## 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Department of Professional Regulation Law of
the Civil Administrative Code of Illinois is amended by adding
Section 2105-20 as follows:

7 (20 ILCS 2105/2105-20 new)

Sec. 2105-20. Criminal history records checks. Licensees 8 9 or applicants applying for expedited licensure through an 10 interstate compact enacted into law by the General Assembly, including, but not limited to, the Interstate Medical Licensure 11 12 Compact Act, who have designated Illinois as the principal state of licensure for the purposes of the compact shall have 13 14 his or her fingerprints submitted to the Department of State Police in an electronic format that complies with the form and 15 16 manner for requesting and furnishing criminal history record 17 information as prescribed by the Department of State Police. These fingerprints shall be checked against the Department of 18 19 State Police and Federal Bureau of Investigation criminal 20 history record databases now and hereafter filed. The 21 Department of State Police shall charge applicants or licensees 22 a fee for conducting the criminal history records check, which shall be deposited into the State Police Services Fund and 23

1 shall not exceed the actual cost of the records check. The 2 Department of State Police shall furnish, pursuant to positive 3 identification, records of Illinois convictions to the 4 Department. The Department may require applicants or licensees 5 to pay a separate fingerprinting fee, either to the Department or to a vendor designated or approved by the Department. The 6 7 Department, in its discretion, may allow an applicant or 8 licensee who does not have reasonable access to a designated 9 vendor to provide his or her fingerprints in an alternative 10 manner. The Department may adopt any rules necessary to 11 implement this Section. Communication between the Department 12 and an interstate compact governing body, including, but not 13 limited to, the Interstate Commission as defined in Section 180 14 of the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact Act, may not include information received from the Federal Bureau of 15 16 Investigation relating to a State and federal criminal history 17 records check.

Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon becoming law.
