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AN ACT in relation to public employee benefits.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Illinois,represented in the General Assembly:

4 Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by 5 changing Sections 4-109.1, 4-109.2, and 4-114 as follows:

6 (40 ILCS 5/4-109.1) (from Ch. 108 1/2, par. 4-109.1)
7 Sec. 4-109.1. Increase in pension.

8 (a) Except as provided in subsection (e), the monthly pension of a firefighter who retires after July 1, 1971 and 9 prior to January 1, 1986, shall, upon either the first of the 10 following the first anniversary of the date of 11 month retirement if 60 years of age or over at retirement date, 12 13 upon the first day of the month following attainment of age 60 if it occurs after the first anniversary of retirement, be 14 15 increased by 2% of the originally granted monthly pension and 16 by an additional 2% in each January thereafter. Effective January 1976, the rate of the annual increase shall be 3% of 17 18 the originally granted monthly pension.

The monthly pension of a firefighter who retired 19 (b) 20 from service with 20 or more years of service, on or before July 1, 1971, shall be increased, in January of the year 21 22 following the year of attaining age 65 or in January 1972, if then over age 65, by 2% of the originally granted monthly 23 pension, for each year the firefighter received pension 24 In each January thereafter, he or she shall 25 payments. receive an additional increase of 2% of the original monthly 26 27 pension. Effective January 1976, the rate of the annual increase shall be 3%. 28

29 (c) The monthly pension of a firefighter who is 30 receiving a disability pension under this Article shall be 31 increased, in January of the year following the year the 1 firefighter attains age 60, or in January 1974, if then over 2 age 60, by 2% of the originally granted monthly pension for each year he or she received pension payments. In each 3 4 January thereafter, the firefighter shall receive an additional increase of 2% of the original monthly pension. 5 Effective January 1976, the rate of the annual increase shall 6 7 be 3%.

(c-1) On January 1, 1998, every child's disability 8 9 benefit payable on that date under Section 4-110 or 4-110.1 shall be increased by an amount equal to 1/12 of 3% of the 10 11 amount of the benefit, multiplied by the number of months for which the benefit has been payable. On each January 1 12 thereafter, every child's disability benefit payable under 13 Section 4-110 or 4-110.1 shall be increased by 3% of the 14 15 amount of the benefit then being paid, including any previous 16 increases received under this Article. These increases are not subject to any limitation on the maximum benefit amount 17 included in Section 4-110 or 4-110.1. 18

(c-2) On January 1, 2004, every pension payable to or on 19 20 behalf of a minor or disabled surviving child that is payable 21 on that date under Section 4-114 shall be increased by an 22 amount equal to 1/12 of 3% of the amount of the pension, 23 multiplied by the number of months for which the benefit has been payable. On each January 1 thereafter, every pension 24 25 payable to or on behalf of a minor or disabled surviving child that is payable under Section 4-114 shall be increased 26 27 by 3% of the amount of the pension then being paid, including any previous increases received under this Article. These 28 increases are not subject to any limitation on the maximum 29 benefit amount included in Section 4-114. 30

31 (d) The monthly pension of a firefighter who retires 32 after January 1, 1986, shall, upon either the first of the 33 month following the first anniversary of the date of 34 retirement if 55 years of age or over, or upon the first day 1 of the month following attainment of age 55 if it occurs 2 after the first anniversary of retirement, be increased by 3 1/12 of 3% of the originally granted monthly pension for each 4 full month that has elapsed since the pension began, and by 5 an additional 3% in each January thereafter.

The changes made to this subsection (d) by this 6 7 amendatory Act of the 91st General Assembly apply to all initial increases that become payable under this subsection 8 on or after January 1, 1999. All initial increases that 9 became payable under this subsection on or after January 1, 10 11 1999 and before the effective date of this amendatory Act shall be recalculated and the additional amount accruing for 12 13 that period, if any, shall be payable to the pensioner in a 14 lump sum.

(e) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), 15 16 upon the first day of the month following (1) the first anniversary of the date of retirement, or (2) the attainment 17 of age 55, or (3) July 1, 1987, whichever occurs latest, the 18 19 monthly pension of a firefighter who retired on or after January 1, 1977 and on or before January 1, 1986 and did not 20 21 receive an increase under subsection (a) before July 1, 1987, 22 shall be increased by 3% of the originally granted monthly 23 pension for each full year that has elapsed since the pension began, and by an additional 3% in each January thereafter. 24 25 The increases provided under this subsection are in lieu of the increases provided in subsection (a). 26

29 Sec. 4-109.2. Minimum pension.

30 (a) Beginning January 1, 1984, the minimum disability 31 pension granted under Section 4-110 or 4-111, the minimum 32 surviving spouse's pension, and the minimum retirement 33 pension granted to a firefighter with 20 or more years of creditable service, shall be \$300 per month, without regard
 to whether the death, disability or retirement of the
 firefighter occurred prior to that date.

