- 4 Section 5. The Election Code is amended by changing
- 5 Sections 7-41, 17-29, and 19-2.2 as follows:

- 7 Sec. 7-41. (a) All officers upon whom is imposed by law
- 8 the duty of designating and providing polling places for
- 9 general elections, shall provide in each such polling place
- 10 so designated and provided, a sufficient number of booths for
- 11 such primary election, which booths shall be provided with
- 12 shelves, such supplies and pencils as will enable the voter
- 13 to prepare his ballot for voting and in which voters may
- 14 prepare their ballots screened from all observation as to the
- 15 manner in which they do so. Such booths shall be within plain
- 16 view of the election officers and both they and the ballot
- 17 boxes shall be within plain view of those within the
