- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 5 changing Section 12-609 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/12-609) (from Ch. 95 1/2, par. 12-609)
- 7 Sec. 12-609. (a) No official or employee of the State,
- 8 er any political subdivision thereof, any county,
- 9 <u>municipality</u>, or local authority, and no owner or employee of
- 10 any new vehicle dealer, used vehicle dealer, or vehicle
- 11 <u>auctioneer</u> shall sell, trade or otherwise dispose of any
- 12 motor vehicle bearing equipment, markings, or other indicia
- of police authority unless, prior to delivery of the vehicle,
- 14 the equipment and markings have been sufficiently altered or
- obliterated to remove the appearance of such authority.
- 16 (b) A person may not operate on the highways of this
- 17 State a vehicle bearing the equipment, markings, or other
- 18 <u>indicia of police authority, unless the vehicle is an</u>
