Makes appropriations and reappropriations for the fiscal years beginning July 1, 2016 and July 1, 2017. Effective immediately, except that Articles 11 through 41 take effect July 1, 2017.

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 0.2

5 Section 1. Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and
6 reappropriations for State fiscal years 2017 and 2018.
7 Articles 1 through 10 are for fiscal year 2017. Articles 11
8 through 41 are for fiscal year 2018. Articles 0.5 and 0.8
9 apply to both fiscal years.

10 ARTICLE 0.5

11 Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a
12 portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made
13 in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School
14 Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation
15 Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the
16 Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund,
17 and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed
18 from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds subsequently issued by
19 the State.

20 ARTICLE 0.8

21 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

1 Section 1. Appropriations to the Department of Natural
 2 Resources including those in Articles 7 through 10 and Article
 3 36 may be used for costs incurred prior to July 1, 2017.

4 ARTICLE 1

5 SECRETARY OF STATE

6 Section 1. The sum of \$10,110,140, or so much thereof as
 7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
 8 Fund to the Secretary of State for capital grants to public
 9 libraries for permanent improvements.

10 Section 5. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
 11 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
 12 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
 13 been approved in writing by the Governor.

14 Total, this Article \$10,110,140

15 ARTICLE 2

16 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

17 Section 1. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as
 18 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development
 19 Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 20 Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the Port
 21 Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-

1 11.

2 Section 5. The sum of \$10,000,000, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
4 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity a
5 grant to the Uptown Theatre for costs associated with capital
6 improvements.

7 Section 10. The sum of \$17,000,000, or so much thereof as
8 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
9 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
10 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

11 Section 15. The sum of \$5,500,001, or so much thereof as
12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
13 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
14 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

15 Section 20. The sum of \$1,052,757, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
17 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
18 a grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for capital
19 improvements, acquisition and development of land and
20 structures, including previously incurred costs.

1 Section 25. The sum of \$12,386,633, or so much thereof as
2 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
3 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
4 a grant for the Illinois Science and Technology Park.

5 Section 30. The sum of \$33,581,935, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
7 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
8 grants and loans pursuant but not limited to Article 8, Article
9 9, or Article 10 of the Build Illinois Act.

10 Section 35. The sum of \$75,338,451, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
12 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
13 the purpose of making grants and loans to local governments for
14 planning, engineering, acquisition, construction,
15 reconstruction, development, improvement and extension of the
16 public infrastructure, and for any other purposes authorized
17 in subsection (a) of Section 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act
18 and for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

19 Section 40. The sum of \$2,200,000, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
21 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
22 a grant to the Illinois Medical District Commission for the

1 purpose of fostering economic development and increased
2 employment and the well being of the citizens of Illinois, and
3 for any other purposes authorized in subsection (b) of Section
4 4 of the Build Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State
5 agencies for such purposes.

6 Section 45. The sum of \$7,267,741, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
8 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
9 purposes authorized in subsection (c) of Section 4 of the Build
10 Illinois Bond Act and for grants to State agencies for such
11 purposes.

12 Section 50. The sum of \$26,714,480, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
14 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
15 deposits into the Partners for Conservation Projects Fund and
16 other purposes authorized by subsection (c) of Section 3 of the
17 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for
18 such purposes.

19 Section 55. The sum of \$19,328,499, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
21 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
22 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,

1 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
2 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
3 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
4 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
5 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

6 Section 60. The sum of \$8,750,000, or so much thereof as
7 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
8 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
9 grants to local governments for the acquisition, financing,
10 architectural planning, development, alteration, installation,
11 and construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
12 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
13 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
14 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

15 Section 65. The sum of \$1,195,268, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
17 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
18 a grant to the Chicago Housing Authority for LeClaire Courts.

19 Section 70. The sum of \$398,974,111, or so much thereof
20 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
21 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
22 Opportunity for grants awarded under the Urban Weatherization

1 Initiative Act.

2 Section 75. The sum of \$3,414,314, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
4 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
5 grants and loans including but not limited to broadband
6 deployment to expand and strengthen existing broadband network
7 infrastructure, health information technology, telemedicine,
8 distance learning, and public safety.

9 Section 80. The sum of \$15,080,745, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
11 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 infrastructure projects that lead directly to private sector
13 expansion or retention activities including but not limited to
14 public infrastructure construction and renovation, financing
15 for the purchase of land and buildings, construction or
16 renovation of fixed assets, site preparation and purchase of
17 machinery and equipment.

