In the designation of the name of candidate on a certificate of nomination or nomination papers 3 4 the candidate's given name or names, initial or initials, 5 nickname by which the candidate is commonly known, or a 6 combination thereof, may be used in addition to the 7 candidate's surname. No other designation such as a political 8 slogan, title, or degree, or nickname suggesting or implying 9 possession of a title, degree or professional status, similar information may be used in connection with the 10 11 candidate's surname, except that the title "Mrs." may be used in the case of a married woman. 12

14 (10 ILCS 5/16-3) (from Ch. 46, par. 16-3)

15 Sec. 16-3. The names of all candidates to be voted in each election district or precinct shall be printed on one 16 17 ballot, except as is provided in Sections 16-6.1 and 21-1.01 18 of this Act and except as otherwise provided in this Act with respect to the odd year regular elections and the emergency 19 2.0 referenda; all nominations of any political party being 21 placed under the party appellation or title of such party as 22 designated in the certificates of nomination or petitions. The names of all independent candidates shall be printed upon 23 24 the ballot in a column or columns under the heading 25 "independent" arranged under the names or titles of the respective offices for which such independent candidates 26 shall have been nominated and so far as practicable, the name 2.7 28 or names of any independent candidate or candidates for any 29 office shall be printed upon the ballot opposite the name or names of any candidate or candidates for the same office 30 31 contained in any party column or columns upon said ballot. 32 The ballot shall contain no other names, except that in cases of electors for President and Vice-President of the United 33

States, the names of the candidates for President 1 2 Vice-President may be added to the party designation and words calculated to aid the voter in his choice of candidates 3 may be added, such as "Vote for one," "Vote for three." When 4 5 an electronic voting system is used which utilizes a ballot 6 label booklet, the candidates and questions shall appear on 7 the pages of such booklet in the order provided by this Code; and, in any case where candidates for an office appear on 8 9 page which does not contain the name of any candidate for another office, and where less than 50% of the page is 10 11 utilized, the name of no candidate shall be printed on the 12 lowest 25% of such page. On the back or outside of the ballot, so as to appear when folded, shall be printed the 13 words "Official Ballot", followed by the designation of 14 polling place for which the ballot is prepared, the date of 15 16 the election and a facsimile of the signature of the election authority who has caused the ballots to be printed. 17 ballots shall be of plain white paper, through which the 18 printing or writing cannot be read. However, ballots for use 19 the nonpartisan and consolidated elections may be printed 20 2.1 on different color paper, except blue paper, whenever necessary or desirable to facilitate distinguishing between 22 23 ballots for different political subdivisions. In the case of for 24 nonpartisan elections officers of а political 25 subdivision, unless the statute or an ordinance adopted pursuant to Article VII of the Constitution providing the 26 form of government therefor requires otherwise, the column 27 listing such nonpartisan candidates shall be printed with no 28 29 appellation or circle at its head. The party appellation or 30 title, or the word "independent" at the head of any column provided for independent candidates, shall be printed in 31 32 letters not less than one-fourth of an inch in height and circle one-half inch in diameter shall be printed at the 33 34 beginning of the line in which such appellation or title is

1 printed, provided, however, that no such circle shall be 2 printed at the head of any column or columns provided for such independent candidates. The names of candidates shall be 3 4 printed in letters not less than one-eighth nor more than 5 one-fourth of an inch in height, and at the beginning of each line in which a name of a candidate is printed a square shall 6 7 be printed, the sides of which shall be not less than 8 one-fourth of an inch in length. However, the names of the 9 candidates for Governor and Lieutenant Governor on the ticket shall be printed within a bracket and a single square 10 11 shall be printed in front of the bracket. The list of candidates of the several parties and any such list of 12 independent candidates shall be placed in separate columns on 13 the ballot in such order as the election authorities charged 14 15 with the printing of the ballots shall decide; provided, that 16 the names of the candidates of the several political parties, certified by the State Board of Elections to the several 17 county clerks shall be printed by the county clerk of the 18 proper county on the official ballot in the order certified 19 by the State Board of Elections. Any county clerk refusing, 20 21 neglecting or failing to print on the official ballot the names of candidates of the several political parties 22 23 order certified by the State Board of Elections, and any county clerk who prints or causes to be printed upon 24 25 official ballot the name of a candidate, for an office to be filled by the Electors of the entire State, whose name has 26 not been duly certified to him upon a certificate signed by 27 the State Board of Elections shall be guilty of a Class C 28 29 misdemeanor.

When an electronic voting system is used which utilizes a ballot card, on the inside flap of each ballot card envelope there shall be printed a form for write-in voting which shall be substantially as follows:

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6 Name of Candidate

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When an electronic voting system is used which uses a ballot sheet, the instructions to voters on the ballot sheet shall refer the voter to the card of instructions for specific information on write-in voting. Below each office appearing on such ballot sheet there shall be a provision for the casting of a write-in vote.

When such electronic system is used, there shall be printed on the back of each ballot card, each ballot card envelope, and the first page of the ballot label when a ballot label is used, the words "Official Ballot," followed of the precinct or other precinct number identification, which may be stamped, in lieu thereof and, as applicable, the number and name of the township, ward or other election district for which the ballot card, ballot card envelope, and ballot label are prepared, the date of the election and a facsimile of the signature of the election authority who has caused the ballots to be printed. of the ballot card shall also include a method of identifying the ballot configuration such as a listing of the political subdivisions and districts for which votes may be cast on ballot, or a number code identifying the ballot configuration or color coded ballots, except that where there is only one ballot configuration in a precinct, the precinct identification, and any applicable ward identification, shall be sufficient. Ballot card envelopes used in punch card systems shall be of paper through which no writing or punches may be discerned and shall be of sufficient length to enclose all voting positions. However, the election authority may 1 provide ballot card envelopes on which no precinct number or

2 township, ward or other election district designation, or

3 election date are preprinted, if space and a preprinted form

4 are provided below the space provided for the names of

write-in candidates where such information may be entered by

the judges of election. Whenever an election authority

utilizes ballot card envelopes on which the election date and

precinct is not preprinted, a judge of election shall mark

such information for the particular precinct and election on

the envelope in ink before tallying and counting any write-in

vote written thereon. If some method of insuring ballot

secrecy other than an envelope is used, such information must

13 be provided on the ballot itself.

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In the designation of the name of a candidate on 14 t.he 15 ballot, the candidate's given name or names, initial or 16 initials, a nickname by which the candidate is commonly known, or a combination thereof, may be used in addition to 17 the candidate's surname. No other designation such as 18 19 political slogan, title, or degree or nickname suggesting or 20 implying possession of a title, degree or professional 21 status, or similar information may be used in connection with 22 the candidate's surname, except that the title "Mrs." may be 23 used in the case of a married woman. The election authority 24 charged with preparing the ballot shall not print any 25 designation such as a political slogan, title, degree, nickname suggesting or implying possession of a title, 26 degree, or professional status, or similar information in 27 connection with a candidate's surname. 28

Where voting machines or electronic voting systems are used, the provisions of this Section may be modified as required or authorized by Article 24 or Article 24A, whichever is applicable.

Nothing in this Section shall prohibit election authorities from using or reusing ballot card envelopes which
