- 2 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,
- 3 represented in the General Assembly:
- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Vehicle Code is amended by
- 5 adding Section 7-601.1 as follows:
- 6 (625 ILCS 5/7-601.1 new)
- 7 <u>Sec. 7-601.1. Records of all policies in effect.</u>
- 8 (a) By July 1, 2004, all licensed insurance companies in
- 9 this State shall provide to the Secretary a record of all
- 10 motor vehicle liability policies in effect on the date the
- 11 <u>information</u> is provided. Before the seventh working date of
- 12 <u>each calendar month, each insurer that issues a motor vehicle</u>
- 13 <u>liability policy shall provide to the Secretary a record of</u>
- 14 <u>each policy issued, canceled, terminated, suspended, or</u>
- 15 <u>revoked during the immediately preceding month.</u> This
- 16 <u>subsection (a) does not prohibit more frequent reporting.</u>
- 17 <u>(b) The record required under subsection (a) includes</u>
- 18 <u>the following:</u>
- 19 <u>(1) The name, date of birth, driver's license</u>
- 20 <u>number, and address of each insured owner and operator.</u>
- 21 (2) The make, year, and vehicle identification
- 22 <u>number of each insured motor vehicle.</u>
- 23 <u>(3) The policy number, effective date, and</u>
- 24 <u>expiration date of the policy.</u>
- 25 (c) The Secretary shall notify the Department of
- 26 <u>Insurance of any insurer who violates any provision of this</u>
- 27 <u>Section. The Department of Insurance may assess a fine of not</u>
- 28 more than \$1,000 per day of noncompliance against any insurer
- 29 who fails to comply with this Section. The Department of
- 30 <u>Insurance shall excuse the fine if an assessed insurer</u>
- 31 provides acceptable proof that the insurer's noncompliance

- 1 was inadvertent, accidental, or the result of excusable
- 2 <u>neglect.</u>
- 3 Section 99. Effective date. This Act takes effect upon
- 4 becoming law.