18 Section 85. The sum of \$2,330,884, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
20 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
21 the requirements necessary to leverage capital-related American
22 Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 funds of equal or greater

1 value in order to make Illinois or Illinois applicants more
2 competitive and/or for costs associated with bondable
3 improvements to match federal, local, private or other funds.

4 Section 90. The sum of \$125,591, or so much thereof as may
5 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
6 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
7 grant to the Phoenix Foundation of Southern Illinois for
8 hospital renovation and equipment.

9 Section 95. The sum of \$2,978,788, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
11 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 grants associated with the redevelopment of brownfield sites.

13 Section 100. The following named sums, or so much thereof
14 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
15 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
16 Opportunity for a grant to the Rockford District 205 for the
17 projects hereinafter enumerated:

11 Section 105. The sum of \$9,000,000, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
 13 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
 14 grants for acquisition, construction, renovation and equipping
 15 new charter schools, to a silver certification from the United
 16 States Green Building Council's Leadership in Energy and
 17 Environmental Design Green Building Rating System as
 18 approximated below:

19 For Instituto Del Progreso Latino9,000,000

20 Section 110. The sum of \$ 2,606,686, or so much thereof
 21 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois
 22 Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic
 23 Opportunity for provide grants, loans, and other investments

1 to emerging technology enterprises to support and encourage:
2 (i) commercialization of technology based products and
3 services; (ii) technology transfer projects involving the
4 promotion of new or innovative technologies; or (iii) research
5 and development projects to respond to unique, advanced
6 technology projects and which foster the development of
7 Illinois' economy through the advancement of the State's
8 economic, scientific, and technological assets.

9 Section 115. The sum of \$5,938,000, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
11 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
12 provide grants for land acquisition, infrastructure, equipment
13 and other permissible capital expenditures to businesses that
14 will encourage new investment and the creation or retention of
15 jobs in economically depressed areas of the State.

16 Section 120. The sum of \$3,301,210, or so much thereof as
17 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
18 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
19 a grant to the University of Chicago Medical Center for costs
20 associated with Provident Hospital.

21 Section 125. The sum of \$2,084,459, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond

1 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
2 a grant to Community Health and Emergency Services, Inc. for
3 the construction of a hospital wing at the Cairo Megaclinic.

4 Section 130. The sum of \$1,125,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond
6 Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for
7 a grant to the Cook County Health and Hospital System for costs
8 associated with medical equipment and capital improvements at
9 Provident Hospital.

10 Section 135. This Article is not subject to limitations
11 under Section 5 of Article 48 of Public Act 95-734 or any
12 similar limitation.

13 Section 140. No contract shall be entered into or
14 obligation incurred or any expenditure made from any
15 appropriation herein made in this Article until after the
16 purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
17 Governor.

18 Total, this Article \$669,775,553

19 ARTICLE 3

20 DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

1 Section 1. The sum of \$750,000, or so much thereof as may
2 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
3 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
4 grant to Erie Neighborhood House.

5 Section 5. The sum of \$338,579, or so much thereof as may
6 be necessary, is appropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund
7 to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a
8 grant to Family Guidance Center.

9 Section 10. This Article is not subject to limitations
10 under Section 5 of Article 48 of Public Act 95-734 or any
11 similar limitation.

12 Section 15. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
13 incurred or any expenditure made from any appropriation herein
14 made in this Article until after the purpose and amounts have
15 been approved in writing by the Governor.

16 Total, this Article \$1,088,579

17 ARTICLE 4

18 DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

19 Section 1. The sum of \$6,690,383, or so much thereof as
20 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act

1 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
2 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
3 units for the construction, maintenance, and improvement of
4 boat access areas.

5 Section 5. The sum of \$366,743, or so much thereof as may
6 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund
7 to the Department of Natural Resources for the purposes of the
8 Snowmobile Registration and Safety Act and for the
9 administration and payment of grants to local governmental
10 units for the construction, land acquisition, lease,
11 maintenance and improvement of snowmobile trails and access
12 areas.

13 Section 10. To the extent federal funds including
14 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
15 \$4,770,932 is appropriated from the State Boating Act Fund to
16 the Department of Natural Resources for all costs for
17 construction and development of facilities for transient, non-
18 trailerable recreational boats, including grants for such
19 purposes and authorized under the Boating Infrastructure Grant
20 Program.

