- 13 <u>(1)</u> A person is qualified to receive a license as a
- 14 barber if that person has applied in writing on forms
- 15 prescribed by the Department, has paid the required fees,
- 16 and:
- 17 a. Is at least 16 years of age; and
- b. Has a certificate of graduation from a school
- 19 providing secondary education, or the recognized
- 20 equivalent of such a certificate, or persons who are
- beyond the age of compulsory school attendance; and

- Has graduated from a school of barbering approved by the Department, having completed a total of 1500 hours in the study of barbering extending over a period of not less than 9 months nor more than 3 years. A school of barbering may, at its discretion, consistent with the rules of the Department, accept up to 500 hours school training cosmetology at a recognized cosmetology school toward the 1500 hour requirement of barbering. Time spent in such study under the laws of another state or territory of the United States or of a foreign country or province shall be credited toward the period of study required by the provisions of this paragraph; and
 - d. Has passed an examination caused to be conducted by the Department or its designated testing service to determine fitness to receive a license as a barber; and
 - e. Has met all other requirements of this Act.
- (2) If the applicant applies for a license as a barber on September 2, 2003 or September 3, 2003, the Department may accept a verified 10 years of experience as a barber or barber's apprentice before July 1, 2003 in lieu of the requirements in items c and d of subsection (1) of this Section.

- 28 (1) A person is qualified to receive a license as a 29 cosmetologist who has filed an application on forms provided 30 by the Department, pays the required fees, and:
- a. Is at least 16 years of age; and
- b. Has graduated from an eighth grade elementaryschool, or its equivalent; and

- Has graduated from a school of cosmetology approved by the Department, having completed a total of 1500 hours in the study of cosmetology extending over a period of not less than 8 months nor more than 7 A school of cosmetology may, at its consecutive years. discretion, consistent with the rules of the Department, accept up to 500 hours of barber school training at recognized barber school toward the 1500 hour program requirement of cosmetology. Time spent in such study under the laws of another state or territory of the United States or of a foreign country or province shall be credited toward the period of study required by the provisions of this paragraph; and
- Has passed an examination authorized by Department to determine fitness to receive a license as a cosmetologist. The requirements for remedial training set forth in Section 3-6 of this Act may be waived in whole or in part by the Department upon proof to the Department that the applicant has demonstrated competence to again sit for the examination. The Department shall promulgate rules establishing the standards by which such determination shall be made; and
 - Has met any other requirements of this Act.
- the applicant applies for a license as (2) cosmetologist on September 1, 2000 or September 2, 2000, the Department may accept a verified 10 years of cosmetology experience, which may include esthetics or nail technology experience, before July 1, 2000 in lieu of the requirements in items c and d of subsection (1) of this Section.
- (3) If the applicant applies for a license as a cosmetologist on September 2, 2003 or September 3, 2003, the 31 32 Department may issue a license to the applicant if he or she has met all of the requirements of subsection (1) of this 33 Section except item d.
