Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

- Section 5. The Probate Act of 1975 is amended by changing

 Section 18-10 as follows:
- 6 (755 ILCS 5/18-10) (from Ch. 110 1/2, par. 18-10)
- Sec. 18-10. Classification of claims against decedent's estate. All claims against the estate of a decedent are divided into classes in the manner following:
- 10 Funeral and burial expenses, expenses of 11 administration, and statutory custodial claims. For 12 purposes of this paragraph, funeral and burial expenses paid by 13 any person, including a surviving spouse, are funeral and 14 burial expenses; and funeral and burial expenses include reasonable amounts paid for a burial space, crypt or niche, a 15 marker on the burial space, care of the burial space, crypt or 16 17 niche, and interest on these amounts. Interest on these amounts shall accrue beginning 60 days after issuance of letters of 18 19 office to the representative of the decedent's estate, or if no such letters of office are issued, then beginning 60 days after 20 21 those amounts are due, up to the rate of 9% per annum as 22 allowed by contract or law.
- 23 2nd: The surviving spouse's or child's award.

- 1 3rd: Debts due the United States.
- 4th: Reasonable and necessary medical, hospital, and 2
- 3 nursing home expenses for the care of the decedent during the
- 4 year immediately preceding death; and money Money due employees
- 5 of the decedent of not more than \$800 for each claimant for
- 6 services rendered within 4 months prior to the decedent's death
- 7 and expenses attending the last illness.
- 5th: Money and property received or held in trust by 8
- decedent which cannot be identified or traced. 9
- 10 6th: Debts due this State and any county, township, city,
- 11 town, village or school district located within this State.
- 12 7th: All other claims.
