SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Amends the General Obligation Bond Act. Increases the total authorization under the Act from \$49,917,925,743 to \$50,451,925,743. Includes specific increases for capital facilities. Amends the Build Illinois Bond Act. Increases the total authorization under the Act from \$6,246,009,000 to \$6,735,609,000. Includes specific increases for: bond sale expenses and public infrastructure; economic development, development and improvement of educational, scientific, technical and vocational programs and facilities; and the expansion of health and human services. Effective immediately.

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1 AN ACT concerning finance.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The General Obligation Bond Act is amended by changing Sections 2 and 3 as follows:
- 6 (30 ILCS 330/2) (from Ch. 127, par. 652)
- Sec. 2. Authorization for Bonds. The State of Illinois is authorized to issue, sell and provide for the retirement of General Obligation Bonds of the State of Illinois for the categories and specific purposes expressed in Sections 2 through 8 of this Act, in the total amount of \$50,451,925,743 \$49,917,925,743.
- The bonds authorized in this Section 2 and in Section 16 of this Act are herein called "Bonds".
 - Of the total amount of Bonds authorized in this Act, up to \$2,200,000,000 in aggregate original principal amount may be issued and sold in accordance with the Baccalaureate Savings Act in the form of General Obligation College Savings Bonds.
 - Of the total amount of Bonds authorized in this Act, up to \$300,000,000 in aggregate original principal amount may be issued and sold in accordance with the Retirement Savings Act in the form of General Obligation Retirement Savings Bonds.
- 23 Of the total amount of Bonds authorized in this Act, the

- additional \$10,000,000,000 authorized by Public Act 93-2, the
- 2 \$3,466,000,000 authorized by Public Act 96-43, and the
- 3 \$4,096,348,300 authorized by Public Act 96-1497 shall be used
- 4 solely as provided in Section 7.2.
- 5 The issuance and sale of Bonds pursuant to the General
- 6 Obligation Bond Act is an economical and efficient method of
- 7 financing the long-term capital needs of the State. This Act
- 8 will permit the issuance of a multi-purpose General Obligation
- 9 Bond with uniform terms and features. This will not only lower
- 10 the cost of registration but also reduce the overall cost of
- issuing debt by improving the marketability of Illinois General
- 12 Obligation Bonds.

- Sec. 3. Capital Facilities. The amount of \$10,268,963,443
- \$9,753,963,443 is authorized to be used for the acquisition,
- 19 development, construction, reconstruction, improvement,
- 20 financing, architectural planning and installation of capital
- 21 facilities within the State, consisting of buildings,
- 22 structures, durable equipment, land, interests in land, and the
- 23 costs associated with the purchase and implementation of
- 24 information technology, including but not limited to the
- 25 purchase of hardware and software, for the following specific

1 purposes:

- (a) \$3,399,728,000 \$3,393,228,000 for educational purposes by State universities and colleges, the Illinois Community College Board created by the Public Community College Act and for grants to public community colleges as authorized by Sections 5-11 and 5-12 of the Public Community College Act;
 - (b) \$1,648,420,000 for correctional purposes at State prison and correctional centers;
 - (c) \$599,183,000 for open spaces, recreational and conservation purposes and the protection of land;
 - (d) \$782,817,000 \$751,317,000 for child care facilities, mental and public health facilities, and facilities for the care of veterans with disabilities and their spouses;
 - (e) \$2,629,790,000 \$2,152,790,000 for use by the State, its departments, authorities, public corporations, commissions and agencies;
 - (f) \$818,100 for cargo handling facilities at port districts and for breakwaters, including harbor entrances, at port districts in conjunction with facilities for small boats and pleasure crafts;
 - (g) \$297,177,074 for water resource management projects;
 - (h) \$16,940,269 for the provision of facilities for food production research and related instructional and

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public service activities at the State universities and public community colleges;

- (i) \$36,000,000 for grants by the Secretary of State, as State Librarian, for central library facilities authorized by Section 8 of the Illinois Library System Act and for grants by the Capital Development Board to units of local government for public library facilities;
- \$25,000,000 for the acquisition, development, construction, reconstruction, improvement, financing, architectural planning and installation of capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment and land for grants to counties, municipalities with building commissions public correctional or facilities that do not comply with the minimum standards of the Department of Corrections under Section 3-15-2 of the Unified Code of Corrections;
- (k) \$5,000,000 for grants in fiscal year 1988 by the Department of Conservation for improvement or expansion of aquarium facilities located on property owned by a park district;
- (1) \$599,590,000 to State agencies for grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing, architectural planning, development, alteration, installation, and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings, structures, durable equipment, and land; and
 - (m) \$228,500,000 for the Illinois Open Land Trust

- 1 Program as defined by the Illinois Open Land Trust Act.
- 2 The amounts authorized above for capital facilities may be
- 3 used for the acquisition, installation, alteration,
- 4 construction, or reconstruction of capital facilities and for
- 5 the purchase of equipment for the purpose of major capital
- 6 improvements which will reduce energy consumption in State
- 7 buildings or facilities.

