- 1 AN ACT concerning environmental safety.
- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Environmental Protection Act is amended
- 5 by adding Section 22.49 as follows:
- 6 (415 ILCS 5/22.49 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 22.49. Computer Equipment Disposal and Recycling</u>
- 8 Commission.
- 9 <u>(a) The General Assembly finds that improper disposal of</u>
- 10 <u>computer equipment presents a serious environmental threat.</u>
- 11 Computer equipment contains quantities of lead, mercury,
- 12 other heavy metals, and plastics that, when improperly
- disposed of, can lead to environmental contamination.
- 14 (b) There is hereby created the Computer Equipment
- 15 <u>Disposal and Recycling Commission consisting of 7 members</u>
- 16 <u>appointed as follows: 2 members appointed by the Governor,</u>
- one of whom shall serve as Chairperson of the Commission; one
- 18 <u>member appointed by the Lieutenant Governor who shall serve</u>
- 19 <u>as vice-chairperson; one member appointed by the Speaker of</u>
- 21 Minority Leader of the House of Representatives; one member

- 2 <u>(2) To advise the General Assembly and State</u>
- 3 <u>agencies with respect to legislative, regulatory, or</u>
- 4 <u>other actions within the area of computer equipment</u>
- 5 <u>disposal</u>, and any related subject matter (i.e. fax
- 6 <u>machines, printers, etc.).</u>
- 7 (3) To make recommendations regarding the
- 8 <u>development and establishment of pilot programs and</u>
- 9 ongoing programs for the recycling and proper disposal of
- 10 <u>computer equipment.</u>
- 11 (d) The Commission shall issue a report of its findings
- 12 and recommendations in relation to the objectives listed in
- 13 <u>subsection</u> (c) of this Section to the Governor, the General
- 14 Assembly, and the Director of the Environmental Protection
- 15 Agency on or before May 31, 2004.
- (e) Beginning on May 31, 2005, the Commission shall
