## SYNOPSIS AS INTRODUCED:

305 ILCS 5/1-7

from Ch. 23, par. 1-7

Amends the Illinois Public Aid Code. Provides that for purposes of determining eligibility and the amount of assistance under the Code, the Department of Human Services and local governmental units shall exclude from consideration, for a period of no more than 60 months, any financial assistance, including wages, cash transfers, or gifts, that is provided to a person who is enrolled in a program or research project that is not funded with general revenue funds and that is intended to investigate the impacts of policies or programs designed to reduce poverty, promote social mobility, or increase financial stability for Illinois residents if there is an explicit plan to collect data and evaluate the program or initiative that is developed prior to participants in the study being enrolled in the program and if a research team has been identified to oversee the evaluation. Requires the Department to seek all necessary federal approvals or waivers to implement the provisions of the amendatory Act. Effective immediately.

# Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Public Aid Code is amended by 5 changing Section 1-7 as follows:

6 (305 ILCS 5/1-7) (from Ch. 23, par. 1-7)

7 Sec. 1-7. (a) For purposes of determining eligibility for assistance under this Code, the Illinois Department, County 8 9 Departments, and local governmental units shall exclude from 10 consideration restitution payments, including all income and resources derived therefrom, made to persons of Japanese or 11 Aleutian ancestry pursuant to the federal Civil Liberties Act 12 of 1988 and the Aleutian and Pribilof Island Restitution Act, 13 14 P.L. 100-383.

(b) For purposes of any program or form of assistance where 15 a person's income or assets are considered in determining 16 17 eligibility or level of assistance, whether under this Code or another authority, neither the State of Illinois nor any entity 18 19 or person administering a program wholly or partially financed by the State of Illinois or any of its political subdivisions 20 21 shall include restitution payments, including all income and 22 resources derived therefrom, made pursuant to the federal Civil Liberties Act of 1988 and the Aleutian and Pribilof Island 23

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Restitution Act, P.L. 100-383, in the calculation of income or assets for determining eligibility or level of assistance.

(c) For purposes of determining eligibility for or the 3 assistance under this Code, except for 4 amount of the 5 determination of eligibility for payments or programs under the 6 TANF employment, education, and training programs and the Food 7 Employment and Training Program, the Stamp Illinois 8 Department, County Departments, and local governmental units 9 shall exclude from consideration any financial assistance 10 received under any student aid program administered by an 11 agency of this State or the federal government, by a person who 12 is enrolled as a full-time or part-time student of any public or private university, college, or community college in this 13 14 State.

(d) For purposes of determining eligibility for or the 15 16 amount of assistance under this Code, except for the 17 determination of eligibility for payments or programs under the TANF employment, education, and training programs and the SNAP 18 19 Employment and Training Program, the Illinois Department, 20 County Departments, and local governmental units shall exclude from consideration, for a period of 36 months, any financial 21 22 assistance, including wages, that is provided to a person who 23 is enrolled in a demonstration project that is not funded with general revenue funds and that is intended as a bridge to 24 self-sufficiency by offering (i) intensive workforce support 25 26 and training and (ii) support services for new and expectant

parents that are intended to foster multi-generational healthy families as described in Section 12-4.51.

3 (e) (1) Notwithstanding any other provision of this Code, and to the maximum extent permitted by federal law, for 4 5 purposes of determining eligibility and the amount of 6 assistance under this Code, the Illinois Department and local 7 governmental units shall exclude from consideration, for a period of no more than 60 months, any financial assistance, 8 9 including wages, cash transfers, or gifts, that is provided to 10 a person who is enrolled in a program or research project that 11 is not funded with general revenue funds and that is intended 12 to investigate the impacts of policies or programs designed to 13 reduce poverty, promote social mobility, or increase financial 14 stability for Illinois residents if there is an explicit plan 15 to collect data and evaluate the program or initiative that is 16 developed prior to participants in the study being enrolled in 17 the program and if a research team has been identified to oversee the evaluation. 18 (2) The Department shall choose State options and seek all 19

20 necessary federal approvals or waivers to implement this 21 <u>subsection.</u>
