#### CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT

# SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

Proposes to amend the Executive Article of the Illinois Constitution. Eliminates the Office of Lieutenant Governor, beginning with the term of office otherwise commencing in 2023, and modifies the order of succession to the Office of the Governor. Effective upon being declared adopted.

3 RESOLVED, BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE ONE 4 HUNDRED FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF ILLINOIS, THE 5 SENATE CONCURRING HEREIN, that there shall be submitted to the electors of the State for adoption or rejection at the general 6 election next occurring at least 6 months after the adoption of 7 8 this resolution a proposition to amend Article V of the 9 Illinois Constitution by changing Sections 1, 2, 3, 6, and 7 10 and by repealing Sections 4 and 14 as follows:

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THE EXECUTIVE

13 (ILCON Art. V, Sec. 1)

14 SECTION 1. OFFICERS

The Executive Branch shall include a Governor, <del>Lieutenant</del> <del>Covernor,</del> Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller and Treasurer elected by the electors of the State. They shall keep the public records and maintain a residence at the seat of government during their terms of office.

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1 SECTION 2. TERMS

These elected officers of the Executive Branch shall hold office for four years beginning on the second Monday of January after their election and, except in the case of the Lieutenant Governor, until their successors are qualified. They shall be elected at the general election in 1978 and every four years thereafter.

10 SECTION 3. ELIGIBILITY

11 To be eligible to hold the office of Governor, <del>Lieutenant</del> 12 <del>Covernor,</del> Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller or 13 Treasurer, a person must be a United States citizen, at least 14 25 years old, and a resident of this State for the three years 15 preceding his <u>or her</u> election.

18 SECTION 4. JOINT ELECTION (REPEALED)

19In the general election for Covernor and Lieutenant20Governor, one vote shall be cast jointly for the candidates21nominated by the same political party or petition. The General22Assembly may provide by law for the joint nomination of23candidates for Governor and Lieutenant Governor.

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SECTION 6. GUBERNATORIAL SUCCESSION

3 (a) In the event of a vacancy, the order of succession to 4 the office of Governor or to the position of Acting Governor 5 shall be <del>the Lieutenant Governor,</del> the elected Attorney General, 6 the elected Secretary of State, the elected Comptroller, the 7 elected Treasurer, the President of the Senate, the Speaker of 8 the House of Representatives, the Minority Leader of the 9 Senate, and the Minority Leader of the House of 10 Representatives. If an officer next in the line of succession 11 is of a different political party than the Governor he or she 12 is replacing, then that officer, and each officer thereafter, 13 shall be skipped in the line of succession until an officer of 14 the same political party may succeed the Governor. If there is no officer in the line of succession of the same political 15 16 party as the Governor to be replaced, then succession shall proceed according to the order of succession provided in this 17 18 subsection (a), regardless of the political party of the 19 succeeding officer and then as provided by law.

(b) If the Governor is unable to serve because of death, 20 21 conviction on impeachment, failure to qualify, resignation or 22 other disability, the office of Governor shall be filled by the officer next in line of succession for the remainder of the 23 24 term or until the disability is removed.

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(c) Whenever the Governor determines that he may be

seriously impeded in the exercise of his <u>or her</u> powers, he <u>or</u> <u>she</u> shall so notify the Secretary of State and the officer next in line of succession. The latter shall thereafter become Acting Governor with the duties and powers of Governor. When the Governor is prepared to resume office, he <u>or she</u> shall do so by notifying the Secretary of State and the Acting Governor.

7 (d) The General Assembly by law shall specify by whom and 8 by what procedures the ability of the Governor to serve or to 9 resume office may be questioned and determined. The Supreme 10 Court shall have original and exclusive jurisdiction to review 11 such a law and any such determination and, in the absence of 12 such a law, shall make the determination under such rules as it 13 may adopt.

16 SECTION 7. VACANCIES IN OTHER ELECTIVE OFFICES

If the Attorney General, Secretary of State, Comptroller or 17 18 Treasurer fails to qualify or if his or her office becomes 19 vacant, the Governor shall fill the office by appointment. The appointee shall hold office until the elected officer qualifies 20 21 or until a successor is elected and qualified as may be 22 provided by law and shall not be subject to removal by the 23 Governor. If the Lieutenant Governor fails to qualify or if his 24 office becomes vacant, it shall remain vacant until the end of 25 the term.

LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR - DUTIES (REPEALED) 3 4 The Lieutenant Governor shall perform the duties and 5 exercise the powers in the Executive Branch that may <del>-be</del> 6 delegated to him by the Governor and that may be prescribed by 7 <del>law.</del> (Source: Illinois Constitution.) 8 9 SCHEDULE 10 This Constitutional Amendment takes effect upon being declared adopted in accordance with Section 7 of the Illinois 11 Constitutional Amendment Act and applies beginning with the 12 term of office otherwise commencing in 2023. 13