21 Section 15. The following named sum, or so much thereof
22 as may be necessary, respectively is appropriated to the

1 Department of Natural Resources for the objects and purposes
2 set forth below:

3 Payable from State Boating Act Fund:

4 For multiple use facilities and programs
5 for boating purposes provided by the
6 Department of Natural Resources including
7 construction and development, all costs
8 for supplies, materials, labor, land
9 acquisition, services, studies and all
10 other expenses required to comply with
11 the intent of this appropriation\$7,242,902

12 Section 20. The following named sums, or so much thereof
13 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
14 Natural Resources for the objects and purposes set forth below:

15 Payable from the State Parks Fund:

16 For multiple use facilities and programs
17 for park and trail purposes provided
18 by the Department of Natural Resources,
19 including construction and development, all
20 costs for supplies, materials, labor,
21 land acquisition, services, studies, and
22 all other expenses required to comply with
23 the intent of this appropriation\$600,000

1 Section 25. The following named sums, or so much thereof
 2 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
 3 Natural Resources for the objects and purposes set forth below:

 6 for park and trail purposes provided
 7 by the Department of Natural Resources, including
 8 construction and development, all costs
 9 for supplies, materials, labor, land
 10 acquisition, services, studies, and
 11 all other expenses required to comply with

13 For multiple use facilities and
 14 purposes provided by the
 15 Department of Natural Resources, including
 16 construction and development, all costs
 17 for supplies, materials, labor, land

21 Section 30. To the extent federal funds including
 22 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of
 23 \$1,251,995, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is
 24 appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department

1 of Natural Resources for construction and renovation of waste
2 reception facilities for recreational boaters, including grants
3 for such purposes authorized under the Clean Vessel Act.

4 Section 35. The sum of \$1,808,144, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
6 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants to local
7 governments for the acquisition, financing, architectural
8 planning, development, alteration, installation, and
9 construction of capital facilities consisting of buildings,
10 structures, durable equipment, and land as authorized by
11 subsection (1) of Section 3 of the General Obligation Bond Act
12 or for grants to State agencies for such purposes.

13 Section 40. The sum of \$12,785,984, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
15 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for planning,
16 design and construction of ecosystem rehabilitation, habitat
17 restoration and associated development in cooperation with the
18 U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

19 Section 45. The sum of \$853,104, or so much thereof as may
20 be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development Fund
21 to the Department of Natural Resources for planning, design and
22 construction of ecosystem rehabilitation, habitat restoration

1 and associated development in cooperation with the U.S. Army
2 Corps of Engineers.

3 Section 50. The sum of \$36,712, or so much thereof as may
4 be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development Fund
5 to the Department of Natural Resources for planning, design and
6 construction of ecosystem rehabilitation, habitat restoration
7 and associated development in cooperation with the U.S. Army
8 Corps of Engineers.

9 Section 55. The sum of \$9,719,699, or so much thereof as
10 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
11 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the Open Land
12 Trust Program.

13 Section 60. The sum of \$4,501,300, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
15 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for upgrades to
16 lodges, camps and campsites, including but not limited to
17 previously incurred costs.

18 Section 65. The sum of \$32,200,673, or so much thereof as
19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
20 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
21 construction and maintenance of State owned, leased, and

1 managed sites.

2 Section 70. The sum of \$22,758,021, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Capital Development
4 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the Illinois
5 Open Land Trust Program as defined by the Illinois Open Land
6 Trust Act as authorized by subsection (m) of Section 3 of the
7 General Obligation Bond Act or for grants to State agencies for
8 such purposes.

9 Section 75. The sum of \$246,149, or so much thereof as may
10 be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
11 Resources from the State Furbearer Fund for the conservation
12 of fur bearing mammals in accordance with the provisions of
13 Section 1.32 of the Wildlife Code, as now or hereafter amended.

14 Section 80. The following named sum, or so much thereof
15 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
16 Natural Resources for the objects and purposes set forth below:
17 Payable from Natural Areas Acquisition Fund:

18 For the acquisition, preservation and
19 stewardship of natural areas,
20 including habitats for endangered and
21 threatened species, high quality natural
22 communities, wetlands and other areas

1 with unique or unusual natural
 2 heritage qualities\$24,335,808

3 Section 85. The sum of \$2,545,229, or so much thereof as
 4 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Pheasant Fund
 5 to the Department of Natural Resources for the conservation of
 6 pheasants in accordance with the provisions of Section 1.31 of
 7 the Wildlife Code, as now or hereafter amended.

