Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

Section 10. The amounts appropriated for repairs and maintenance, and other capital improvements in Sections 5 and 50 for repairs and maintenance, roof repairs replacements, and miscellaneous capital improvements at the Department's various institutions are to include construction, reconstruction, improvements, repairs and installation of capital facilities, costs of planning, supplies, materials and all other expenses required for roof and other types of repairs and maintenance, capital improvements, and purchase of land.

No contract shall be entered into or obligation incurred for repairs and maintenance and other capital improvements from appropriations made in Sections 5 and 50 of this Article until after the purposes and amounts have been approved in writing by the Governor.

15 ARTICLE 2

Section 1. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Sex Offender Management Board Fund to the Sex Offender Management Board for the purposes authorized by the Sex Offender Management Board Act including, but not limited to, sex offender evaluation, treatment, and monitoring programs and grants. Funding received from private sources is to be expended in accordance with the terms and conditions placed upon the funding.

1 ARTICLE 3

- Section 1. The sum of \$775,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Corrections
- 4 from the General Revenue Fund for a grant to the Illinois
- 5 Sentencing Policy Advisory Council.

6 ARTICLE 4

- 7 Section 99. Effective Date. This Act takes effect July
- 8 1, 2017, if and only if Senate Bill 2063 of the 100th General
- 9 Assembly (the Unbalanced Budget Response Act), as introduced
- in the Illinois Senate, becomes law.
