

## 100TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2017 and 2018 HB3830

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 415/8b.21 new

Amends the Personnel Code. Provides that State agencies, when hiring for full-time, temporary positions with an expected tenure of 12 to 24 months for the position, shall give preference to a qualified applicant who is from a low-income household or has been unemployed for 6 months or more. Provides that State agencies, when hiring for internships, student assistant positions, and summer positions, shall give preference to a qualified applicant who resides in a low-income household, is up to 21 years old, and is currently attending high school.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Personnel Code is amended by adding Section 8b.21 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 415/8b.21 new)
- Sec. 8b.21. Preference for low-income households and the long-term unemployed.
- 9 (a) State agencies, when hiring for full-time, temporary positions with an expected tenure of 12 to 24 months for the 10 position, shall give preference to a qualified applicant who is 11 12 from a low-income household or has been unemployed for 6 months or more. Any application for these full-time, temporary 13 14 positions with a State agency shall allow the applicant to identify that the applicant is eligible for a preference under 15 this Section, but the application shall not require the 16 17 applicant to identify the specific category that entitles him or her for eligibility. 18
  - (b) State agencies, when hiring for internships, student assistant positions, and summer positions shall give preference to a qualified applicant who resides in a low-income household. The preference shall be granted to applicants who are up to 21 years of age and currently attending high school.
