1 SENATE RESOLUTION

2 WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened to 3 learn of the death of former U.N. Secretary General Kofi Annan, 4 who passed away on August 18, 2018; and

WHEREAS, Kofi Atta Annan was born in Ghana on April 8, 1938; he received a bachelor's degree in economics in 1961 from Macalester College in St. Paul, Minnesota and began working for the U.N. World Health Organization in Geneva; he received a master's degree in management from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1972; and

WHEREAS, At the start of the Persian Gulf War in 1990, Kofi Annan helped persuade the Iraqis to release 900 U.N. employees and dependents held as hostages; he also organized an airlift of hundreds of thousands of Asian workers back to their original homes; he became Deputy Chief of Peacekeeping for the U.N. in 1992, and Chief of Peacekeeping the following year; and

WHEREAS, Kofi Annan led the United Nations as Secretary General from 1997 to 2006; he was the seventh secretary general in the history of the U.N. and the first black African to hold the position; and

WHEREAS, Kofi Annan was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize in

- 1 2001, which he shared with the U.N.; and
- WHEREAS, After retiring from the U.N., Kofi Annan took on 2
- 3 the role of a wise and noble elder trying to mediate a host of
- 4 conflicts in Africa; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Kofi Annan was a guiding force for good; he
- 6 provided people everywhere with a space for dialogue, a place
- 7 for problem-solving, and a path to a better world; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Kofi Annan is survived by his wife,
- 9 Lagergren; two children; and a stepdaughter; therefore, be it
- 10 RESOLVED, BY THE SENATE OF THE ONE HUNDREDTH GENERAL
- 11 ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, that we mourn the passing of
- 12 former U.N. Secretary General Kofi Annan, and extend our
- 13 sincere condolences to his family, friends, and all who knew
