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- 1 AN ACT concerning health.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 1. Short title. This Act may be cited as the
- 5 HIV/AIDS Prevention Program for Department of Corrections
- 6 Offenders, Significant Others, and Family Act.
- 7 Section 5. Definition. In this Act, "HIV/AIDS" means the
- 8 human immunodeficiency virus or any other identified
- 9 causative agent of acquired immunodeficiency syndrome.
- 10 Section 10. HIV/AIDS Prevention Program for Department of 11 Corrections Offenders, Significant Others, and Family. The Department of Corrections and the Department of Public Health 12 13 shall jointly develop and implement an HIV/AIDS prevention 14 education program targeted to offenders incarcerated in Department of Corrections facilities, significant others, and 15 16 family of adult and juvenile prison inmates. Through this program, the Illinois Department of Corrections shall: (1) 17 provide, in all public waiting rooms of detention facilities 18 and prisons, printed information on the transmission and 19 20 prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and other sexually transmitted diseases and 21 referral information community-based-providers of HIV/AIDS prevention, HIV/AIDS 22 treatment, and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing services 23 24 throughout Illinois; (2) display in all public waiting rooms 25 of detention facilities and prisons an HIV/AIDS informational video, produced by a national organization with expertise in 26 27 HIV/AIDS prevention; (3) provide written information on the transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS, hepatitis C, and 28

other sexually transmitted diseases to all inmates upon

- 1 entrance to a detention center or prison and offer voluntary
- 2 HIV/AIDS testing to all inmates; and (4) provide written
- 3 information on the transmission and prevention of HIV/AIDS,
- 4 hepatitis C, and other sexually transmitted diseases to all
- 5 inmates just prior to their release from custody and referral
- 6 to appropriate community based organizations that provide
- 7 HIV/AIDS services and HIV/AIDS counseling and testing.
- 8 Section 15. Report to the General Assembly. One year
- 9 after implementation of this Act, the Illinois Department of
- 10 Corrections shall report to the General Assembly on the
- 11 effectiveness of this program in increasing voluntary
- 12 HIV/AIDS testing.
- 13 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 14 becoming law.
