1 AN ACT concerning education.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The School Code is amended by changing Section
21B-45 as follows:

6 (105 ILCS 5/21B-45)

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Sec. 21B-45. Professional Educator License renewal.

8 (a) Individuals holding a Professional Educator License 9 are required to complete the licensure renewal requirements as 10 specified in this Section, unless otherwise provided in this 11 Code.

12 Individuals holding a Professional Educator License shall 13 meet the renewal requirements set forth in this Section, unless 14 otherwise provided in this Code. If an individual holds a 15 license endorsed in more than one area that has different 16 renewal requirements, that individual shall follow the renewal 17 requirements for the position for which he or she spends the 18 majority of his or her time working.

(b) All Professional Educator Licenses not renewed as provided in this Section shall lapse on September 1 of that year. <u>Notwithstanding any other provisions of this Section, if</u> a license holder's electronic mail address is available, the State Board of Education shall send him or her notification HB0655 Engrossed - 2 - LRB100 08123 NHT 18217 b

electronically that his or her license will lapse if not 1 2 renewed, to be sent no more than 6 months prior to the license 3 lapsing. Lapsed licenses may be immediately reinstated upon (i) payment by the applicant of a \$500 penalty to the State Board 4 5 of Education or (ii) the demonstration of proficiency by completing 9 semester hours of coursework from a regionally 6 7 accredited institution of higher education in the content area 8 that most aligns with one or more of the educator's endorsement 9 areas. Any and all back fees, including without limitation 10 registration fees owed from the time of expiration of the 11 license until the date of reinstatement, shall be paid and kept 12 in accordance with the provisions in Article 3 of this Code 13 concerning an institute fund and the provisions in Article 21B of this Code concerning fees and requirements for registration. 14 15 Licenses not registered in accordance with Section 21B-40 of 16 this Code shall lapse after a period of 6 months from the 17 expiration of the last year of registration. An unregistered license is invalid after September 1 for employment and 18 performance of services in an Illinois public or State-operated 19 20 school or cooperative and in a charter school. Any license or endorsement may be voluntarily surrendered by the license 21 22 holder. A voluntarily surrendered license, except a substitute 23 teaching license issued under Section 21B-20 of this Code, shall be treated as a revoked license. An Educator License with 24 25 Stipulations with only a paraprofessional endorsement does not 26 lapse.

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(c) From July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2014, in order to 1 2 satisfy the requirements for licensure renewal provided for in this Section, each professional educator licensee with an 3 administrative endorsement who is working in a 4 position 5 requiring such endorsement shall complete one Illinois Administrators' Academy course, as described in Article 2 of 6 7 this Code, per fiscal year.

(d) Beginning July 1, 2014, in order to satisfy the 8 9 requirements for licensure renewal provided for in this 10 Section, each professional educator licensee may create a 11 professional development plan each year. The plan shall address 12 one or more of the endorsements that are required of his or her 13 educator position if the licensee is employed and performing 14 services in an Illinois public or State-operated school or 15 cooperative. If the licensee is employed in a charter school, 16 the plan shall address that endorsement or those endorsements 17 most closely related to his or her educator position. Licensees employed and performing services in any other Illinois schools 18 19 may participate in the renewal requirements by adhering to the 20 same process.

Except as otherwise provided in this Section, the licensee's professional development activities shall align with one or more of the following criteria:

(1) activities are of a type that engage participants
over a sustained period of time allowing for analysis,
discovery, and application as they relate to student

learning, social or emotional achievement, or well-being;
(2) professional development aligns to the licensee's
performance;
(3) outcomes for the activities must relate to student

5 growth or district improvement;

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(4) activities align to State-approved standards; and

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(5) higher education coursework.

8 (e) For each renewal cycle, each professional educator 9 licensee shall engage in professional development activities. 10 Prior to renewal, the licensee shall enter electronically into 11 the Educator Licensure Information System (ELIS) the name, 12 date, and location of the activity, the number of professional development hours, and the provider's name. The following 13 provisions shall apply concerning professional development 14 15 activities:

16 (1) Each licensee shall complete a total of 120 hours
17 of professional development per 5-year renewal cycle in
18 order to renew the license, except as otherwise provided in
19 this Section.

