# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Purpose. This Act makes appropriations and Section 1. reappropriations for State fiscal year 2019. Article 15 and 6 7 Article 29 contain reappropriations of certain appropriations 8 as may have been appropriated for State fiscal year 2018 by 9 Article 105, Section 60 and Article 110, Section 1 of Public 10 Act 100-0021, respectively, as amended. To the extent that 11 Article 105, Section 60 and Article 110, Section 1 of Public 12 Act 100-0021 have not been enacted as amended, Article 14 and Article 28 contains appropriations of identical amounts and 13 purposes to those in Article 15 and Article 29 but as new 14 15 appropriations rather than as reappropriations. Section 99 of 16 Article 99 sets forth an effective date that causes Articles 15 and 29 to become effective if, and only if, Article 105, 17 Section 60 of Public Act 100-0021 and Article 110, Section 1 18 19 of Public Act 100-0021, respectively, should be amended; should such an amendment not be enacted, the Section causes Articles 20 21 14 and 28 to become effective.

22 ARTICLE 2

Section 1. It is the intent of the State that all or a portion of the costs of projects funded by appropriations made in this Act from the Capital Development Fund, the School Construction Fund, the Anti-Pollution Fund, the Transportation Bond Series A Fund, the Transportation Bond Series B Fund, the Coal Development Fund, the Transportation Bond Series D Fund, and the Build Illinois Bond Fund will be paid or reimbursed from the proceeds of tax-exempt bonds subsequently issued by the State.

10 ARTICLE 3

### DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ECONOMIC OPPORTUNITY

Section 1. The sum of \$1,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Port Development Revolving Loan Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants and loans associated with the Port Development Revolving Loan Program pursuant to 30 ILCS 750/9-11.

Section 1. The sum of \$10,569,017, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remain unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2018, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 102, Section 1 of Public Act 100-0021, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for grants to local governments for capital improvements to civic centers.

Section 5. The sum of \$500,000 or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business of June 30th 2018, from a reappropriation heretofore made for such purpose in Article 111, Section 25 of Public Act 100-0021, is reappropriated from the Build Illinois Bond Fund to the Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity for a grant to the Rockford District 205 for the project hereinafter enumerated: CICS ROCKFORD CHARTER PATRIOTS CENTER.

Section 10. - Section 30. The sum of \$100,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Wildlife and Fish Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for acquisition and development, including grants, for the implementation of the North American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically provides waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway.
- 21 Section 35. To the extent federal funds including 22 reimbursements are available for such purposes, the sum of

- Section 55. The sum of \$29,335,808, or so much thereof as
- 19 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Natural Areas
- 20 Acquisition Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the

The sum of \$2,500,000, or so much thereof as 7 may be necessary, made either independently or in cooperation 8 with the Federal Government or any agency thereof, any municipal corporation, or political subdivision of the State, 9 10 or with any public or private corporation, organization, or individual, is appropriated from the Land and Water Recreation 11 12 Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for refunds and for outdoor recreation programs. 13
- 14 Section 80. The sum of \$2,604,971, or so much thereof as 15 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Off-Highway Vehicle 16 Trails Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants 17 to units of local governments, not-for-profit organizations, 18 and other groups to operate, maintain and acquire land for off-19 highway vehicle trails and parks as provided for in the 20 Recreational Trails of Illinois Act, including administration, 21 enforcement, planning and implementation of this Act.
- Section 85. The sum of \$3,142,458, or so much thereof as

- 1 may be necessary is appropriated from the Partners for
- 2 Conservation Projects Fund to the Department of Natural
- 3 Resources for the acquisition, planning and development of land
- 4 and long-term easements, and cost-shared natural resource
- 5 management practices for ecosystem-based management of
- 6 Illinois' natural resources, including grants for such
- 7 purposes.
- 8 Section 90. The sum of \$442,403, or so much thereof as may
- 9 be necessary, is appropriated from the Snowmobile Trail
- 10 Establishment Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
- 11 the administration and payment of grants to nonprofit
- 12 snowmobile clubs and organizations for construction,
- 13 maintenance, and rehabilitation of snowmobile trails and for
- 14 the use of snowmobiles.
- 15 Section 95. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may
- 16 be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
- 17 Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
- 18 the payment of grants for the implementation of the North
- 19 American Waterfowl Management Plan within the Dominion of
- 20 Canada or the United States which specifically provides
- 21 waterfowl to the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the

- Section 100. The sum of \$250,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory

  Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for the payment of grants for the development of waterfowl propagation areas within the Dominion of Canada or the United States which specifically provide waterfowl for the Mississippi Flyway as provided in the "Wildlife Code", as amended.
- Section 105. The sum of \$4,136,010, or so much thereof as
  may be necessary, is appropriated from the State Migratory
  Waterfowl Stamp Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for
  the purpose of attracting waterfowl and improving public
  migratory waterfowl areas within the State.
- Section 110. The sum of \$13,324,058, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for grants to units of local government for the acquisition and development of bike paths.

- Section 125. The sum of \$62,200,673, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated from the Park and Conservation Fund to the Department of Natural Resources for construction and maintenance of State owned, leased, and managed sites.

The sum of \$400,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary and remains unexpended at the close of business on June 30, 2018, from a new appropriation heretofore made for such purpose from such fund to such agency in such amount above in Article 110, Section 1 of Public Act 100-0021, as amended, is reappropriated from the Capital Development Fund to the Department of Innovation and Technology for information
