 respect to that primary or election. Ballots cast by persons 15 who register or change address during the grace period at a 16 location other than their designated polling place on election 17 day must be transmitted to and counted at the election authority's central ballot counting location and shall not be 18 transmitted to and counted at precinct polling places. The 19 grace period ballots determined to be valid shall be added to 20 21 the vote totals for the precincts for which they were cast in 22 the order in which the ballots were opened.

In counties with a population of less than 100,000 that do not have electronic poll books, the election authority may opt out of registration in the polling place if the election authority establishes grace period registration and voting at

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other sites on election day at the following sites: (i) the 1 2 election authority's main office and (ii) a polling place in each municipality where 20% or more of the county's residents 3 reside if the election authority's main office is not located 4 5 in that municipality. The election authority may establish other grace period registration and voting sites on election 6 day provided that the election authority has met the notice 7 requirements of Section 19A-25 for permanent and temporary 8 9 early voting sites.

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13 Sec. 6-100. Grace period. Notwithstanding any other 14 provision of this Code to the contrary, each election authority 15 shall establish procedures for the registration of voters and 16 for change of address during the period from the close of registration for an election until and including the day of the 17 election. During this grace period, an unregistered qualified 18 19 elector may register to vote, and a registered voter may submit 20 a change of address form, in person in the office of the 21 election authority, at a permanent polling place established 22 under Section 19A-10, at any other early voting site beginning 15 days prior to the election, at a polling place on election 23 24 day, or at a voter registration location specifically 25 designated for this purpose by the election authority as provided in Section 1-12.5. The election authority shall register that individual, or change a registered voter's address, in the same manner as otherwise provided by this Article for registration and change of address.

5 If a voter who registers or changes address during this grace period wishes to vote at the election or primary 6 7 occurring during the grace period. The election authority shall 8 offer in-person grace period voting at the authority's office, 9 any permanent polling place established under Section 19A-10, 10 and at any other early voting site beginning 15 days prior to 11 the election, at a polling place on election day, where grace 12 period registration is required by this Section; and may offer 13 in-person grace period voting at additional hours and locations specifically designated for the purpose of grace period voting 14 by the election authority. The election authority may allow 15 16 grace period voting by mail only if the election authority has 17 no ballots prepared at the authority's office. Grace period voting shall be in a manner substantially similar to voting 18 under Article 19A. 19

20 Within one day after a voter casts a grace period ballot, 21 or within one day after the ballot is received by the election 22 authority if the election authority allows grace period voting 23 by mail, the election authority shall transmit by electronic 24 means pursuant to a process established by the State Board of 25 Elections the voter's name, street address, e-mail address, and 26 precinct, ward, township, and district numbers, as the case may

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be, to the State Board of Elections, which shall maintain those names and that information in an electronic format on its website, arranged by county and accessible to State and local political committees. The name of each person issued a grace period ballot shall also be placed on the appropriate precinct list of persons to whom vote by mail and early ballots have been issued, for use as provided in Sections 17-9 and 18-5.

8 A person who casts a grace period ballot shall not be 9 permitted to revoke that ballot and vote another ballot with 10 respect to that primary or election. Ballots cast by persons 11 who register or change address during the grace period at a 12 location other than their designated polling place on election 13 day must be transmitted to and counted at the election authority's central ballot counting location and shall not be 14 15 transmitted to and counted at precinct polling places. The 16 grace period ballots determined to be valid shall be added to 17 the vote totals for the precincts for which they were cast in the order in which the ballots were opened. 18

19 In counties with a population of less than 100,000 that do 20 not have electronic poll books, the election authority may opt out of registration in the polling place if the election 21 22 authority establishes grace period registration and voting at 23 other sites on election day at the following sites: (i) the election authority's main office and (ii) a polling place in 24 each municipality where 20% or more of the county's residents 25 reside if the election authority's main office is not located 26

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in that municipality. The election authority may establish other grace period registration and voting sites on election day provided that the election authority has met the notice requirements of Section 19A-25 for permanent and temporary early voting sites.