- 9 Section 10. The Build Illinois Bond Act is amended by
- 10 changing Sections 2 and 4 as follows:
- 11 (30 ILCS 425/2) (from Ch. 127, par. 2802)
- 12 Sec. 2. Authorization for Bonds. The State of Illinois is
- 13 authorized to issue, sell and provide for the retirement of
- 14 limited obligation bonds, notes and other evidences of
- indebtedness of the State of Illinois in the total principal
- 16 amount of 6,735,609,000 6,246,009,000 herein called "Bonds".
- 17 Such authorized amount of Bonds shall be reduced from time to
- 18 time by amounts, if any, which are equal to the moneys received
- 19 by the Department of Revenue in any fiscal year pursuant to
- 20 Section 3-1001 of the "Illinois Vehicle Code", as amended, in
- 21 excess of the Annual Specified Amount (as defined in Section 3
- of the "Retailers' Occupation Tax Act", as amended) and
- 23 transferred at the end of such fiscal year from the General
- 24 Revenue Fund to the Build Illinois Purposes Fund (now

abolished) as provided in Section 3-1001 of said Code; 1 2 provided, however, that no such reduction shall affect the 3 validity or enforceability of any Bonds issued prior to such reduction. Such amount of authorized Bonds shall be exclusive 5 of any refunding Bonds issued pursuant to Section 15 of this Act and exclusive of any Bonds issued pursuant to this Section 6 7 which are redeemed, purchased, advance refunded, or defeased in 8 accordance with paragraph (f) of Section 4 of this Act. Bonds 9 shall be issued for the categories and specific purposes 10 expressed in Section 4 of this Act.

- Sec. 4. Purposes of Bonds. Bonds shall be issued for the following purposes and in the approximate amounts as set forth below:
- 16 \$3,687,800,000 \$3,222,800,000 for the expenses of issuance and sale of Bonds, including bond discounts, and for 17 18 planning, engineering, acquisition, construction, reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the 19 20 public infrastructure in the State of Illinois, including: the 21 making of loans or grants to local governments for waste 22 disposal systems, water and sewer line extensions and water distribution and purification facilities, rail or air or water 23 24 port improvements, gas and electric utility extensions, 25 publicly owned industrial and commercial sites, buildings used

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for public administration purposes and other public infrastructure capital improvements; the making of loans or grants to units of local government for financing and construction of wastewater facilities, including grants to serve unincorporated areas; refinancing or retiring bonds issued between January 1, 1987 and January 1, 1990 by home rule municipalities, debt service on which is provided from a tax imposed by home rule municipalities prior to January 1, 1990 on the sale of food and drugs pursuant to Section 8-11-1 of the Home Rule Municipal Retailers' Occupation Tax Act or Section 8-11-5 of the Home Rule Municipal Service Occupation Tax Act; the making of deposits not to exceed \$70,000,000 in the aggregate into the Water Pollution Control Revolving Fund to provide assistance in accordance with the provisions of Title IV-A of the Environmental Protection Act; the planning, engineering, acquisition, construction, reconstruction, alteration, expansion, extension and improvement of highways, bridges, structures separating highways and railroads, rest areas, interchanges, access roads to and from any State or local highway and other transportation improvement projects which are related to economic development activities; the making of loans or grants for planning, engineering, rail rehabilitation, improvement or construction of transit facilities; the planning, engineering, acquisition, construction, reconstruction and improvement of watershed, drainage, flood control, recreation and related improvements

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and facilities, including expenses related to land and easement acquisition, relocation, control structures, channel work and clearing and appurtenant work; the making of grants for improvement and development of zoos and park district field houses and related structures; and the making of grants for improvement and development of Navy Pier and related structures.

