- 4 Section 5. The Illinois Pension Code is amended by
- 5 changing Section 3-120 as follows:
- 6 (40 ILCS 5/3-120) (from Ch. 108 1/2, par. 3-120)
- 7 Sec. 3-120. Marriage after retirement.
- 8 (a) If a police officer marries subsequent to retirement
- 9 on any pension under this Article other than a pension
- 10 established under Section 3-109.3, the surviving spouse and
- 11 the children of such surviving spouse shall receive no
- 12 pension on the death of the officer, except as provided in
- 13 subsection (b) or (c).
- 14 (b) Notwithstanding Section 1-103.1 of this Code, this
- 15 Section shall not be deemed to disqualify from receiving a
- 16 survivor's pension the surviving spouse and children of any
- 17 police officer who (i) retired from service in 1973, married
- 18 the surviving spouse during 1974, and died in 1988, or (ii)
- 19 retired on disability in October of 1982, married the
