2 WHEREAS, The members of the Illinois Senate are saddened 3 to learn of the death of John M. Palmer Sr. of Springfield, who 4 passed away on April 17, 2023; and

5 WHEREAS, John Palmer was born to Melvin and Helen 6 (Blesser) Palmer in Springfield on June 5, 1939; he attended 7 Springfield High School and served in the U.S. Navy; he 8 married Jeanette Nevitt in Springfield on January 20, 1962, 9 and she preceded him in death on May 19, 2014; and

10 WHEREAS, John Palmer began his law enforcement career with the Sangamon County Sheriff's Office in 1964; after working 11 12 there for a few years, he joined the Springfield Police 13 Department (SPD), where he served for 28 years until his 14 retirement in 1993; he then worked for the Menard County Sheriff's Department for 18 years, retiring in 2013; during 15 16 his career, he served as a patrol officer, detective, 17 sergeant, and range master; and