\$852,000,000 \$849,000,000 for fostering economic (b) development and increased employment and the well being of the citizens of Illinois, including: the making of grants for improvement and development of McCormick Place and related structures; planning and construction of the microelectronics research center, including the planning, engineering, construction, improvement, renovation acquisition of buildings, equipment and related utility support systems; the making of loans to businesses investments in small businesses; acquiring real properties for industrial or commercial site development; acquiring, rehabilitating and reconveying industrial and commercial properties for the purpose of expanding employment and encouraging private and other public sector investment in the economy of Illinois; the payment of expenses associated with siting the Superconducting Super Collider Particle Accelerator its and with acquisition, construction, maintenance, operation, promotion and support; the making of loans for the planning, engineering, acquisition,

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construction, improvement and conversion of facilities and equipment which will foster the use of Illinois coal; the of expenses associated with the promotion, payment establishment, acquisition and operation of small business incubator facilities and agribusiness research facilities, lease, purchase, renovation, the engineering, construction and maintenance of buildings, utility support systems and equipment designated for such purposes and the establishment and maintenance of centralized support services within such facilities; and the making of grants or loans to units of local government for Urban Development Action Grant and Housing Partnership programs.

(c) \$1,959,058,100 \$1,944,058,100 for the development and improvement of educational, scientific, technical vocational programs and facilities and the expansion of health and human services for all citizens of Illinois, including: the making of construction and improvement grants and loans to public libraries and library systems; the making of grants and loans for planning, engineering, acquisition and construction of a new State central library in Springfield; the planning, engineering, acquisition and construction of an animal and dairv sciences facility; the planning, engineering, acquisition and construction of a campus and all related buildings, facilities, equipment and materials for Richland Community College; the acquisition, rehabilitation installation of equipment and materials for scientific and

historical surveys; the making of grants or loans 1 2 distribution to eligible vocational education instructional programs for the upgrading of vocational education programs, 3 school shops and laboratories, including the acquisition, 4 5 rehabilitation and installation of technical equipment and materials; the making of grants or loans for distribution to 6 eligible local educational agencies for the upgrading of math 7 8 and science instructional programs, including the acquisition 9 instructional equipment and materials; miscellaneous of 10 capital improvements for universities and community colleges 11 including the planning, engineering, construction, 12 remodeling, improvement, reconstruction, repair and 13 installation of capital facilities and costs of planning, 14 supplies, equipment, materials, services, and all other 15 required expenses; the making of grants or loans for repair, 16 renovation and miscellaneous capital improvements 17 privately operated colleges and universities and community colleges, including the planning, engineering, acquisition, 18 19 construction, reconstruction, remodeling, improvement, repair 20 and installation of capital facilities and costs of planning, supplies, equipment, materials, services, and all other 21 22 required expenses; and the making of grants or loans for 23 distribution to local governments for hospital and other health 24 facilities including the planning, engineering, 25 acquisition, construction, reconstruction, remodeling, 26 improvement, repair and installation of capital facilities and

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1 costs of planning, supplies, equipment, materials, services 2 and all other required expenses.

\$230,150,900 (d) \$236,750,900 for protection, preservation, restoration and conservation of environmental and natural resources, including: the making of grants to soil water conservation districts for the planning implementation of conservation practices and for funding contracts with the Soil Conservation Service for watershed planning; the making of grants to units of local government for the capital development and improvement of recreation areas, including planning and engineering costs, sewer projects, including planning and engineering costs and water projects, including planning and engineering costs, and for the acquisition of open space lands, including the acquisition of easements and other property interests of less than fee simple ownership; the acquisition and related costs and development and management of natural heritage lands, including natural areas and areas providing habitat for endangered species and nongame wildlife, and buffer area lands; the acquisition and related costs and development and management of habitat lands, including forest, wildlife habitat and wetlands; and the removal and disposition of hazardous substances, including the cost of project management, equipment, laboratory analysis, and contractual services necessary for preventative and corrective actions related to the preservation, restoration and conservation of the environment, including deposits not to

- 1 exceed \$60,000,000 in the aggregate into the Hazardous Waste
- 2 Fund and the Brownfields Redevelopment Fund for improvements in
- 3 accordance with the provisions of Titles V and XVII of the
- 4 Environmental Protection Act.
- 5 (e) The amount specified in paragraph (a) above shall
- 6 include an amount necessary to pay reasonable expenses of each
- 7 issuance and sale of the Bonds, as specified in the related
- 8 Bond Sale Order (hereinafter defined).
- 9 (f) Any unexpended proceeds from any sale of Bonds which
- are held in the Build Illinois Bond Fund may be used to redeem,
- 11 purchase, advance refund, or defease any Bonds outstanding.
