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SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, All children in Illinois are entitled to the 3 facilities and resources needed for a high-quality education; 4 and

5 WHEREAS, The Illinois charter public school law does not 6 contain a provision for charter public school facilities 7 funding; and

8 WHEREAS, Charter public schools in this State have limited 9 access to capital funds for facilities from local or state 10 sources, making it difficult to secure adequate and affordable 11 facilities; and

12 WHEREAS, Charter public schools have confronted this 13 problem by either paying rent to operate in a district-run 14 facility or paying for independent facilities out of their 15 general operating funds; and

16 WHEREAS, This produces inequity between charter public 17 schools and district-run schools in terms of the proportion of 18 funds available for direct classroom instruction; and

WHEREAS, Eleven jurisdictions (Arizona, California,
 Colorado, Florida, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Mexico,

RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL

CONCURRING HEREIN, that the Task Force on Charter Public School
Facilities is created to examine charter public school

21 (18) one member appointed by the Governor, upon 22 recommendation of large, non-profit а community 23 development financial institution (CDFI) in Illinois that 24 provides or has provided specialized loans, real estate 25 development, and additional forms of financial assistance 26 to charter public schools in this State;

RESOLVED, That the members of the Task Force shall be 11 appointed within 30 days after the adoption of this resolution 12 13 and shall begin meeting no later than 30 days after the 14 appointments are finalized; in the event the appointments by 15 the Governor are not made within 30 days after the adoption of this resolution, the State Superintendent shall make such 16 appointments within 15 days of the appointment deadline; 17 18 members shall serve without compensation; and be it further

19 RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall issue a report making 20 recommendations on any changes to State laws with regard to 21 charter public school facilities access on or before January 1, 22 2019 and that the Task Force shall be dissolved upon issuance 23 of this report; and be it further -6- LRB100 21600 MST 38672 r
