## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

5 ILCS 420/4A-109 new

Amends the Illinois Governmental Ethics Act. Provides that in lieu of filing a statement of economic interests, members of the General Assembly and executive branch constitutional officers may enter into a blind trust. Provides that any elected official choosing to set up a blind trust shall submit documentation to the Secretary of State attesting to the creation of a blind trust on his or her behalf, and confirming his or her intent to do so in lieu of filing a statement of economic interests. Defines "blind trust".

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Illinois Governmental Ethics Act is amended by adding Section 4A-109 as follows:
- 6 (5 ILCS 420/4A-109 new)
- 7 Sec. 4A-109. Blind trust.
- 8 (a) In lieu of filing a statement of economic interests as
  9 required under this Article, members of the General Assembly
  10 and executive branch constitutional officers may enter into a

- (c) For the purposes of this Section, "blind trust" means a
- trust in which the trustee has full discretion over the assets,
- 20 and the trust beneficiary has no knowledge of the holdings of
- 21 the trust, and is prohibited from communicating with the
- 22 <u>trustee on investment and other business matters.</u>
