Amends the Peace Officer Fire Investigation Act. Makes a technical change in a Section concerning peace officer status.

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AN ACT concerning State government.

2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 3 represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Peace Officer Fire Investigation Act is 5 amended by changing Section 1 as follows:

6 (20 ILCS 2910/1) (from Ch. 127 1/2, par. 501)

7 Sec. 1. Peace officer status.

(a) Any person who is a sworn member of any organized and 8 9 and paid fire department of a political subdivision of this State and is authorized to investigate fires or explosions for 10 such political subdivision and to determine the cause, origin 11 and circumstances of fires or explosions that are suspected to 12 13 be arson or arson-related crimes, may be classified as a peace 14 officer by the political subdivision or agency employing such 15 person. A person so classified shall possess the same powers of 16 arrest, search and seizure and the securing and service of warrants as sheriffs of counties, and police officers within 17 the jurisdiction of their political subdivision. While in the 18 19 actual investigation and matters incident thereto, such person 20 may carry weapons as may be necessary, but only if that person 21 has satisfactorily completed (1) a training program offered or 22 approved by the Illinois Law Enforcement Training Standards Board which substantially conforms to standards promulgated 23

pursuant to the Illinois Police Training Act and the Peace 1 2 Officer and Probation Officer Firearm Training Act; and (2) a 3 course in fire and arson investigation approved by the Office of the State Fire Marshal pursuant to the Illinois Fire 4 5 Protection Training Act. Such training need not include exposure to vehicle and traffic law, traffic control and 6 7 accident investigation, or first aid, but shall include 8 training in the law relating to the rights of persons suspected 9 of involvement in criminal activities.

10 Any person granted the powers enumerated in this subsection 11 (a) may exercise such powers only during the actual 12 investigation of the cause, origin and circumstances of such 13 fires or explosions that are suspected to be arson or 14 arson-related crimes.

(b) Persons employed by the Office of the State Fire 15 16 Marshal to conduct arson investigations shall be designated 17 State Fire Marshal Arson Investigator Special Agents and shall be peace officers with all of the powers of peace officers in 18 cities and sheriffs in counties, except that they may exercise 19 20 those powers throughout the State. These Special Agents may 21 exercise these powers only when engaging in official duties 22 during the actual investigation of the cause, origin, and 23 circumstances of such fires or explosions that are suspected to be arson or arson-related crimes and may carry weapons at all 24 25 times, but only if they have satisfactorily completed (1) a 26 training course approved by the Illinois Law Enforcement

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Training Standards Board that substantially conforms to the 1 2 standards promulgated pursuant to the Peace Officer and Probation Officer Firearm Training Act and (2) a course in fire 3 and arson investigation approved by the Office of the State 4 5 Fire Marshal pursuant to the Illinois Fire Protection Training Act. Such training need not include exposure to vehicle and 6 7 traffic law, traffic control and accident investigation, or first aid, but shall include training in the law relating to 8 9 the rights of persons suspected of involvement in criminal 10 activities.

For purposes of this subsection (b), a "State Fire Marshal 11 12 Arson Investigator Special Agent" does not include any fire investigator, fireman, police officer, or other employee of the 13 14 federal government; any fire investigator, fireman, police 15 officer, or other employee of any unit of local government; or 16 any fire investigator, fireman, police officer, or other 17 employee of the State of Illinois other than an employee of the Office of the State Fire Marshal assigned to investigate arson. 18

The State Fire Marshal must authorize to each employee of 19 20 the Office of the State Fire Marshal who is exercising the powers of a peace officer a distinct badge that, on its face, 21 22 (i) clearly states that the badge is authorized by the Office 23 State Fire Marshal and (ii) contains of the а unique 24 identifying number. No other badge shall be authorized by the 25 Office of the State Fire Marshal, except that a badge, 26 different from the badge issued to peace officers, may be

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authorized by the Office of the State Fire Marshal for the use 1 2 of fire prevention inspectors employed by that Office. Nothing 3 in this subsection prohibits the State Fire Marshal from issuing shields or other distinctive identification to 4 5 employees not exercising the powers of a peace officer if the 6 State Fire Marshal determines that a shield or distinctive 7 identification is needed by the employee to carry out his or 8 her responsibilities.

9 (c) The Office of the State Fire Marshal shall establish a 10 policy to allow a State Fire Marshal Arson Investigator Special 11 Agent who is honorably retiring or separating in good standing 12 to purchase either one or both of the following: (i) any badge 13 previously issued to that State Fire Marshal Arson Investigator Special Agent; or (ii) if the State Fire Marshal Arson 14 15 Investigator Special Agent has a currently valid Firearm 16 Owner's Identification Card, the service firearm issued or 17 previously issued to the State Fire Marshal Arson Investigator Special Agent by the Office of the State Fire Marshal. The cost 18 of the firearm purchased shall be the replacement value of the 19 20 firearm and not the firearm's fair market value. All funds 21 received by the agency under this program shall be deposited 22 into the Fire Prevention Fund.