(2) Beginning with his or her first full 5-year cycle,
any licensee with an administrative endorsement who is not
working in a position requiring such endorsement shall
complete one Illinois Administrators' Academy course, as
described in Article 2 of this Code, in each 5-year renewal
cycle in which the administrative endorsement was held for
at least one year. The Illinois Administrators' Academy

course may count toward the total of 120 hours per 5-year
 cycle.

(3) Any licensee with an administrative endorsement 3 who is working in a position requiring such endorsement or 4 5 an individual with a Teacher Leader endorsement serving in an administrative capacity at least 50% of the day shall 6 complete one Illinois Administrators' Academy course, as 7 described in Article 2 of this Code, each fiscal year in 8 9 addition to 100 hours of professional development per 10 5-year renewal cycle in accordance with this Code.

11 (4) Any licensee holding a current National Board for 12 Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) master teacher 13 designation shall complete a total of 60 hours of 14 professional development per 5-year renewal cycle in order 15 to renew the license.

16 (5) Licensees working in a position that does not 17 require educator licensure or working in a position for 18 less than 50% for any particular year are considered to be 19 exempt and shall be required to pay only the registration 20 fee in order to renew and maintain the validity of the 21 license.

(6) Licensees who are retired and qualify for benefits
from a State retirement system shall notify the State Board
of Education using ELIS, and the license shall be
maintained in retired status. An individual with a license
in retired status shall not be required to complete

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1 professional development activities or pay registration 2 fees until returning to a position that requires educator 3 licensure. Upon returning to work in a position that 4 requires the Professional Educator License, the licensee 5 shall immediately pay a registration fee and complete 6 renewal requirements for that year. A license in retired 7 status cannot lapse.

8 (7) For any renewal cycle in which professional 9 development hours were required, but not fulfilled, the 10 licensee shall complete any missed hours to total the 11 minimum professional development hours required in this 12 Section prior to September 1 of that year. For any fiscal 13 year or renewal cycle in which an Illinois Administrators' 14 Academy course was required but not completed, the licensee 15 shall complete any missed Illinois Administrators' Academy 16 courses prior to September 1 of that year. The licensee may 17 complete all deficient hours and Illinois Administrators' Academy courses while continuing to work in a position that 18 19 requires that license until September 1 of that year.

(8) Any licensee who has not fulfilled the professional
development renewal requirements set forth in this Section
at the end of any 5-year renewal cycle is ineligible to
register his or her license and may submit an appeal to the
State Superintendent of Education for reinstatement of the
license.

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(9) If professional development opportunities were

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1 unavailable to a licensee, proof that opportunities were 2 unavailable and request for an extension of time beyond 3 August 31 to complete the renewal requirements may be 4 submitted from April 1 through June 30 of that year to the 5 State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board. If an 6 extension is approved, the license shall remain valid 7 during the extension period.

8 (10) Individuals who hold exempt licenses prior to 9 December 27, 2013 (the effective date of Public Act 98-610) 10 shall commence the annual renewal process with the first 11 scheduled registration due after December 27, 2013 (the 12 effective date of Public Act 98-610).

this 13 (11) Notwithstanding any other provision of 14 subsection (e), if a licensee earns more than the required 15 number of professional development hours during a renewal 16 cycle, then the licensee may carry over any hours earned 17 from April 1 through June 30 of the last year of the renewal cycle. Any hours carried over in this manner must 18 19 applied the next renewal cycle. Illinois be to 20 Administrators' Academy courses or hours earned in those 21 courses may not be carried over.

(f) At the time of renewal, each licensee shall respond to the required questions under penalty of perjury.

(g) The following entities shall be designated as approved
 to provide professional development activities for the renewal
 of Professional Educator Licenses:

(5) Illinois public school districts, charter schools
authorized under Article 27A of this Code, and joint
educational programs authorized under Article 10 of this
Code for the purposes of providing career and technical
education or special education services.

25 (6) A not-for-profit organization that, as of December
26 31, 2014 (the effective date of Public Act 98-1147), has

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had or has a grant from or a contract with the State Board
 of Education to provide professional development services
 in the area of English Learning to Illinois school
 districts, teachers, or administrators.

5 (7) State agencies, State boards, and State 6 commissions.

7 (8) Museums as defined in Section 10 of the Museum
8 Disposition of Property Act.

