(k) A recipient of a scholarship awarded 3 by 4 Commission under this Section shall not be in violation of 5 the agreement entered into pursuant to subsection (i) if the 6 recipient (i) enrolls on a full-time basis as a graduate 7 student in a course of study related to the field of teaching at an institution of higher learning; (ii) is serving as a 8 9 member of the armed services of the United States; (iii) is temporarily totally disabled, as established by 10 sworn 11 affidavit of a qualified physician; or (iv) is seeking and unable to find full-time employment as a teacher at a school 12 that satisfies the criteria set forth in subsection (i) and 13 is able to provide evidence of that fact. Any such extension 14 of the period during which the teaching requirement must be 15 16 fulfilled shall be subject to limitations of duration as established by the Commission. 17
