

## 100TH GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2017 and 2018 HB4121

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

20 ILCS 2805/37

Amends the Department of Veterans' Affairs Act. Makes changes to the composition of the Illinois Joining Forces Foundation Board. Provides that the Department of Veterans' Affairs, in consultation with the Department of Military Affairs, may propose (rather than adopt) other rules deemed necessary to govern Foundation procedures. Provides that the Foundation must provide notice (rather than written notice) to any entity providing a gift, grant, donation, or beguest to the Foundation that the Foundation is not subject to the provisions of the Public Funds Investment Act. Provides that if the Foundation's funds exceed \$1,000,000 in any year (currently, there is no threshold amount), then it shall be subject to specified audits under the Illinois State Auditing Act. Provides that if the Foundation is funded below \$1,000,000 annually, then the Foundation shall be exempt from the Illinois State Auditing Act. Provides that the Illinois Joining Forces Foundation shall be exempt from the Open Meetings Act so long as the Foundation does not receive funds from the State of Illinois. Provides that if the Foundation receive grants or funds from the State, then compliance with the Open Meetings Act shall be compulsory. Deletes provisions providing that the Foundation is not eligible for any grant administered or funded by the Department of Veterans' Affairs or the Department of Military Affairs. Makes other changes. Effective immediately.

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Department of Veterans' Affairs Act is amended by changing Section 37 as follows:
- 6 (20 ILCS 2805/37)
- 7 Sec. 37. Illinois Joining Forces Foundation.
- 8 (a) The General Assembly finds that navigating the "sea of 9 goodwill" for those who serve in uniform is one of the greatest challenges that transitioning veterans face; as a result, they 10 risk being unable to access many of the federal, State, and 11 12 non-profit resources available to them. Recognizing this problem, the Department of Veterans' Affairs and the Department 13 14 of Military Affairs acted to establish the Illinois Joining Forces initiative, a public-private network of military and 15 16 veteran-serving organizations that are working together, in 17 person and online, to create a no-wrong-door system of support for the State's military and veteran communities. Illinois 18 19 Joining Forces is a nation-leading model, awarded by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs and the National Association of 20 21 State Directors of Veterans Affairs for its groundbreaking work 22 in creating smarter, collaborative community support for those in uniform, past and present. The foundation created by Public 2.3

- 2 will serve to ensure the long-term sustainability of Illinois
- 3 Joining Forces, which is critically important for the support
- 4 of the State's military and veteran communities.
- 5 (b) The Illinois Joining Forces Foundation shall benefit 6 service members, veterans, and their families by:
  - (1) convening military and veteran support organizations, through Illinois Joining Forces working groups, to build cross-sector relationships and mutual awareness;
  - (2) providing policy recommendations through Illinois

    Joining Forces member working groups to the Illinois

    Veterans' Advisory Council;
  - (3) facilitating the transfer of information and knowledge among Illinois Joining Forces member organizations;
  - (4) maintaining and continuing to build the no-wrong-door online navigation platform;
  - (5) educating Illinois Joining Forces members and other community providers regarding military and veteran culture and needs, thus improving the collective capacity of the support system; and
  - (6) outreaching directly to service members, veterans, and their families regarding the no-wrong-door system that Illinois Joining Forces provides to them.
  - (c) For the purpose of this Section, "veterans service

- organization" means an organization that meets all of the following criteria:
  - (1) The organization is formed by and for United States military veterans.
    - (2) The organization is chartered by the United States Congress and incorporated in the State of Illinois.
    - (3) The organization has maintained a State headquarters office in Illinois for the 10-year period immediately preceding <u>August 18, 2014</u> (the effective date of <u>Public Act 98-986</u>) this amendatory Act of the 98th General Assembly.
    - (4) The organization maintains at least one office in this State, staffed by a veterans service officer.
    - (5) The organization is capable of preparing a power of attorney for a veteran and processing claims for veterans services.
    - (6) The organization is not funded by the State of Illinois or by any county in this State.
  - (d) The General Assembly authorizes the Department of Veterans' Affairs, in accordance with Section 10 of the State Agency Entity Creation Act, to create the Illinois Joining Forces Foundation as a not-for-profit foundation. The Department shall file articles of incorporation as required under the General Not For Profit Corporation Act of 1986 to create the Foundation. The Foundation's Board shall be organized in accordance with the bylaws of the Foundation. The

1	Foundation bylaws shall, at a minimum, specify of Directors
2	nominated shall be appointed as follows:
3	(1) one member <u>nominated</u> appointed by the Governor;
4	(2) one member <u>nominated</u> appointed by the President of
5	the Senate;
6	(3) one member <u>nominated</u> appointed by the Minority
7	Leader of the Senate;
8	(4) one member <u>nominated</u> appointed by the Speaker of
9	the House of Representatives;
10	(5) one member <u>nominated</u> appointed by the Minority
11	Leader of the House of Representatives;
12	(6) the Director of Veterans' Affairs;
13	(7) the Director of Military Affairs or his or her
14	designee who is a senior management official of the
15	Department of Military Affairs with the authority to make
16	decisions on behalf of the Department of Military Affairs;
17	(8) seven members nominated by the Illinois Joining
18	Forces working groups; and
19	(9) seven members nominated by the Illinois Joining
20	Forces Funders Committee. all of the members of the
21	Illinois Joining Forces Executive Committee, who shall be
22	appointed by the Director of Veterans' Affairs.
23	In addition to any veterans service organization otherwise
24	represented on the Board of Directors, a veterans service
25	organization may designate in writing an ex officio, non-voting
26	participant to the Board of Directors. Any veterans service