8 Section 90. The sum of \$6,590,486, or so much thereof as
 9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
 10 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
 11 preservation and maintenance of high quality habitat lands in
 12 accordance with the provisions of the Habitat Endowment Act,
 13 as now or hereafter amended.

14 Section 95. The sum of \$2,468,401, or so much thereof as
 15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Illinois Habitat
 16 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the
 17 preservation and maintenance of a high quality fish and
 18 wildlife habitat and to promote the heritage of outdoor sports
 19 in Illinois from revenue derived from the sale of Sportsmen
 20 Series license plates.

21 Section 100. The sum of \$2,204,971, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off-Highway Vehicle
2 Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants
3 to units of local governments, not-for-profit organizations,
4 and other groups to operate, maintain and acquire land for off-
5 highway vehicle trails and parks as provided for in the
6 Recreational Trails of Illinois Act, including administration,
7 enforcement, planning and implementation of this Act.

8 Section 105. The sum of \$3,142,458, or so much thereof as
9 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Partners for
10 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Natural
11 Resources for the acquisition, planning and development of land
12 and long-term easements, and cost-shared natural resource
13 management practices for ecosystem-based management of
14 Illinois' natural resources, including grants for such
15 purposes.

16 Section 110. The following named sum, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary, made either independently or in
18 cooperation with the Federal Government or any agency thereof,
19 any municipal corporation, or political subdivision of the
20 State, or with any public or private corporation, organization,
21 or individual, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
22 Resources for refunds and the purposes stated:

23 Payable from Federal Title IV Fire

1 Protection Assistance Fund:
 2 For Rural Community Fire
 3 Protection Program768,042

4 Section 115. The sum of \$322,403, or so much thereof as
 5 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
 6 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 7 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
 8 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
 9 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and areas
 10 for the use of snowmobiles.

11 Section 120. The sum of \$3,086,010, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
 13 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 14 the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public
 15 migratory waterfowl areas within the State.

16 Section 125. The sum of \$12,324,058, or so much thereof
 17 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
 18 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
 19 grants to units of local government for the acquisition and
 20 development of bike paths.

21 Section 130. The following named sum, or so much thereof

1 as may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of
2 Natural Resources:

3 Payable from the Park and Conservation Fund:

4 For multiple use facilities and programs
5 for park and trail purposes provided by
6 the Department of Natural Resources, including
7 construction and development, all costs
8 for supplies, materials, labor, land
9 acquisition, services, studies, and
10 all other expenses required to comply with
11 the intent of this appropriation5,767,533

12 Section 135. The sum of \$1,031,707, or so much thereof as
13 may be necessary, is appropriated to the Department of Natural
14 Resources from the Park and Conservation Fund for multiple use
15 facilities and programs for conservation purposes provided by
16 the Department of Natural Resources, including repairing,
17 maintaining, reconstructing, rehabilitating, replacing fixed
18 assets, construction and development, marketing and promotions,
19 all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land acquisition and
20 its related costs, services, studies, and all other expenses
21 required to comply with the intent of this appropriation.

22 Section 140. The sum of \$7,076,139, or so much thereof as
23 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and

1 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
2 land acquisition, development and maintenance of bike paths and
3 all other related expenses connected with the acquisition,
4 development and maintenance of bike paths.

5 Section 145. The sum of \$509,741, or so much thereof as
6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and
7 Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
8 multiple use facilities and programs for conservation purposes
9 provided by the Department of Natural Resources, including
10 repairing, maintaining, reconstructing, rehabilitating,
11 replacing fixed assets, construction and development, marketing
12 and promotions, all costs for supplies, materials, labor, land
13 acquisition and its related costs, services, studies, and all
14 other expenses required to comply with the intent of this
15 appropriation.

16 Section 150. The sum of \$10,778,547, or so much thereof
17 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and

14 business on June 30, 2017, from a new appropriation made for
15 such purpose in Article 10, Section 15 of this Act, is
16 reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the
17 Environmental Protection Agency for grants and loans for
18 transportation electrification infrastructure projects;
19 including, but not limited to grants and loans for the purpose
20 of encouraging electric car manufacturing and infrastructure
21 for electric vehicles.

22 Section 20. No contract shall be entered into or obligation
23 incurred for any expenditure made in this Article until after

1 the purpose and amounts have been approved in writing by the
2 Governor.
