Makes appropriations for the ordinary and contingent expenses of the Board of Higher Education and the Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2019, as follows:

A BILL FOR

1 AN ACT concerning appropriations.

2 **Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois, represented**
3 **in the General Assembly:**

4 ARTICLE 1

5 Section 5. The amount of \$2,424,100, or so much thereof
6 as may be necessary, are appropriated from the General Revenue
7 Fund to the Board of Higher Education to meet its operational
8 expenses for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2020.

9 Section 10. The sum of \$381,800, or so much thereof as may
10 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to
11 the Board of Higher Education for costs and expenses associated
12 with the administration and enforcement associated with the P-
13 20 Longitudinal Education Data System Act.

14 Section 15. The sum of \$183,300, or so much thereof as may
15 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to
16 the Board of Higher Education for costs associated with the My
17 Credits Transfer System.

18 Section 20. The following named amount, or so much thereof
19 as may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue

1 Fund to the Board of Higher Education for distribution as grants
2 authorized by the Higher Education Cooperation Act:

3 Quad-Cities Graduate Study Center73,800

4 Section 25. The following named sums, or so much thereof
5 as may be necessary, are appropriated from the General Revenue
6 Fund to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for Science,
7 Technology, Engineering and Math (S.T.E.M.) diversity
8 initiatives to enhance S.T.E.M. programs for students from
9 underrepresented groups:

10 Illinois Mathematics and Science

11 Academy Fusion Program95,900

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13 Section 30. The sum of \$1,433,600, or so much thereof as
14 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
15 to the Illinois Board of Higher Education for Science,
16 Technology, Engineering and Math (S.T.E.M.) diversity
17 initiatives to enhance S.T.E.M. programs for students from
18 underrepresented groups for the Creating Pathways and Access
19 For Student Success Foundation formerly Chicago Area Health and
20 Medical Careers Program (C.A.H.M.C.P.).

21 Section 35. The sum of \$1,466,300, or so much thereof as
22 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
23 to the Board of Higher Education for the Grow Your Own Teachers

1 Program.

2 Section 40. The sum of \$1,456,500, or so much thereof as
3 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
4 to the Board of Higher Education for the administration and
5 distribution of grants authorized by the Diversifying Higher
6 Education Faculty in Illinois Program.

7 Section 45. The sum of \$373,900, or so much thereof as may
8 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to
9 the Board of Higher Education for competitive grants for
10 nursing schools to increase the number of graduating nurses.

11 Section 50. The sum of \$197,400, or so much thereof as may
12 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to
13 the Board of Higher Education for nurse educator fellowships
14 to supplement nurse faculty salaries.

15 Section 55. The sum of \$980,500, or so much thereof as may
16 be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund to
17 the Board of Higher Education for distribution as grants for
18 Cooperative Work Study Programs to institutions of higher
19 education.

20 Section 60. The sum of \$1,055,700, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the General Revenue Fund
2 to the Board of Higher Education for a grant to the Board of
3 Trustees of the University Center of Lake County for the
4 ordinary and contingent expenses of the Center.

5 Section 65. The sum of \$100,000 or so much thereof as may
6 be necessary, is appropriated from the Distance Learning Fund
7 to the Board of Higher Education as supplemental support for
8 costs and expenses associated with the administration and
9 enforcement of 110 ILCS 145/40.

10 Section 70. The amount of \$600,000, or so much thereof as
11 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Academic Quality
12 Assurance Fund to the Board of Higher Education as supplemental
13 support for costs and expenses associated with the
14 administration and enforcement of 110 ILCS 1010.

15 Section 75. The amount of \$100,000, or so much thereof as
16 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Private College
17 Academic Quality Assurance Fund to the Board of Higher
18 Education as supplemental support for costs and expenses
19 associated with the administration and enforcement of 110 ILCS
20 1005.

21 Section 80. The amount of \$30,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is appropriated from the BHE Data and Research
 2 Cost Recovery Fund to the Board of Higher Education as
 3 supplemental support for costs and expenses associated with the
 4 administration and enforcement of 110 ILCS 205.

5 Section 85. The amount of \$650,000, or so much thereof as
 6 may be necessary, is appropriated from the Private Business and
 7 Vocational Schools Quality Assurance Fund to the Board of
 8 Higher Education as supplemental support for costs and expenses
 9 associated with the administration and enforcement of the
 10 Private Business and Vocational Schools Act of 2012.

11 Section 90. The sum of \$5,500,000, or so much thereof as
 12 may be necessary, is appropriated from the BHE Federal Grants
 13 Fund to the Board of Higher Education to be expended under the
 14 terms and conditions associated with the federal contracts and
 15 grants moneys received.

16 Section 95. The following named amounts, or so much thereof
 17 as may be necessary, respectively, for the objects and purposes
 18 hereinafter named, are appropriated from the Education
 19 Assistance Fund to the Illinois Mathematics and Science Academy
 20 to meet ordinary and contingent expenses for the fiscal year
 21 ending June 30, 2020:

 19 ending June 30, 2020:
