2 WHEREAS, Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS), known by 3 many as Lou Gehrig's disease, is a progressive fatal 4 neurodegenerative disease in which a person's brain loses connection with the muscles, slowly taking away their ability 5 to walk, talk, eat, and eventually breathe; and 6 7 WHEREAS, ALS has no cure, and every 90 minutes, someone is 8 diagnosed with ALS and someone passes away from ALS; on 9 average, patients diagnosed with ALS only survive two to five 10 years from the time of diagnosis; and WHEREAS, People who have served in the military are more 11 12 likely to develop ALS and die from the disease than those with 13 no history of military service; and 14 WHEREAS, Securing access to new therapies, durable medical 15 equipment, and communication technologies is of vital 16 importance to people living with ALS; and 17 WHEREAS, Clinical trials play a pivotal role in evaluating new treatments, enhancing quality of life, and fostering 18 assistive technologies for those living with ALS; and 19

WHEREAS, This year marks the 10th anniversary of the Ice

- WHEREAS, The ALS Association, as the largest philanthropic
