- Section 5. The Child Protective Investigator and Child
 Welfare Specialist Certification Act of 1987 is amended by
 changing Section 5 as follows:
- 7 (225 ILCS 420/5) (from Ch. 111, par. 7655)
- Sec. 5. In addition to the requirements of Section 4, a person shall be qualified to be certified if he or she:
 - (a) has passed an examination approved by the Department to determine his fitness to perform the duties of or otherwise function as a child protective investigator or child welfare specialist;

- 15 (c) has completed the curriculum of study or training, 16 developed pursuant to Section 4, at the Department, college or 17 other institution that is approved to do business in this 18 State; and
 - (d) has a bachelor's degree in an area related to human services such as law enforcement, police science, criminology, social work, early childhood development or psychology, provided that this subsection (d) shall not apply to persons employed by the Department prior to the effective date of this

- Act. A bachelor's degree in criminal justice may also be used
- to satisfy the educational requirement under this subsection 2
- 3 (d) for any person who applies for certification as a child
- 4 protective investigator.
- 5 The Department may take into consideration any felony
- conviction of the applicant, but such conviction shall not 6
- operate automatically as a complete bar to certification. 7
