SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

620 ILCS 35/10

from Ch. 15 1/2, par. 760

Amends the Permanent Noise Monitoring Act. Provides that on or before June 30, 2018 each airport shall upgrade its permanent noise monitoring system to be capable of producing the data necessary to meet the requirements of Public Act 99-202. Provides that on June 30, 2018 and thereafter an airport's permanent noise monitoring report and noise contour maps shall be produced using the criteria under Public Act 99-202. Effective immediately.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning transportation.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,**
3 **represented in the General Assembly:**

4 Section 5. The Permanent Noise Monitoring Act is amended by
5 changing Section 10 as follows:

6 (620 ILCS 35/10) (from Ch. 15 1/2, par. 760)

7 Sec. 10. Establishment of permanent noise monitoring
8 systems.

9 (a) No later than December 31, 2008, each airport shall
10 have an operable permanent noise monitoring system. The system
11 shall be operated by the airport sponsor. The airport sponsor
12 shall be responsible for the construction or the design and
13 construction of any system not constructed or designed and
14 constructed as of the effective date of this amendatory Act of
15 the 96th General Assembly. The cost of the systems and of the
16 permanent noise monitoring reports under Section 15 of this Act
17 shall be borne by the airport sponsor.

18 (b) On or before June 30, 2018 each airport shall upgrade
19 its permanent noise monitoring system to be capable of
20 producing the data necessary to meet the requirements of this
21 Act enacted in Public Act 99-202. On June 30, 2018 and
22 thereafter an airport's permanent noise monitoring report and
23 noise contour maps shall be produced using the criteria in this

1 Act enacted in Public Act 99-202.