Beginning July 1, 1987, the minimum retirement pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of creditable service, the minimum disability pension payable under Section 4-110 or 4-111, and the minimum surviving spouse's pension shall be \$400 per month, without regard to whether the death, retirement or disability of the firefighter occurred prior to that date.

Beginning July 1, 1993, the minimum retirement pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of creditable service and the minimum surviving spouse's pension shall be \$475 per month, without regard to whether the firefighter was in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 1993.

(b) Beginning January 1, 1999, the minimum retirement 17 pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of 18 19 creditable service, the minimum disability pension payable under Section 4-110, 4-110.1, or 4-111, and the minimum 20 surviving spouse's pension shall be \$600 per month, without 21 regard to whether the firefighter was in service on or after 22 23 the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 91st General 24 Assembly.

In the case of a pensioner whose pension began before the effective date of this amendatory Act and is subject to increase under this subsection (b), the pensioner shall be entitled to a lump sum payment of the amount of that increase accruing from January 1, 1999 (or the date the pension began, if later) to the effective date of this amendatory Act.

31 (c) Beginning January 1, 2000, the minimum retirement 32 pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of 33 creditable service, the minimum disability pension payable 34 under Section 4-110, 4-110.1, or 4-111, and the minimum surviving spouse's pension shall be \$800 per month, without regard to whether the firefighter was in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 91st General Assembly.

5 (d) Beginning January 1, 2001, the minimum retirement б pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of 7 creditable service, the minimum disability pension payable under Section 4-110, 4-110.1, or 4-111, and the minimum 8 9 surviving spouse's pension shall be \$1000 per month, without regard to whether the firefighter was in service on or after 10 11 the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 91st General 12 Assembly.

(e) Beginning January 1, 2004, the minimum retirement 13 pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of 14 creditable service, the minimum disability pension payable 15 under Section 4-110, 4-110.1, or 4-111, and the minimum 16 surviving spouse's pension shall be \$1030 per month, without 17 regard to whether the firefighter was in service on or after 18 19 the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General 20 Assembly.

(f) Beginning January 1, 2005, the minimum retirement 21 22 pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of creditable service, the minimum disability pension payable 23 under Section 4-110, 4-110.1, or 4-111, and the minimum 24 surviving spouse's pension shall be \$1060.90 per month, 25 26 without regard to whether the firefighter was in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 27 93rd General Assembly. 28

29 (g) Beginning January 1, 2006, the minimum retirement 30 pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of 31 creditable service, the minimum disability pension payable 32 under Section 4-110, 4-110.1, or 4-111, and the minimum 33 surviving spouse's pension shall be \$1092.73 per month, 34 without regard to whether the firefighter was in service on HB2216 Engrossed

1 or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 2 93rd General Assembly. (h) Beginning January 1, 2007, the minimum retirement 3 4 pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of creditable service, the minimum disability pension payable 5 under Section 4-110, 4-110.1, or 4-111, and the minimum б surviving spouse's pension shall be \$1125.51 per month, 7 8 without regard to whether the firefighter was in service on 9 or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly. 10

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11 (i) Beginning January 1, 2008, the minimum retirement 12 pension payable to a firefighter with 20 or more years of creditable service, the minimum disability pension payable 13 under Section 4-110, 4-110.1, or 4-111, and the minimum 14 surviving spouse's pension shall be \$1159.27 per month, 15 16 without regard to whether the firefighter was in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of the 17 93rd General Assembly. 18

21 Sec. 4-114. Pension to survivors. If a firefighter who is not receiving a disability pension under Section 4-110 or 22 4-110.1 dies (1) as a result of any illness or accident, or 23 24 (2) from any cause while in receipt of a disability pension under this Article, or (3) during retirement after 20 years 25 service, or (4) while vested for or in receipt of a pension 26 payable under subsection (b) of Section 4-109, or (5) while a 27 28 deferred pensioner, having made all required contributions, a pension shall be paid to his or her survivors, based on the 29 monthly salary attached to the firefighter's rank on the last 30 31 day of service in the fire department, as follows:

32 (a) To the surviving spouse, a monthly pension of 40% of33 the monthly salary, and to the guardian of any minor child or

1 children including a child which has been conceived but not 2 yet born, 12% of such monthly salary for each such child until attainment of age 18 or until the child's marriage, 3 4 whichever occurs first. Beginning July 1, 1993, the monthly pension to the surviving spouse shall be 54% of the monthly 5 salary for all persons receiving a surviving spouse pension 6 under this Article, regardless of whether the deceased 7 8 firefighter was in service on or after the effective date of 9 this amendatory Act of 1993.