9 (h) Approved providers under subsection (g) of this Section 10 shall make available professional development opportunities 11 that satisfy at least one of the following:

12 (1) increase the knowledge and skills of school and 13 district leaders who guide continuous professional 14 development;

(2) improve the learning of students;

(3) organize adults into learning communities whose
goals are aligned with those of the school and district;

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(4) deepen educator's content knowledge;

19 (5) provide educators with research-based 20 instructional strategies to assist students in meeting 21 rigorous academic standards;

(6) prepare educators to appropriately use various
types of classroom assessments;

24 (7) use learning strategies appropriate to the25 intended goals;

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(8) provide educators with the knowledge and skills to

1 collaborate; or

2 (9) prepare educators to apply research to3 decision-making.

4 (i) Approved providers under subsection (g) of this Section5 shall do the following:

6 (1) align professional development activities to the 7 State-approved national standards for professional 8 learning;

9 (2) meet the professional development criteria for
10 Illinois licensure renewal;

(3) produce a rationale for the activity that explains how it aligns to State standards and identify the assessment for determining the expected impact on student learning or school improvement;

15 (4) maintain original documentation for completion of 16 activities; and

17 (5) provide license holders with evidence of18 completion of activities.

(j) The State Board of Education shall conduct annual audits of approved providers, except for school districts, which shall be audited by regional offices of education and intermediate service centers. The State Board of Education shall complete random audits of licensees.

(1) Approved providers shall annually submit to the
 State Board of Education a list of subcontractors used for
 delivery of professional development activities for which

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renewal credit was issued and other information as defined
 by rule.

3 (2) Approved providers shall annually submit data to 4 the State Board of Education demonstrating how the 5 professional development activities impacted one or more 6 of the following:

7 (A) educator and student growth in regards to
8 content knowledge or skills, or both;

9 (B) educator and student social and emotional 10 growth; or

11 (C) alignment to district or school improvement12 plans.

(3) The State Superintendent of Education shall review the annual data collected by the State Board of Education, regional offices of education, and intermediate service centers in audits to determine if the approved provider has met the criteria and should continue to be an approved provider or if further action should be taken as provided in rules.

20 (k) Registration fees shall be paid for the next renewal cycle between April 1 and June 30 in the last year of each 21 22 5-year renewal cycle using ELIS. If all required professional 23 development hours for the renewal cycle have been completed and 24 entered by the licensee, the licensee shall pav the 25 registration fees for the next cycle using a form of credit or 26 debit card.

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(1) Beginning July 1, 2014, any professional educator 1 2 licensee endorsed for school support personnel who is employed and performing services in Illinois public schools and who 3 holds an active and current professional license issued by the 4 5 Department of Financial and Professional Regulation related to the endorsement areas on the Professional Educator License 6 7 shall be deemed to have satisfied the continuing professional 8 development requirements provided for in this Section. Such 9 individuals shall be required to pay only registration fees to 10 renew the Professional Educator License. An individual who does 11 not hold a license issued by the Department of Financial and 12 Professional Regulation shall complete professional 13 development requirements for the renewal of a Professional 14 Educator License provided for in this Section.

(m) Appeals to the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board must be made within 30 days after receipt of notice from the State Superintendent of Education that a license will not be renewed based upon failure to complete the requirements of this Section. A licensee may appeal that decision to the State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board in a manner prescribed by rule.

(1) Each appeal shall state the reasons why the State
Superintendent's decision should be reversed and shall be
sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the
State Board of Education.

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(2) The State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board

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shall review each appeal regarding renewal of a license within 90 days after receiving the appeal in order to determine whether the licensee has met the requirements of this Section. The State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board may hold an appeal hearing or may make its determination based upon the record of review, which shall consist of the following:

8 (A) the regional superintendent of education's 9 rationale for recommending nonrenewal of the license, 10 if applicable;

(B) any evidence submitted to the State Superintendent along with the individual's electronic statement of assurance for renewal; and

14 (C) the State Superintendent's rationale for15 nonrenewal of the license.

(3) The State Educator Preparation and Licensure Board
shall notify the licensee of its decision regarding license
renewal by certified mail, return receipt requested, no
later than 30 days after reaching a decision. Upon receipt
of notification of renewal, the licensee, using ELIS, shall
pay the applicable registration fee for the next cycle
using a form of credit or debit card.

(n) The State Board of Education may adopt rules as may benecessary to implement this Section.
