Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- 4 Section 5. The Firearm Concealed Carry Act is amended by 5 changing Sections 40, 55, and 60 as follows:
- (430 ILCS 66/40) 6

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- 7 Sec. 40. Non-resident license applications.
- (a) For the purposes of this Section, "non-resident" means 8 a person who has not resided within this State for more than 30 days and resides in another state or territory. 10
 - (b) The Department shall by rule allow for non-resident license applications from any state or territory of the United States with laws related to firearm ownership, possession, and carrying, that are substantially similar to the requirements to obtain a license under this Act.
- (b-5) Notwithstanding whether the laws of the state or territory where the non-resident resides related to firearm ownership, possession, and carrying are substantially similar to the requirements to obtain a license under this Act, the 20 Department shall allow for a non-resident license application 21 if the applicant is employed by the United States Military 22 permanently assigned in Illinois on Permanent Change of Station (PCS) or Permanent Change of Assignment (PCA) orders and who is 23

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1	not a resident of this State but maintains an address in this
2	State. A non-resident applicant who qualifies under this
3	subsection (b-5) must meet all of the qualifications
4	established in Section 25 of this Act and shall submit:
5	(1) the application and documentation required under
6	subsection (b) of Section 30 of this Act and the applicable
7	fee;
8	(2) a photocopy of proof of service document;
9	(3) a photocopy of Permanent Change of Station (PCS) or
10	Permanent Change of Assignment (PCA) orders to an
11	assignment in this State; and
12	(4) an affirmation that the applicant possesses a
13	currently valid Firearm Owner's Identification Card with
14	the Firearm Owner's Identification Card number or notice
15	that the applicant is applying for a Firearm Owner's
16	Identification Card in conjunction with the license
17	application.
18	In lieu of an Illinois driver's license or Illinois
19	identification card, a non-resident applicant under this
20	subsection (b-5) shall provide similar documentation from his
21	or her state or territory of residence.
22	(c) A resident of a state or territory approved by the
23	Department under subsection (b) of this Section may apply for a

non-resident license. The applicant shall apply to the

Department and must meet all of the qualifications established

in Section 25 of this Act, except for the Illinois residency

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1	requirement in item (xiv) of paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of
2	Section 4 of the Firearm Owners Identification Card Act. The
3	applicant shall submit:
4	(1) the application and documentation required under
5	Section 30 of this Act and the applicable fee;
6	(2) a notarized document stating that the applicant:
7	(A) is eligible under federal law and the laws of
8	his or her state or territory of residence to own or
9	possess a firearm;
10	(B) if applicable, has a license or permit to carry
11	a firearm or concealed firearm issued by his or her
12	state or territory of residence and attach a copy of
13	the license or permit to the application;
14	(C) understands Illinois laws pertaining to the
15	possession and transport of firearms; and
16	(D) acknowledges that the applicant is subject to
17	the jurisdiction of the Department and Illinois courts
18	for any violation of this Act;
19	(3) a photocopy of any certificates or other evidence
20	of compliance with the training requirements under Section
21	75 of this Act; and
22	(4) a head and shoulder color photograph in a size
23	specified by the Department taken within the 30 days
24	preceding the date of the application.

(d) In lieu of an Illinois driver's license or Illinois

identification card, a non-resident applicant shall provide

similar documentation from his or her state or territory of residence. In lieu of a valid Firearm Owner's Identification Card, except for a non-resident applicant under subsection (b-5) of this Section, the applicant shall submit documentation and information required by the Department to obtain a Firearm Owner's Identification Card, including an affidavit that the non-resident meets the mental health standards to obtain a firearm under Illinois law, and the Department shall ensure that the applicant would meet the eligibility criteria to obtain a Firearm Owner's Identification card if he or she was a resident of this State.

- (e) Nothing in this Act shall prohibit a non-resident from transporting a concealed firearm within his or her vehicle in Illinois, if the concealed firearm remains within his or her vehicle and the non-resident:
 - (1) is not prohibited from owning or possessing a firearm under federal law;
 - (2) is eligible to carry a firearm in public under the laws of his or her state or territory of residence, as evidenced by the possession of a concealed carry license or permit issued by his or her state of residence, if applicable; and
 - (3) is not in possession of a license under this Act.

If the non-resident leaves his or her vehicle unattended, he or she shall store the firearm within a locked vehicle or locked container within the vehicle in accordance with

- subsection (b) of Section 65 of this Act. 1

- 7 (a) A licensee shall notify the Department within 30 days
- 8 of moving or changing residence or any change of name. The
- 9 licensee shall submit the requisite fee and the Department may
- 10 require a notarized statement that the licensee has changed his
- 11 or her residence or his or her name, including the prior and
- 12 current address or name and the date the applicant moved or
- 1.3 changed his or her name.
- (a-5) A non-resident licensee approved under subsection 14
- 15 (b-5) of Section 40 of this Act shall, in addition to meeting
- 16 the notification requirements in subsection (a) of this
- Section, notify the Department within 30 days of moving to an 17
- 18 address outside of this State, a Permanent Change of Station
- 19 (PCS) or Permanent Change of Assignment (PCA) to a duty station
- 20 outside this State, or a separation or retirement from the
- 21 United States Military.
- 22 (b) A licensee shall notify the Department within 10 days
- 23 of discovering that a license has been lost, destroyed, or
- stolen. A lost, destroyed, or stolen license is invalid. To 24
- 25 request a replacement license, the licensee shall submit:

- 1 (1) a notarized statement that the licensee no longer
- 2 possesses the license, and that it was lost, destroyed, or
- 3 stolen;
- 4 (2) if applicable, a copy of a police report stating
- 5 that the license was stolen; and
- 6 (3) the requisite fee.
- 7 (c) A violation of this Section is a petty offense with a
- 8 fine of \$150 which shall be deposited into the Mental Health
- 9 Reporting Fund.

- 8 (d) A licensee requesting a new license in accordance with
- 9 Section 55 shall submit \$75, of which \$60 shall be apportioned
- to the State Police Firearm Services Fund, \$5 shall be 10
- 11 apportioned to the Mental Health Reporting Fund, and \$10 shall
- 12 be apportioned to the State Crime Laboratory Fund.
