SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-3.5

Amends the Tax Increment Allocation Redevelopment Act of the Illinois Municipal Code. Creates a tax increment allocation financing extension for an ordinance adopted on October 23, 1995 by the City of Marion. Effective immediately.

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AN ACT concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Municipal Code is amended by 5 changing Section 11-74.4-3.5 as follows:

6 (65 ILCS 5/11-74.4-3.5)

7 Sec. 11-74.4-3.5. Completion dates for redevelopment 8 projects.

9 (a) Unless otherwise stated in this Section, the estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment project and retirement 10 of obligations issued to finance redevelopment project costs 11 (including refunding bonds under Section 11-74.4-7) may not be 12 later than December 31 of the year in which the payment to the 13 14 municipal treasurer, as provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act, is to be made with respect to ad valorem 15 16 taxes levied in the 23rd calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving the redevelopment project area was 17 adopted if the ordinance was adopted on or after January 15, 18 19 1981.

20 (a-5) If the redevelopment project area is located within a 21 transit facility improvement area established pursuant to 22 Section 11-74.4-3, the estimated dates of completion of the 23 redevelopment project and retirement of obligations issued to 1 finance redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds 2 under Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of 3 the year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer, as provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act 4 5 amendatory Act of the 99th General Assembly, is to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 35th calendar year 6 7 in which the ordinance approving after the year the 8 redevelopment project area was adopted.

9 (a-7) A municipality may adopt tax increment financing for 10 a redevelopment project area located in a transit facility 11 improvement area that also includes real property located 12 within an existing redevelopment project area established prior to August 12, 2016 (the effective date of Public Act 13 99-792) this amendatory Act of 99th General Assembly. In such 14 15 case: (i) the provisions of this Division shall apply with 16 respect to the previously established redevelopment project 17 area until the municipality adopts, as required in accordance with applicable provisions of this Division, an ordinance 18 19 dissolving the special tax allocation fund for such 20 redevelopment project area and terminating the designation of such redevelopment project area as a redevelopment project 21 22 area; and (ii) after the effective date of the ordinance 23 described in (i), the provisions of this Division shall apply 24 with respect to the subsequently established redevelopment 25 project area located in a transit facility improvement area.

(b) The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment

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project and retirement of obligations issued to finance 1 redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under 2 Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the 3 year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as 4 5 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 32nd 6 7 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving 8 the redevelopment project area was adopted if the ordinance was 9 adopted on September 9, 1999 by the Village of Downs.

10 The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment 11 project and retirement of obligations issued to finance 12 redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the 13 14 year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as 15 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is 16 to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 33rd 17 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving the redevelopment project area was adopted if the ordinance was 18 19 adopted on May 20, 1985 by the Village of Wheeling.

The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment project and retirement of obligations issued to finance redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 28th

calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving
 the redevelopment project area was adopted if the ordinance was
 adopted on October 12, 1989 by the City of Lawrenceville.

(c) The estimated dates of completion of the redevelopment 4 5 project and retirement of obligations issued to finance redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under 6 7 Section 11-74.4-7) may not be later than December 31 of the 8 year in which the payment to the municipal treasurer as 9 provided in subsection (b) of Section 11-74.4-8 of this Act is 10 to be made with respect to ad valorem taxes levied in the 35th 11 calendar year after the year in which the ordinance approving 12 the redevelopment project area was adopted:

(d) For redevelopment project areas for which bonds were 18 issued before July 29, 1991, or for which contracts were 19 20 entered into before June 1, 1988, in connection with a redevelopment project in the area within the State Sales Tax 21 22 Boundary, the estimated dates of completion of the 23 redevelopment project and retirement of obligations to finance redevelopment project costs (including refunding bonds under 24 25 Section 11-74.4-7) may be extended by municipal ordinance to 26 December 31, 2013. The termination procedures of subsection (b)

of Section 11-74.4-8 are not required for these redevelopment project areas in 2009 but are required in 2013. The extension allowed by Public Act 87-1272 shall not apply to real property tax increment allocation financing under Section 11-74.4-8.

5 Those dates, for purposes of real property tax (e) 6 increment allocation financing pursuant to Section 11-74.4-8 7 only, shall be not more than 35 years for redevelopment project 8 areas that were adopted on or after December 16, 1986 and for 9 which at least \$8 million worth of municipal bonds were 10 authorized on or after December 19, 1989 but before January 1, 11 1990; provided that the municipality elects to extend the life 12 of the redevelopment project area to 35 years by the adoption of an ordinance after at least 14 but not more than 30 days' 13 14 written notice to the taxing bodies, that would otherwise 15 constitute the joint review board for the redevelopment project area, before the adoption of the ordinance. 16

17 Those dates, for purposes of real property tax (f) increment allocation financing pursuant to Section 11-74.4-8 18 19 only, shall be not more than 35 years for redevelopment project 20 areas that were established on or after December 1, 1981 but 21 before January 1, 1982 and for which at least \$1,500,000 worth 22 of tax increment revenue bonds were authorized on or after 23 September 30, 1990 but before July 1, 1991; provided that the municipality elects to extend the life of the redevelopment 24 25 project area to 35 years by the adoption of an ordinance after at least 14 but not more than 30 days' written notice to the 26

1 taxing bodies, that would otherwise constitute the joint review
2 board for the redevelopment project area, before the adoption
3 of the ordinance.

(f-5) Those dates, for purposes of real property tax 4 5 increment allocation financing pursuant to Section 11-74.4-8 only, shall be not more than 47 years for redevelopment project 6 7 areas that were established on December 29, 1981 by the City of 8 Springfield; provided that (i) the City city of Springfield 9 adopts an ordinance extending the life of the redevelopment 10 project area to 47 years and (ii) the City of Springfield 11 provides notice to the taxing bodies that would otherwise 12 constitute the joint review board for the redevelopment project 13 area not more than 30 and not less than 14 days prior to the 14 adoption of that ordinance.