organization appointee under this Section does not count towards a quorum. The Director of Veterans' Affairs and a designee chosen by the Director of Military Affairs who is a senior management official of the Department of Military Affairs with the authority to make decisions on behalf of the agency shall serve as members of the Foundation's Board of Directors. Board of Director appointments shall be for 2-year terms. Vacancies shall be filled by the official who made the recommendation for the vacated appointment. No member of the Board of Directors may receive compensation for his or her services to the Foundation. Upon appointment, the Board of Directors, as members of a public entity, shall be represented and indemnified pursuant to the requirements of the State Employee Indemnification Act.

(e) The purposes of the Foundation are to: promote, support, assist, and sustain Illinois Joining Forces operations; solicit and accept grants and private donations and disburse them for the stated intent of the Foundation or the private donor; solicit and generate public and private funding and donations that assist in enhancing the Illinois Joining Forces mission, services, programs, and operations; and engage generally in other lawful endeavors consistent with the foregoing purposes. The foundation shall operate within the provisions of the General Not For Profit Corporation Act of 1986.

Employees or specified agents of the Illinois Joining

- 1 Forces Foundation shall be represented and indemnified
- 2 pursuant to the requirements of the State Employee
- 3 <u>Indemnification Act.</u>
- (f) As soon as practicable after the Foundation is created, the Board of Directors shall meet, organize, and designate, by majority vote, a chairperson, a treasurer, a secretary, and any additional officers that may be needed to carry out the
- 8 activities of the Foundation and shall adopt bylaws of the
- 9 Foundation.
- 10 <u>(g)</u> The Department of Veterans' Affairs, in consultation
- 11 with the Department of Military Affairs, may propose adopt
- other rules deemed necessary to govern Foundation procedures.
- 13 (h) (g) The Foundation may request and accept gifts,
- 14 grants, donations, or bequests from the federal government or
- 15 its agencies or officers or from any person, firm, or
- 16 corporation, and may expend receipts on activities that it
- 17 considers suitable to the performance of its duties under this
- 18 Section and consistent with any requirement of the grant, gift,
- 19 donation, or bequest.
- 20 Funds collected by the Foundation shall be considered
- 21 private funds and shall be held in an appropriate account
- 22 outside of the State treasury.
- 23 Private funds collected by the Foundation are not subject
- 24 to the Public Funds Investment Act.
- 25 The Foundation must provide notice to any entity providing
- 26 a gift, grant, donation, or bequest to the Foundation that the

- Foundation is not subject to the provisions of the Public Funds

  Investment Act, which Act places limitations on the types of

  securities in which a public agency may invest public funds.
  - (i) The treasurer of the Foundation shall be the custodian of all Foundation funds and . The treasurer shall be required to obtain a fidelity or surety bond on satisfactory terms and in sufficient amounts to protect the interests of the Foundation, the cost of which shall be reimbursed by the Foundation.
  - (j) The Foundation and its officers shall be responsible for the approval of the recording of receipts, approval of payments, and the proper filing of required reports.
  - (k) The Foundation may be assisted in carrying out its functions by Department of Military Affairs and Department of Veterans' Affairs personnel. The Department of Military Affairs and the Department of Veterans' Affairs shall provide reasonable assistance to the Foundation to achieve the purposes of the Foundation as determined by the respective Directors.
  - (1) The Foundation shall cooperate fully with the boards, commissions, agencies, departments, and institutions of the State.
  - (m) If The funds held and made available by the Illinois Joining Forces Foundation Foundation's funds exceed \$1,000,000 in any year, then the Foundation shall be subject to financial and compliance audits in accordance with the Illinois State Auditing Act. If the Illinois Joining Forces Foundation is

- 2 exempt from the Illinois State Auditing Act.
- 3 (n) The Illinois Joining Forces Foundation shall be exempt
- 4 from the Open Meetings Act so long as the Foundation does not
- 5 receive funds from the State of Illinois. If the Illinois
- 6 Joining Forces Foundation receives grants or funds from the
- 7 State of Illinois, then compliance with the Open Meetings Act
- 8 shall be compulsory.
- 9 (o) The Foundation shall not have any power of eminent
- 10 domain.
- 11 (p) The Foundation shall not construct or make any
- 12 permanent improvements to any real property.
- (h) The Foundation must provide a written notice to any
- 14 entity providing a gift, grant, donation, or bequest to the
- 15 Foundation that the Foundation is not subject to the provisions
- 16 of the Public Funds Investment Act, which Act places
- 17 limitations on the types of securities in which a public agency
- 18 may invest public funds.
- (i) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the Foundation
- 20 is not eligible for any grant administered or funded by the
- 21 Department of Veterans' Affairs or the Department of Military
- 22 Affairs.