Beginning January 1, 2004, the total monthly pension 10 11 payable under this paragraph (a) to the surviving spouse of a 12 firefighter who died while receiving a retirement pension, 13 including any amount payable on account of children, shall be no less than 100% of the monthly retirement pension that the 14 deceased firefighter was receiving at the time of death, 15 including any increases under Section 4-109.1. This minimum 16 17 applies to all such surviving spouses who are eligible to receive a surviving spouse pension, regardless of whether the 18 19 deceased firefighter was in service on or after the effective 20 date of this amendatory Act of the 93rd General Assembly, and notwithstanding any limitation on maximum pension under 21 22 paragraph (d) or any other provision of this Article.

The pension to the surviving spouse shall terminate in the event of the surviving spouse's remarriage prior to July 1, 1993; remarriage on or after that date does not affect the surviving spouse's pension, regardless of whether the deceased firefighter was in service on or after the effective date of this amendatory Act of 1993.

The surviving spouse's pension shall be subject to the minimum established in Section 4-109.2.

31 (b) Upon the death of the surviving spouse leaving one 32 or more minor children, to the duly appointed guardian of 33 each such child, for support and maintenance of each such 34 child until the child reaches age 18 or marries, whichever HB2216 Engrossed

1 occurs first, a monthly pension of 20% of the monthly salary.

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2 (c) If a deceased firefighter leaves no surviving spouse or unmarried minor children under age 18, but leaves a 3 4 dependent father or mother, to each dependent parent a 5 monthly pension of 18% of the monthly salary. To qualify for б the pension, a dependent parent must furnish satisfactory 7 proof that the deceased firefighter was at the time of his or her death the sole supporter of the parent or that the parent 8 9 was the deceased's dependent for federal income tax purposes.

The total pension provided under paragraphs (a), (b) 10 (d) 11 and (c) of this Section shall not exceed 75% of the monthly salary of the deceased firefighter (1) when paid to the 12 survivor of a firefighter who has attained 20 or more years 13 of service credit and who receives or is eligible to receive 14 a retirement pension under this Article, or (2) when paid 15 to 16 the survivor of a firefighter who dies as a result of illness accident, or (3) when paid to the survivor of а 17 or firefighter who dies from any cause while in receipt of а 18 19 disability pension under this Article, or (4) when paid to the survivor of a deferred pensioner. For all 20 other 21 survivors of deceased firefighters, the total pension 22 provided under paragraphs (a), (b) and (c) of this Section 23 shall not exceed 50% of the retirement annuity the firefighter would have received on the date of death. 24

The maximum pension limitations in this paragraph (d) do not control over any contrary provision of this Article explicitly establishing a minimum amount of pension or granting a one-time or annual increase in pension.

(e) If a firefighter leaves no eligible survivors under paragraphs (a), (b) and (c), the board shall refund to the firefighter's estate the amount of his or her accumulated contributions, less the amount of pension payments, if any, made to the firefighter while living.

34 (f) An adopted child is eligible for the pension

provided under paragraph (a) if the child was adopted before
 the firefighter attained age 50.

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(g) If a judgment of dissolution of marriage between a 3 4 firefighter and spouse is judicially set aside subsequent to the firefighter's death, the surviving spouse is eligible for 5 б the pension provided in paragraph (a) only if the judicial proceedings are filed within 2 years after the date of the 7 8 dissolution of marriage and within one year after the 9 firefighter's death and the board is made a party to the proceedings. In such case the pension shall be payable only 10 11 from the date of the court's order setting aside the judgment of dissolution of marriage. 12

(h) Benefits payable on account of a child under this 13 Section shall not be reduced or terminated by reason of the 14 child's attainment of age 18 if he or she is then dependent 15 16 by reason of a physical or mental disability but shall 17 continue to be paid as long as such dependency continues. Individuals over the age of 18 and adjudged as a disabled 18 person pursuant to Article XIa of the Probate Act of 1975, 19 except for persons receiving benefits under Article III of 20 21 the Illinois Public Aid Code, shall be eligible to receive benefits under this Act. 22

23 (i) Beginning January 1, 2000, the pension of the surviving spouse of a firefighter who dies on or after 24 25 January 1, 1994 as a result of sickness, accident, or injury incurred in or resulting from the performance of an act of 26 duty or from the cumulative effects of acts of duty shall not 27 be less than 100% of the salary attached to the rank held by 28 29 the deceased firefighter on the last day of service, 30 notwithstanding subsection (d) or any other provision of this Article. 31

32 (j) Each survivor's pension payable on January 1, 2004,
33 shall be increased on that date, and on each January 1
34 thereafter, by an amount equal to 3% of the pension otherwise

1 payable at the time of the increase, including any previous increases under this Article. This increase does not apply 2 3 to any survivor's pension that first becomes payable after <u>January 1, 2004.</u> 4 (Source: P.A. 91-466, eff. 8-6-99.) 5 Section 90.
