

## 101ST GENERAL ASSEMBLY State of Illinois 2019 and 2020 HB4342

## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

210 ILCS 45/2-218 new

Amends the Nursing Home Care Act. Allows long-term care facilities to provide an opioid treatment program if they receive written approval from the Department of Public Health. Provides requirements for such an opioid treatment program.

AN ACT concerning regulation. 1

## Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, 2 represented in the General Assembly: 3

- 4 Section 5. The Nursing Home Care Act is amended by adding 5 Section 2-218 as follows:
- 6 (210 ILCS 45/2-218 new)
- 7 Sec. 2-218. Opioid treatment program.
- (a) A long-term care facility that desires to provide an 8 9 opioid treatment program must first receive written approval from the Department. The approval shall be granted only if it 10 can be shown that the program will not interfere in any way 11
- 12 with the residents in the other parts of the facility.
- (b) The opioid treatment program must be in a completely 13 14 separate and distinct part of the long-term care facility and must include all beds in that separate and distinct part. It 15 must be completely separated from the rest of the facility and
- 16
- 17 have separate entrances.
- (c) Beds designated for opioid treatment shall not be used 18 for long-term care residents, nor shall beds designated for 19
- long-term care residents be used for residents undergoing 20
- 21 treatment for opioids.
- 22 The opioid treatment program staff shall not be
- utilized in performing services in the long-term care area of 2.3

- 1 the facility, nor shall long-term care program staff be 2 utilized to provide any services in the opioid treatment 3 designated area.
  - (e) There may be joint use of laundry, food service, housekeeping, and administrative services, provided written approval is obtained from the Department. The approval shall be granted only if it can be shown that the joint usage will not interfere in any way with the residents in other parts of the facility.
