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AN ACT relating to public utilities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

Section 5. The Public Utilities Act is amended by
changing Section 2-101 as follows:

б (220 ILCS 5/2-101) (from Ch. 111 2/3, par. 2-101) Sec. 2-101. Commerce Commission created. 7 There is 8 created an Illinois Commerce Commission consisting of 5 members not more than 3 of whom shall be members of the same 9 political party at the time of appointment. 10 The Governor shall appoint the members of the such Commission by and with 11 the advice and consent of the Senate. In case of a vacancy 12 13 in such office during the recess of the Senate the Governor shall make a temporary appointment until the next meeting of 14 15 the Senate, when he shall nominate some person to fill such 16 office; and any person so nominated who is confirmed by the Senate, shall hold his office during the remainder of the 17 term and until his successor shall be appointed 18 and qualified. Each member of the Commission shall hold office 19 20 for a term of 5 years from the third Monday in January of the year in which his predecessor's term expires. 21

22 Notwithstanding any provision of this Section to the contrary, the term of office of each member of the Commission 23 is terminated on the effective date of this amendatory Act of 24 1995, but the incumbent members shall continue to exercise 25 all of the powers and be subject to all of the duties of 26 27 members of the Commission until their respective successors are appointed and qualified. Of the members initially 28 29 appointed under the provisions of this amendatory Act of 1995, one member shall be appointed for a term of office 30 which shall expire on the third Monday of January, 1997; 31 2

1 members shall be appointed for terms of office which shall 2 expire on the third Monday of January, 1998; one member shall be appointed for a term of office which shall expire on the 3 4 third Monday of January, 1999; and one member shall be 5 appointed for a term of office which shall expire on the 6 third Monday of January, 2000. Each respective successor 7 shall be appointed for a term of 5 years from the third Monday of January of the year in which his predecessor's term 8 9 expires in accordance with the provisions of the first paragraph of this Section. 10

Each member shall serve until his successor is appointed 11 and qualified, except that if the Senate refuses to consent 12 to the appointment of any member, such office shall be deemed 13 vacant, and within 2 weeks of the date the Senate refuses to 14 consent to the reappointment of any member, such member shall 15 16 vacate such office. The Governor shall from time to time designate the member of the Commission who shall be 17 its 18 chairman. Consistent with the provisions of this Act, the 19 Chairman shall be the chief executive officer of the Commission for the purpose of ensuring that the Commission's 20 21 policies are properly executed.

22 If there is no vacancy on the Commission, 4 members of 23 the Commission shall constitute a quorum to transact business; otherwise, a majority of the Commission shall 24 25 constitute a quorum to transact business, and no vacancy shall impair the right of the remaining commissioners to 26 exercise all of the powers of the Commission. Every finding, 27 order, or decision approved by a majority of the members of 28 29 the Commission shall be deemed to be the finding, order, or 30 decision of the Commission.
