HOUSE RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois House of Representatives wish to recognize the City of Watseka on the occasion of the 150th anniversary of its founding; and

WHEREAS, Watseka was founded in 1867 and is located in north central Illinois, 24 miles from the border between Illinois and Indiana; and

WHEREAS, Watseka is the county seat of Iroquois County which is composed of 26 townships; and

WHEREAS, The name Watseka derives from the Potawatomi name "Watch-e-kee", "Daughter of the Evening Star", who was the wife of early eastern Illinois settler, Gurdon Saltonstall Hubbard; and

WHEREAS, The Old Iroquois County Courthouse was constructed in 1866, with two additions built in 1881 and 1927; in the early 1960s, an Iroquois County resident, Katherine Clifton, bequeathed to the county in her will a large sum of money and a site upon which to build a new courthouse which is the only courthouse in the United States built entirely with private funds; and

WHEREAS, The Old Iroquois County Courthouse was advertised for sale and fell into disuse by 1967; during the Centennial Celebration of Watseka, the Iroquois County Historical Society was organized and circulated petitions throughout the county not to sell the old courthouse; the petitions were approved by the County Board of Supervisors and the old courthouse re-opened as a museum in 1975; that same year, the old courthouse was listed on the National Register of Historic Places; therefore, be it

RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we recognize the City of Watseka on the 150th anniversary of its founding and we wish it many more wonderful years; and be it further
